


FLOOR PLAN AND SITE PLAN

2 SITE PLAN NOT TO SCALE





FLOOR PLAN AND SITE PLAN



2013-2014 Leadership Academy

Teachers participated in the six sessions which are described below. This academy strongly demonstrates the Board's commitment to investing in building the capacity and skills of District 205's teachers.

Session I "Vision – "Finding the Leader Within"	Participants will explore the universal concept of leadership and complete an assessment to identify their personal strengths.	
Session 2 "Change Management"	The principal as the catalyst for change will be introduced along with exploring the stages of the change process.	
Session 3 "Supervising and Leading Instruction"	The role of the principal as the instructional leader will be examined using Charlotte Danielson's Framework for Teaching and Learning.	
Session 4 "Team Development"	Strategies for building and maintaining an effective team will be explored.	
Session 5 "The Four Frames: An Analysis Tool"	The leader's ability to problem solve more effectively using Bolman and Deal's four frames as an analysis tool will be addressed.	
Session 6 "The Case Study: District 205 Application"	Utilizing knowledge and processes learned during the Academy, participants will problem solve real issues facing the district.



ACT Science Reasoning

- The test presents several sets of scientific information, each followed by a number of multiple-choice test questions. The scientific information is presented in one of three different formats:
- data representation (graphs, tables, and other schematic forms)
- research summaries (descriptions of one or more related experiments)
- conflicting viewpoints (expressions of several related hypotheses or views that are inconsistent with one another)

The questions require you to:

- recognize and understand the basic features of, and concepts related to, the provided information
- examine critically the relationship between the information provided and the conclusions drawn or hypotheses developed
- generalize from given information and draw conclusions, gain new information, or make predictions

Preparation for ACT Science


- The test assumes that students are in the process of taking the core science course of study (three years or more) that will prepare them for college-level work.
- The Science Test is a 40-question, 35-minute test that measures the skills required in the natural sciences: interpretation, analysis, evaluation, reasoning, and problem solving.

ISBE Science Test-Day 2

- The test measures the Illinois Learning Standards for science contained in State Goals 11 through 13:
- scientific inquiry;
- the life sciences;
- physical sciences (physics and chemistry);
- Earth and space sciences;
- concepts that describe the interaction between science, technology, and society




