Seesaw, Text Messages and Email

Our classroom teachers use Seesaw, and we use it schoolwide too in order to provide you with information we receive from our transportation provider First Student, school closures or delays due to weather, as well as reminders for families of upcoming events.

If you have not set-up your student's or your family account, please contact your student's teacher for assistance.

If you have not received any of our school emails or messages from our school district, please verify your phone number and email address with our office. This is also a great time to update your student's emergency contacts list, who we can call if your student becomes ill or you have authorized to pick up your student from school either during the day or after school. Parking Lot Safety

Just a few reminders about what parents can do to help keep our parking lot safe:

- · Use one of the following drop off and pick up locations:
 - o K/1 students in the front of the school
 - o 2/3 students in front of the library
 - o 4/5 students in front of the community center
- **Drop off and pick-up all your students in the location of the youngest student in your household.
 - · Pause long enough to drop students off along the curb and move on.
 - Do not double park...this causes traffic jams and requires students to walk through cars to get to the curb.
 - · If you park, please walk your students to the sidewalk or meet them at the sidewalk and walk back to your car.
 - · Drive slowly through the parking lot.





Go Home Plans

Please notify your student's teacher and the office in advance about any changes in your student's drop off or pick up routine prior to 1:30 p.m. when daily notes are delivered to classrooms Monday – Thursday or 12:30 p.m. on Fridays. If you have a weekly plan or long term plan, please let us know so we can document this. The end of the day can get very hectic with last minute changes. Sending a note with your child to school is very helpful if their go hame plan will be different than usual that day. The earlier we know, the better we

can get kids where they need to be!

Cell Phones



Students may bring cellphones to school for safety reasons. However, cell phones must remain off, in a student's backpack or book bag and used only for emergencies with teacher permission. Misuse of cell phones will result in the cell phone being placed in the office for a parent / guardian to pick-up.

What is Billie Spirit?

Billie Spirit is our Positive Behavior Intervention Support System, PBIS, which is a systematic approach to building the capacity of schools to educate all students. It is based on the idea that when students are taught clearly defined behavioral expectations and provided with positive corrective responses to behavior, 85% or more of students will meet those expectations. Those needing additional assistance are provided with more support.



We have four school wide expectations of students: **Kind, Respectful, Responsible, and Safe.** Each area of the school, playground, classroom, and other areas of the campus have specific behavior expectations for our students based on these principles. These expectations are taught at the beginning of every school year, and are reinforced throughout the year, with booster lessons after every major break.

Students have an opportunity daily to earn Billie Bucks for demonstrating Billie Spirit by being Kind, Responsible, Respectful and Safe. Students can buy special privileges with their Billie Bucks. Classroom teachers also hold special drawings and have classroom specific privileges students can purchase too.

ATTENDANCE Matters


Did You Know?

- · Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- · Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks.
- · Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Good attendance will help children do well in their future!
