

Breakdown of Budgeted Revenues by Source




Budgeted Expenditures – All Funds







IB Diplomas:

44% of students in the full IB Program received IB Diplomas our highest percentage yet

33 IB diplomas in first 5 years of program – More than any school in our area

67% of all IB exams resulted in passing scores

100% of students earned college credit in 2 or more courses, a first at Thornton

Other information

The classes of 2022 and 2023 are our largest IB cohorts yet with approximately 80 students currently enrolled in the Full IB Diploma, our previous high was 51.

IB graduates have now been accepted to: Northwestern, Harvard, Yale, Stanford, USC, UCLA, New York University, Princeton, Vanderbilt, Purdue, University of Illinois, Mizzou, Howard, North Carolina A&T and many more. Currently there are 3 students at Princeton and 2 at Stanford and they are thriving.

11 teachers completed virtual IB training this summer remotely. We now have 17 teachers fully trained and using IB strategies both in their IB courses and in their non-IB courses.

We now offer 13 different IB courses over 7 subject areas, creating flexibility and options for our students

2021 TW Exam and IB Facts

- 41% of the 2021 IB Cohort earned the Full Diploma
- 70% and higher pass rate for History, Spanish, and Math
- 14 teachers fully trained in their IB content area
- Currently offer 11 different IB courses
- Students who have graduated from the IB program been accepted to: Harvard, Northwestern, Howard, University of Illinois, Bradly, Jackson State, UIC, Spelman, Xavier University of Louisiana, and other prestigious universities. Many with full scholarships.
- Past IB students graduated from university early last year with more than one semester of college credit earned from IB coursework. One current graduate entered university as a sophomore.



Goals and Highlights

- We established partnership with sister school in Madrid, Spain for global mindfulness connections and experiences.
- We reached out and supported the community during Covid through CAS projects such as virtual tutoring, virtual workout session, community development with gardens, and cooking lessons.
- We aim to increase the number of male students who participate in the IB Program.
- We aim to increase our number of full diploma students.
