Principal's Message

MASKS

TN is strictly adhering to the mask mandate which requires that masks be worn in all indoor settings such as the classroom, hallways, offices, and restrooms. Individuals without a mask will be provided one. We strongly encourage students to continue wearing a mask even when outdoors.

To be effective, masks should completely cover the nose and mouth, fit snugly against the sides of the face & not have any gaps and have a nose wire to prevent air leakage. Please take some time to review this short video on how to properly fit your face mask.

SICK STUDENTS

The single most important step each of us can take is to stay home when feeling ill. We ask that students return after being ill - 24 hours has passed after the onset of symptoms and only if symptoms have improved without the assistance of medication. Following this timeframe is crucial because what we may dismiss as unrelated to COVID could be an early indicator of a positive diagnosis.

SICK with POSSIBLE COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

Staff members and students with symptoms of COVID-19 infection are advised not to return to campus until they have met CDPH criteria to return to school for those with symptoms:

- At least 24 hours have passed since resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications; and
- · Other symptoms have improved; and

• They have a negative test for COVID-19, OR a healthcare provider has provided documentation that the symptoms are typical of their underlying chronic condition OR a healthcare provider has confirmed an alternative named diagnosis.

EXPOSURE TO COVID-19

When there is a report of a close contact of a positive case within our school, we will follow the response outlined by the county and notify affected students and staff. A different response may be required depending on such factors as the exposure setting, vaccination status and involvement in extracurricular activities. District staff, including our district nurse will be consulted as every case is unique.

Please take a moment to review the steps to take when experiencing a positive COVID exposure (listed below). Your strict adherence to these measures will help keep our community safe and healthy.

ON-CAMPUS TESTING

Terra Nova will be offering on-campus COVID tests to students and staff in the upcoming weeks. More information on how to take advantage of this program will be sent to families once it is available.

Myself, Mr. Pofahl, Ms. Seibel and Ms. Hensley will be visiting classrooms in the upcoming weeks. We look forward to having the opportunity to meet your student and talk about our school community.

As we begin to travel through this year together, I will ask each of them to do their best, be their best and give their best.



Traffic Flow on/around Campus

To help ensure the safety of our students, please read through the traffic flow and other procedures below.

Traffic Flow:

Traffic flows through the Terra Nova campus as follows:

- All cars will ENTER through the southern driveway (near the baseball field)
- All cars will EXIT through the northern driveway (nearest the staff parking lot)



- · Right hand turn lane onto Terra Nova Blvd
- · Left hand turn lane onto Terra Nova Blvd

Cars exiting the stadium parking lot must exit through the northern driveway.

Student Drop-Off Locations:

Students should be dropped off in front of the flag pole. Do not drop students off using the stadium or staff parking lots. Doing so risks causing more congestion.

As you navigate the traffic, please be sure to watch for students and pedestrians and follow all traffic laws. Cars making illegal turns, driving at unsafe speeds and passing vehicles unsafely can be hazardous.


