From the Desk of: Mrs. Di'Giacomo, Business

The students just completed Accounting semester 2 and learned many aspects about accounting procedures. The students were able to determine if a business has net income or net loss for a fiscal period. Afterwards, they are able to prepare financial statements including income statements and balance sheets.

At the end of our semester, we learned how payroll works for businesses. Many students have worked or are currently working so this was relevant to their lives. They were able to read tax tables to determine federal taxes, calculate social security and Medicare. When they were finished with those calculations, they could prepare payroll checks with check stubs. Most students were unaware of what social security and Medicare was, so this was important for them to become aware of.

I hope your new year has had a great start.

Civics class is up and running. There are 3 requirements to graduate that accompany Civics. First you must pass the class. Second you must pass the constitution test. 
Teacher Messages

Math in the real world: Near the end of Term 2, our students built homemade clinometers with a protractor, straw, and string in order to find the height of objects too tall to measure with a measuring tape. The students were able to find the height of a flagpole knowing the distance they were from the flagpole and the angle of elevation measured with their homemade clinometer. They used the trigonometry to calculate the height of the flagpole.



Directions: Fill in the circles using the numbers 1 through 9 once each where the sum along each side and the one horizontal diagonal is 17.


Can you make sense of this problem and persevere in solving it? The students at Outlook can. One of their solutions will be revealed in the next newsletter. Have fun!


From the Desk of Mrs. Goodman, English/Speech
