

Explanation of Transcript

School Calendar: The PRHS school year consists of four quarters, each nine weeks in duration. Classes meet for either 18 weeks (1 semester) or 36 weeks (2 semesters), 5 days a week, 42 minutes per day.

Course Placement: Placement in each subject is guided by student achievement and teacher recommendation.

Grade Point Average: Student grade point averages are calculated by assigning a weight to each numerical grade on all courses carrying credit. An additional 0.5 is assigned for Honors courses and an additional 1.0 is assigned for Advanced Placement and CHS courses. To calculate GPA, the sum of the weights of each grade is divided by number of credits attempted.

Grading Scale: A = 90-100%, B = 80-89%, C = 70-79%, D = 60-69%, F = <60%, Passing Grade = D.
