Key financial aid forms are now available to high school students and their families, and experts urge people to fill them out – even if they don't think they will qualify.


The 2021–22 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) application process opened 10/01/2020 – and the government encourages high school seniors to fill it out as soon as possible to obtain aid.

Each year the Department of Education awards about \$120 billion in grants, loans, and other funds to help millions of students afford education costs. It is the largest provider of student financial aid in the country.








From the Desk of Mrs. Goodman, English/Speech

- We use film and explore to teach historical events.

Currently, we are watching "Madea's Family Reunion" – the Importance of the family unit, along with issues such as Domestic violence and foster care.

I look forward as we delve into content specific art projects and challenge each student to express their creativity in their projects.





























From the Resource & Rewind Room/ Mr. Hill and Mrs. Kingdon


