



- comparison to first semester of the 19/20 SY, students have increased In number of earned A's by 11%. Stated another way, students improved the upon the earned A count from the 1st semester in 19/20 (In-Person) of 2,796 to 4,041 for the 20-21(Remote) school year.
- This indicator will potentially increase the number of students who earn honor roll status, improve our grade level on track rates, and increase GPAs schoolwide.


