

## WELCOME BACK

Thornton Township School District 205 is committed to ensuring that our students receive an outstanding education no matter the circumstances. In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, we successfully adapted our educational programs to a remote learning format for the 2020-2021 school year. We are prepared and excited to safely return to in-person education for the term beginning in the fall of 2021; we believe that our students will benefit tremendously from being on campus.

## HEALTH AND SAFETY IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY

The health and safety of our students, staff, and community are our priority. We have taken all necessary steps to comply with or exceed the guidance and regulations provided by federal, state, and local health authorities. Based on the most current available information, we have developed guidelines that are designed to help minimize the risk of COVID-19 exposure and transmission. The District's full Health and Safety Plan and Guidance can be found on our website at district205.net. An overview of the guidelines is below. Everyone is asked to do their part to adhere to and comply with these procedures and all public health regulations.

#### INDIVIDUAL RESPONSIBILITIES

#### **MASKS**

- Bring a mask to school.
- Wear a mask that snugly covers your mouth and nose while on campus or while visiting District facilities.
  - Exceptions are made when you are dining or if you have a medical condition that prevents you from doing so.
- Comply with guidelines which prohibit wearing masks with designs that have language or images that may be considered offensive, provocative, disruptive, or could interfere with a positive educational environment.

#### **SOCIAL DISTANCING**

- Maintain 6 feet of distance between you and other people whenever possible.
- Follow signs regarding traffic flow in hallways and instructions regarding seating arrangements.

#### PERSONAL HYGIENE AND HEALTH PRACTICES

- Wash and sanitize your hands frequently.
- Monitor your health.
  - Be aware of COVID-19 symptoms.
  - Quarantine if exposed to COVID-19 or if you are exhibiting symptoms.
  - Avoid attending school and school-sponsored events and activities if symptomatic.
  - Report COVID-19 exposures, symptoms, and diagnoses when notifying the District of an absence.

#### **VACCINATED INDIVIDUALS**

 Adhere to established guidelines for mask wearing, social distancing, and personal hygiene and health practices.

#### **DISTRICT RESPONSIBILITIES**

#### **FACILITIES AND FACILITIES MAINTENANCE**

- Take appropriate and timely measures to maintain the health and safety of our students, staff, and community in accordance with federal, state, and local guidance and regulations.
- Prioritize cleaning and disinfecting surfaces where bacteria or viruses may be easily transmitted.
- Utilize enhanced ventilation systems to clean the air.
- Provide sanitizer stations at strategic and convenient locations on District campuses, in facilities, and in office areas.
- Provide Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) where appropriate and necessary.

#### **VISITORS**

- Limit the number of visitors to schools, programs, and activities in order to maintain social distancing of students and staff.
- Require visitors to complete a health screening immediately upon entering school buildings and program areas. As part of this screening visitors may have their temperatures taken and be asked to answer questions regarding their COVID-19 status and symptoms.

#### **TRANSPORTATION**

- Provide eligible students safe and timely transportation services that comply with public health guidelines.
- Meet the transportation needs of special education students.
- Provide training to school bus drivers on health, safety, and sanitation policies and procedures.

#### **FOOD AND NUTRITION SERVICES**

- Use a combination of in-school dining and a "grab & go" program for meal distribution.
- Provide a safe, socially distanced area for students and staff to dine.
- Require all food service and support employees to wear face masks and gloves whenever preparing and serving food and cleaning or sanitizing surfaces.

Retreat: District 205 leaders participated in an off-site retreat from June 28 to July 1, 2021, which provided an opportunity for training, information sharing, and strategic planning.
