



JBHS AT-A-GLANCE

- Total Enrollment: Approximately 2,320 students
- Grades served: 9-12
- Semester system (Fall, Spring, & Summer)
- Each course receives 5 credits per semester.
- A grade of "D" or higher receives credit.
- 230 credits required to graduate
- All students are required to participate in 75 minutes of academic intervention per week
- All students have access to mental health support via the Care Center, an on campus center run by Burbank Family Service Agency



- 31% of students are socioeconomically disadvantaged.
- 41% of our students will be first-generation college students.
- 55% of our students complete minimum college admissions requirements for CA state colleges (A-G requirements).

JBHS offers an Engineering and a Medical Academy through the National Academy Foundation (NAF). NAF educational design is made up of four elements of practice: academy development & structure, curriculum & instruction, advisory board, and work-based learning. The Academies' first cohorts graduated in 2019. NAF course titles on JBHS transcripts indicate cohorts of NAF academy students; the course curriculum is aligned with non-NAF course titles.

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The JBHS Medical Academy is a four-year program designed for students to get a taste of what's going on in the medical field and how they can be a part of helping heal people. Students learn about medical issues that impact the world. Students also get handson experience with understanding the human body, what causes harm and how to treat and heal.

The JBHS Engineering Academy is a four-year program designed for students to gain an understanding of how things work, how to solve complex problems, and how to design and make new things. Students get hands-on experience with modeling and building, robotics, zSpace computers, 3D printers, and much more.
