
<u>Social Studies is Important</u>


- It is *Essential* to Individuals and Society

- The study of Social Studies and History is not about memorizing facts and knowing every date on a timeline, it is about analyzing people and societies. Interpreting the decisions that were made so we can understand the big events of our time. Students commit to learning from the past to fulfill their responsibilities as global citizens today.





For Example:

Students in the social studies classes of Mr. Nicholas Tarala and Mr. Anthony Ethridge have been participating in an initiative known as Deliberating in a Democracy in the Americas spearheaded by the Constitutional Rights Foundation of Chicago.

Students were selected to participate in the International Deliberation Conference held at Willis Tower. Students participated in a bilingual \deliberation with students from Mexico City. It was a great experience for the students as they were able to share different viewpoints on controversial topics.

The process of communicating their opinion in a clear and respectful manner while respecting viewpoints different from their own is a skill necessary for future success in leadership roles. Students who participate in deliberations develop communications skills and learn how to find common ground.
