Students must also be citizens of the U.S. or its territories or possessions, or be lawfully admitted to the U.S. for permanent residence. 3.The GRO Undergraduate Fellowship is intended for students entering their last two years of study before obtaining their first bachelor's degree. 4.Students must have at least a "B" average overall at the time of application and during the tenure of the fellowship. These schools must be listed as not highly funded for research and development capacity. For the purposes of this solicitation, EPA considers ineligible those institutions identified as receiving more than \$35 million in annual federal research and development funding in the National Science Foundation's publication. 6.Students attending two-year institutions or community colleges are eligible to apply.
