- Encompasses 234 square miles
- Fastest-growing district in the region, a top 10 fastest-growing district in Texas
- **35 campuses** (23 elementary schools, 7 middle schools, 3 comprehensive high schools, 1 early college high school, and special programs center)

- About 33% built out, with growth expected to last for decades







- 43,355 Projected Enrollment 2032/33






