Dear families,

I am happy to share that our first flex day was a success. Students knew where to go. Teachers shared that the time was valuable and it will become even more beneficial with time.

A key detail with our flex program is for students to make an appointment with one of their 6 teachers or a designated learning spot such as the library, college/career center or a counseling session. These appointments need to be made by lunchtime the day before flex. Students who do not make an appointment will be assigned to a location. Please help reiterate this with your student - they should be working to access the support they need whether that be a quiet place to study, help on Math or a rough draft on an essay.

Additional resources we have on campus to help students make the most of flex are planners and the return of PAPER, the online tutoring program.

Every 9th grader received a complementary planner as a supplement to their Freshmen Seminar course. Other students can purchase a planner for \$5 from Ms. Jenkins in Room 329 - all profits benefit our Journalism program.

Courtesy of the district, students will continue to have access to PAPER, a 24-7 online tutoring program. Students are able to login to PAPER using their school username/password and receive ondemand live chat assistance with expert tutors in multiple subjects, including writing support.

Students can access PAPER during flex regardless of their location. For example, they can use PAPER for math while in their art classroom. More information on the program can be found in the newsletter.

1st Grading Period Progress Report

Our first grading period is coming to an end this Friday, September 18th. Progress report grades will be accessible via ParentVue after school on Wednesday September 22nd.

In high school, each semester is divided into 3 grading periods of 6 weeks. The cumulative grade for each 6 week period is considered a student's progress report grade. The progress report grades are used to determine a student's athletic eligibility.

Grades are cumulative which means that the grades continue to get added as the semester progresses. The 2nd progress report will include grades from this grading period. The third grading period results in the final grade. The final grade is included on a student's transcript and are used to determine graduation status, college eligibility.

Please note that teachers will be following the traditional grading scale of A-B-C-D-F.

PAPER is a 24-7, online tutoring program where students can get ondemand live chat assistance with expert tutors in multiple subjects including writing support.

They will receive help within seconds in multiple subjects. Students can also submit any written work, including essays, lab reports.


