Your name will not be called if you do no sign in and list a topic or the topic is not on the current Board agenda or if public participation has begun.







Superintendent's Report

• Government Finance Officers Association Conference Update

MATH AND BUSINESS Division

- We have an articulation meeting scheduled for December 5th with our feeder schools to discuss common core standards, statewide testing, and to begin scheduling classroom visits to see what students are doing in math.
- We reached out to our middle schools and have made visits to discuss the PSAT 8/9 entrance exam with administrators and teachers. We shared copies of last year's exam, the standards included in the 4 Domains of SAT, and an overview of the test itself, with a focus on the gridded response.
- We are sending lead teachers to the Regional NCTM (National Council for Teachers of Mathematics) Conference in Chicago at the end of the month. They will be exposed to the current research and best practices in mathematics education. The Division Leaders will also attend an additional day with NCSM (National Council for Supervisors of Mathematics) addressing equity and social justice in mathematics education.

MATH AND BUSINESS Division


- All of our Junior courses are focusing on SAT Prep through Khan Academy. Teachers have received PD and support around setting up their account, creating courses, facilitating student accounts, and tracking student progress.
- We have started articulation discussions with South Suburban College. Education Career Technology classes will now receive dual credit and we are investigating the possibility of core math classes having dual credit such as calculus and pre-calculus.

English/ Reading/ Speech/ Library Division


- English and Reading courses at Thornton High School have begun implementing monthly common formative interim assessments aligned to the Illinois Learning Standards for Reading in order to measure student skill growth throughout the school year and make informed instructional decisions according to student needs in real time (not just pre/post).
- The monthly interim results are then being uploaded to Mastery Connect and analyzed as a way of calibrating teaching and learning. The data is then assessed by each core course team during their weekly meetings in order to pinpoint large trends in student skill gaps.
- Assessment results are then shared with students using question and item analysis reports produced by Mastery Connect. Student scores are tracked over time by students themselves as a way of practicing metacognition and selfreflection. When progress-monitoring over time, students are able to take ownership in their learning and begin to see individual growth toward their goals.

English/ Reading/ Speech/ Library Division


- Reading interim assessments are also now being given at three different reading levels starting freshman year in order to strategically scaffold and build the skills students will need to be successful on the SAT their junior year.
- Juniors at Thornton High School recently showed outstanding SAT skill growth between two interim assessments. The results were off the charts, nearly doubling the amount of junior students meeting and exceeding standards on a SAT Reading passage in one month (45% mastery in September to 83% mastery in October)! This was accomplished because our teachers noticed a trending student skill deficiency on standard RI.11.2 (main idea) across the junior class (nearly 400 students) on the first interim assessment and targeted that skill in their lessons throughout the month. As a result, the percentage of students in academic warning went from 18% to 3%!
- That is powerful teaching and learning that could not have accomplished without teachers and division leaders collaborating together in order to do what is best for students.

Science and CTE Division

Social Studies and Fine Arts Division

- A district team of Social Studies teachers have created a curriculum plan for the state-mandated Civics course. The team visited area schools already offering the course, reviewed numerous textbooks and wrote a textbook proposal, and wrote the curriculum for the course that is aligned to Illinois Social Studies Standards and Common Core Standards.
- Due to the mandate of the Civics course, many Social Studies classes will need curriculum adjustments. The Social Studies team has created a curriculum renewal calendar that gets all Social Studies courses on schedule for renewal based on priority.
- The CCTs are running in a positive direction by using data to drive instruction. Besides using item analysis from MasteryConnect, the CCTs are allowing teachers to collaborate on learner-centered activities the best help students overcome deficiencies in standards.
- On November 1st, the district hosted a Mock Congressional Hearing organized by Joe Janowiak (TT) in collaboration with *We the People*. Teams of students participate in a mock congressional hearing that is judged by professionals from the Chicagoland area. It is Civics in action, as students are required to perform research and develop communication skills with their presentations. The winning team from Thornton will be going to the Dirksen Federal Building to compete against Chicago area schools.

Social Studies and Fine Arts Division

- Thornwood has the first Social Studies dual-credit course. The Psychology course designed by Rachel Santos and is in the process of being approved by South Suburban. Students passing the course will receive college credit.
- Thornwood U.S. History students will have the opportunity to see the Broadway hit *Hamilton*. There are engaging lessons that lead up to the performance which include the opportunity to have direct questioning and discussion with the cast members. This is a great opportunity for over 200 students to take ownership of their learning.
- On Friday, November 2nd, Rho Kappa National History Honor Society inducted new members in a ceremony in front of an audience of family, staff, and community members.
- U.S. History classes in coordination with Rho Kappa will be viewing the film *Marshall* about the first African-American Supreme Court Justice Thurgood Marshall. The activity will include a panel discussion after viewing the film.

P.E. and FACS Division

- Planning for the updates to the weight and fitness rooms are nearing completion
- We had 12 cumulative instructor certifications for CPR/AED, ServSafe (Sanitation), and WSI (Water Safety Instructors) among our Division Faculty; we are looking into more instructor certifications for our teachers so they can certify our students
- Our students have gone on 3 field trips: visit with the Coast Guard, MSI live open heart surgery, and House of Hope Driver's Safety Expo
- Mock interviews will be held on the 14th with guest interviewers from: Junior Achievement, Governors State Univ, Aunt Martha's, and Community Volunteers. Advanced Culinary Arts will be catering a luncheon for our guest.
- Dual Credit is moving forward with Culinary Arts partnership with Joliet Junior College, we are meeting with South Suburban to partner in hopes of establishing a dual credit partnership in health, and we had our first meeting with South Suburban Child Development Advisory committee; all of this along with working on curriculum development for Driver's Education and PE.

Curriculum Audit Update

Curriculum Audit Update Relative to **Finding 2.1**: The scope of district written curriculum is inadequate to direct instruction; <u>and</u> **Finding 2.2**: The quality of curriculum documents is inadequate to support instruction and maximize student success on high stakes assessments. Use of curriculum documents to provide direction for classroom instruction is inconsistent district-wide.

Recommendation/Action Required: Design and implement a comprehensive curriculum management system that integrates development and use of the written, taught, and tested curriculum.

Action Steps Completed:

- Selection of Rubicon-Atlas as curriculum mapping software/technology firm
- Developed Curriculum Map template design, format. and content requirements to ensure consistency district-wide
- Conducted training on/roll-out of Rubicon-Atlas for Division Leaders and Teacher Department Leads and provided curriculum mapping plan for collaboration and feedback
- Identified courses and staff for input/mapping of courses into Rubicon-Atlas
- Established completion timeline for courses to be mapped and online: *mid-May, 2018*
