The State of Illinois has added a new graduation requirement. All high school students must now take a stand alone Civics class, which includes a community service requirement to graduate. The Constitution Test will no longer be offered in US History Semester 1.

The new Civics class is now being offered at Outlook and I am currently the teacher of the class. Make sure with your counselor, that you are going to be enrolled in the class in order to graduate.

All students are now required to complete 5 hours of community service along with the Civics class to graduate. I will be arranging opportunities for you to complete your hours throughout the semester. The first opportunity that I am pleased to offer (with the assistance of the social worker Mr. Hill) will take place on Friday December 20th. We will be taking a group of students to pack food boxes at the Thornton Township Food Pantry. This opportunity will allow you to complete 2 hours of community service. December 20th is a non attendance day for the students. So there will be no conflict with the regular school day, please see me if you are interested. If you are interested in finding your own community service opportunities, please come and talk to me in room 3363.

Finally, the Constitution Test. The test will now be offered in Civics. Those students who have passed the Constitution Test according to your transcripts will not have to retake the test. As always if all you need is to take or retake the test, see me ASAP in room 3363.

From the Desk of Mrs. Garza, Math








From the Desk of Mrs. Goodman, English/Speech
