

Computing Your Grade Point Average (GPA)

El Camino Real Charter High School (Total GPA)

Weighted GPA is used to establish class rank that is reported to private & some public out-of- state colleges.

Basics:	A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, Fail=0 A=5, B=4, C=3, D=0 Fail=0 (AP classes only)
What's Included:	All classes taken 9 th , 10 th , 11 th , & first half of 12 th grades.
Weighting:	Only AP classes; no honors courses
Method of Computing:	Compute the un-weighted GPA including all classes even those that have been repeated. For AP classes <u>only</u> , use A=5, B=4, C=3

UC and CSU GPA

This weighted GPA is used by UC and CSU to establish eligibility and admissions for UC and CSU schools

Basics:	A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, Fail=0 (regular classes) A=5, B=4, C=3, D=0, Fail=0 (UC approved Honors, AP, & college classes)
What's Included:	Only academic (A-G) classes taken <u>after</u> the 9 th grade-11 th grades.
Weighting:	UC approved Honors, AP, and college level classes in grades 10 & 11 receive an <u>extra point</u> per semester
Method of Computing:	If a class has been repeated after a mark of "D" or Fail", the second grade is used. Courses may be repeated only once. Students may earn up to <u>eight semesters</u> of honors/AP points. No more than four extra points (2 honors/AP classes) can be used in 10 th grade.
What approved honors courses get an extra point?	H US History, H American Lit/Cont Comp, H Math Analysis, Multivariable Calculus and Differential Equations, H Chemistry, H Physiology, H Physics, H Jazz Band, H Vocal Ensemble, Advanced Topics in Data Structures and Algorithms

Cal Grant (Financial Aid)

This *unweighted* GPA is used to determine eligibility for certain **Cal Grants**. These are rewards of money given to eligible California residents who continue their education in the State of California.

Basics:	A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, Fail=0
What's Included:	All classes taken after the 9 th grade <u>except PE/ROTC classes.</u>
Weighted:	None
Method of Computing:	Compute the un-weighted GPA in 10 th and 11 th grades. If a class has been repeated after a mark of "Fail", use only the higher grade in the computation if the class has been retaken in 10 th or 11 th grades.

Info on Repeating Classes

UC/CSU GPA: If the same identical course (level and title of the course) is repeated, the higher grade will be calculated in the GPA. If the course is repeated but different levels such as Honors/AP are retaken at a regular level, you must include both grades in your GPA.

ECR GPA: The repeated grade does not replace the lower grade. Every class you take is calculated into your GPA. Making up a "C" grade in a class will not be posted on the ECR transcript.

Info on College Classes: College classes can be added to your high school transcript but you will not get an extra point on the ECR GPA.
