Teachers of the Year 2024 **RECOMMENDATION**: It was recommended that the Board recognize Northrop High School interior design teacher Karyn Brumbaugh and Franke Park Elementary School teacher Ricky Weber as the District's 2024 Teacher of the Year winners.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** In the spring of 2024, FWCS received submissions from principals for the Teacher of the Year honor. Committees were established to focus on either elementary or secondary nominees with each committee selecting finalists to interview. After the interviews, each committee chose their respective Teacher of the Year.

The 2024 FWCS Elementary Teacher of the Year is Ricky Weber, a fourth grade teacher at Franke Park Elementary School.

The 2024 FWCS Secondary Teacher of the Year is Karyn Brumbaugh, interior design teacher at the Northrop High School.

As our district winners, FWCS was invited to nominate these two for the 2025 Indiana Teacher of the Year. We were delighted to learn that Karyn Brumbaugh's application advanced to the selection committee as a Top 25 finalist.

Mr. Weber and Ms. Brumbaugh, were honored as being part of the District. They came forward to be congratulated.

FWCS will use grant funds to purchase DIBELS K-2 and the College Board PSAT 8/9 for ninth graders and any professional support needed. Dr. Jean Hitchcock, Coordinator of Assessment, was available to answer questions.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** The project consists of architectural, mechanical, plumbing and electrical renovations to Miami Middle School. The contract procurement method for this project is the Construction Manager as Constructor (CMc) for publicly funded projects as allowable per I.C. 5-32. This amendment establishes the final overall guaranteed maximum price for the project.

The existing building automation systems (controls) are proprietary and Automated Logic is the single source vendor for this work. These contracts will be funded from the 2020 School Building Basic Renewal/Restoration and Safety Project bond. Project specifications require the work to be completed by July 24, 2026. Josh Summers, Coordinator of Capital Projects, was available to answer questions.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** The 2024 Capital Projects Plan consists of all capital projects that cost \$10,000 or more. New projects over \$10,000, determined after the CPP was approved, are required to

follow advertisement and approval requirements of an amended CPP. However, IC 20-40-18-6 allows the Board to determine that an emergency exists and therefore, amends the current CPP without the usual amendment procedures. The 2024 Operations Fund budget includes an appropriation for emergency capital projects.

Pete Smith, Manager of Maintenance and Operations, was available to answer questions.

A motion was made by Anne Duff, seconded by Noah Smith, that the recommendation concerning the Emergency Projects 2024 be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the General Obligation Bonds, Series 2024B for District-Wide Equipment and Facility Improvement Project:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It was recommended that the Board conduct a public hearing regarding the matter of appropriating the proceeds of the General Obligation Bonds, Series 2024B and investment earnings thereon. Subsequent to the public hearing, it is recommended that the Board adopt resolutions to authorize the issuance of bonds and to approve the appropriation of the proceeds and the earnings thereon.

RELATED INFORMATION: On June 10, 2024, and again on June 24, 2024, the Board held a 1028/Preliminary Determination Public Hearing on the project, and subsequent to the June 24, 2024 Public Hearing, the Board adopted the 1028/Preliminary Determination Resolution making a preliminary determination that that there exists a need for the 2024-2025 District-Wide Equipment and Facility Improvement Project as defined and described in detail in the 1028/Preliminary Determination Resolution and to finance this project with the issuance by the School Corporation of general obligation bonds in one or more series in an original aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$55,650,000. No petition requesting for the application of the referendum process was filed with the Allen County Voter Registration Office by any members of the community subsequent to the adoption of the 1028/Preliminary Determination Resolution.

We are now ready for the next step in the approval process, which is this public hearing on the appropriation of the proceeds of the General Obligation Bonds, Series 2024B and investment earnings thereon.

A Hearing was held, no one spoke.

A motion was made by Noah Smith, seconded by Jennifer Matthias, that the recommendation concerning the Resolution authorizing the issuance of the General Obligation Bonds, Series 2024B; be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

A motion was made by Julie Hollingsworth, seconded by Noah Smith, that the recommendation concerning the Resolution approving the appropriation of the proceeds of the General Obligation Bonds, Series 2024B and investment earnings thereon be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Budget Report 2025 Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Budget Report 2025:

Chief Financial Officer Rosemary Shipman presented a report that describes the year 2025 budgets for the Education Fund, Operations Fund, Debt Service Funds and Safety Referendum Fund.

The public budget hearing will be held on October 14, 2024. Board action is scheduled for these budgets on October 28, 2024.

Comments

Board Member Steve Corona commented that the loss to Notre Dame this past weekend was due to Fort Wayne ties, including a current staff member's son who is a coach for Northern Illinois.

Board Member Julie Hollingsworth said that due to a large outcry, they have thrown out the GPS and GPS+ for the high school diploma saga. This original proposal would have been very hard to track the points. A new version will require that students have 42 credits to graduate. Member Hollingsworth has a few things she is concerned with like, only English 9 is needed and the only Math needed is Algebra, her opinion is that Geometry is needed. Tomorrow at downtown ACPL 6 pm, Town Hall with Representatives GiaQuinta and Miller.

Board Member Noah Smith admitted that as he voted against the Yondr pouches, he is happy and proud to say he was wrong. At the time, he was not sure that this was the right remedy; however, the data and feedback are showing positive results. Member Smith gave kudos to Security and Secondary Principals. He also commented that FWCS is still hiring teachers, classified staff and drivers. Mr. Smith also shared a story about a Charism Northrop reunion and a retirement dinner story of a past ELL teacher.

Board Member Jennifer Matthias enjoyed this evening's wonderful event were staff leaders were recognized, but also wanted to recognize those that show up each and every day. Great things are happening and relationships are formed from PreK to the finish line of graduation day. She again personally thanked those that show up every day, including everyone in this room. Member Matthias was talking with a friend from Toledo, which is a city much like Fort Wayne, about some of the things FWCS is doing from facilities and maintenance to our mental health resources. This friend was amazed as Toledo's school system is not doing these things.

Board Member Anne Duff thanked the Community again for voting for the safety referendum. She also thanked Mike and Matt, along with Student Advocates, and all the mental health supports for the work they are doing. With the tragedy last week at Apalachee High School in Georgia, these shootings effect all of us. Member Duff is glad of the things we are doing to prevent that from happening in FWCS. Her wish is that other communities will see what we are doing, setting an example.

Superintendent Dr. Mark Daniel heard today in Rotary what the impact of social media is doing. His hope is that by having mental health resources in our buildings it is trickling back home to the parents. We are hearing from our teachers that there is something different in our buildings and classrooms. Not just one thing, many things. Dr. Daniel thanked Matt and Mike for their implementation. FWCS should be very proud of what we are doing, constant improvement. As part of the budget you heard about buses. The start of the school year has shown we have drivers and routes.

Board President Maria Norman reported that her own 8<sup>th</sup> grader is now talking and playing Uno during lunch, instead of playing games on their phones and not talking to one another. President Norman is not afraid when she drops her student off at school each day. We have resources at FWCS that can assist with clothing, shoes, etc. She was able to attend today's IREAD Celebration. She thanked teachers for adapting to things that the State and FWCS throws at them.
