### **Principal's Message**

At Terra Nova, we stress the importance of students arriving at school and class on time every day, every period.

There is no denying that absences add up. Studies show that school attendance and tardiness is a major factor when it comes to school success and student behavior. Missing just two days a month can mean a student will miss around 10%, if not more, of the school year. Arriving to class late means missed instruction, valuable class time and is distracting to other students.

Our first class of the day starts at 8:30. Students should be at school with enough time to travel to their classroom without being late. Students have a six minute passing period between classes and after brunch/lunch. This is plenty of time for students to visit their locker, the restroom and travel across campus. Our bells ring throughout the passing period to signal to students when/where they should be en route to their next class. In addition, staff members are stationed around campus to monitor traffic and keep the flow moving.

In the event that a student is late to class, they will receive a late slip. These late slips will add up and result in a student conference with Vice Principal Hensley. Chronic and egregious tardiness will likely include more substantive actions. We will begin monitoring and enforcing tardies in the days ahead and will review these same practices with students in our upcoming class presentations.

We also recognize that some absences are unavoidable. When your student is staying home for the day, please notify our Attendance Office either by phone or email. Chronic absences and truancy will be monitored and families will be notified by school if needed. Please know that while a student may be "excused" from attending school, these are not always considered excused absences per the California Ed. Code. If these sort of absences become excessive, there will likely be some sort of outreach from us to discuss the situation in more detail.

The important thing is for students to attend school every day and for us to work together to eliminate barriers if attendance becomes an issue. We are here to help so that your student can be successful and have as many opportunities as possible in their future.

As I'm inclined to tell the students this year, when you are kind and work hard at Terra Nova, amazing things will happen.

### Food Services: All students eat for free this year!

The California Universal Meals Program has been established for this school year. Through this program, the state is reimbursing the school district for meals. All students may get one free breakfast and one free lunch each day by providing their student ID number at the register in the cafeteria. Additional meals are available for purchase at full price.

Our snack bar will be up and running later this month where additional snack items will be available for purchase.

Cash is also accepted at all cafeteria serving lines. Any student balance left from last year on myschoolbucks has been transferred to your student's new account on our Titan system.








a total of \$25,000 to \$35,000 dependent upon coach grant requests submitted near the end of each school year.
