

- More than 70 students picked up their shirt on the initial day.






Purpose of Event



 - Remote Learning
 - Extracurricular Activities
 - Senior Activities
 - Returning to In-person Instruction

Student Surveys


In addition to the town hall, the SBOE also created student surveys for all three schools within the district for additional feedback from students.




How would you rate your experience of E-Learning so far?



How effective is the remote learning curriculum as it relates to your daily assignments, tests, and homework?




How well do you manage time during remote learning?




How helpful are your teachers while studying and completing work online?





Have you taken advantage of office hours after the school day ends?












Would you return to school if in-person instruction were offered to all students?

" Not now, because it'd be at the end of the school year. I think we should start off the new school year because everything and all guidelines would be new. We, as students, would probably just forget the new guidelines. (New year, new guidelines & rules, new ways of learning)" - Thornridge

Town Hall Feedback

Returning to In-person

During discussion:

- Students expressed their concerns; most of the feedback concluded that they do not feel safe returning to school.
- Many students fear their peers would not take Covid-19 safety regulations seriously.
- Hybrid learning was also a suggestion.

"To be honest, I like this schedule and timing perfectly fine! I have a job and other activities, other than school and homework, and I can manage them pretty well with school ending before 1pm. Personally, I would not want to go back to school in-person."

"This whole COVID-19 situation. It is hard having students keep their ID's on, so it's going to be even harder for them to keep a mask on. You never know who has it or if they are around people who have it. It's a risk I am not willing to take."

Remote Learning

During discussion:

- Most of the concerns made by students were about having too many assignments.
- Students are finding it hard to manage time between school work and outside life (family concerns, work, etc.)
- Students aren't able to complete assignments due to not understanding content.

"I have 7 classes, they all assign more than one assignment a day, and most of them are due at 11:59. I can't do and turn in all my assignments at one time, with my other circumstances that I have to deal with everyday."

"Computer issues, instructors saying they are not receiving assignments, can't get in contact with instructors verbally, students being marked as absent when they are in the class, it is just a huge mess!"

Extracurricular Activities

During discussion:

- Students felt that sports should be starting, especially those that are low-risk and require outdoor activity.
- Senior athletes want to see an award ceremony for those that played sports their whole high school career.
- Students understand the need for Covid-19 guidelines, but still want to see more athletics.

"As a senior, I have played sports all 4 years of highschool, I understand with Covid, we can not do anything, but it would be nice if we could still have some type of outside award ceremony for seniors in place of a senior night we traditionally have."

"Sports done outside can still happen if we wear masks and social distance."

Senior Activities

During discussion:

- Seniors requested to have a possible graduation ceremony in the football field or a drive-thru ceremony.
- Senior pictures for all three schools.
- Students expressed having problems with getting in contact with counselors concerning CCP points and not having enough 1 on 1 time with counselors for college concerns.

"Most of my friends and I feel as though we understand in having no prom, but it would be great if we can at least have some type of in-person graduation."

> "We should be able to have our graduation on the football fields, if that doesn't work can we do a drive thru graduation like Thornwood's Class of 2020."

Recommendations

- Graduation ceremonies could be held on the football field, or adapt into a drive-thru ceremony.
- Continue virtual learning or enter hybrid learning.
- Precautions should be made to allow athletics to start.
- More training to improve the efficacy of virtual learning.
