6.D. PUSD Risk Mitigation Presentation

Presenter: Clark Tenney, Superintendent shared the following information with the Board.

PUSD School Safety Measures

In addition to countless student and staff safety measures such as allergy protocols, physical exams for athletes, building maintenance, protocols for student supervision, and registered nurses in each school, PUSD has a variety of measures in place specifically to mitigate the risk of an attack on our schools.

Attacks of schools are exceptionally rare (less than 15% of all active shooter situations). In spite of this fact, PUSD does all we can to ensure that our schools continue to be the safest place a child can be outside of their own home.

- 1. PUSD has a long-term, close relationship with the Prescott Police Department.
 - a. PPD and PUSD frequently consult on safety issues
 - b. PPD increases police presence at schools whenever a potential concern arises
 - c. PPD officers know our schools well--many are PUSD grads and/or PUSD parents
 - d. PPD officers are posted on PUSD campuses every single day
 - e. PPD conducts regular emergency training using PUSD facilities to help familiarize police with PUSD campuses
- Each PUSD school has monitored, single-point entry during the school day
- 3. Each campus is fully fenced and is locked during school hours
- Each campus has had threat assessments performed by ERAU, leading to changes for greater campus safety.
- Updated campus threat assessments are currently in progress with PPD.
- Every campus has numerous security cameras. Many cameras are linked to an Al system which immediately recognizes and alerts admin to potential weapons and other threats
- 7. Full-time Prescott Police Student Resource Officers are posted at both PHS and Mile High MS
 - a. Deter those who might consider illegal activity on our campuses
 - b. Assist administration in dealing with occasional criminal behavior by students or visitors
 - c. Interact positively with students, building a culture where the police are recognized as allies
 - d. Safety resource for students/staff/parents
- 8. Off-duty police/sheriff School Safety Officers are on Kdg-Grade 6 campuses most every day
 - a. Same benefits as above
- 9. All adults required to wear ID badges at each school, to allow for ready ID of an unauthorized visitor
- All campuses employ dozens of adults who monitor students throughout the day
- 11. Certain PUSD campuses have regular community patrol, linked directly to school admin
- Students and staff perform emergency drills monthly at every school, following written procedures
 required by law and endorsed by Prescott Police Department
 - a. Building evacuation drills
 - b. Shelter in place drills
 - c. Lock-down ("active shooter") drills
- 13. Schools employ the Raptor Emergency Alert system
 - Allows every school staff member to initiate emergency procedures, and to be informed instantly from any location
 - Interfaces with PPD's Mutual Link system, providing police real-time video/audio and location updates during incidents
- 14. "Stop the Bleed" kits placed in every classroom
- 15. State law prohibits weapons on every school campus, except law enforcement officers
- 16. Each school promotes positive culture with nationally-recognized student wellness programs
 - a. Promotes positive relationships, teacher-student and student-student
 - b. Counselors at every school to help students who are struggling

- c. School anti-bullying policies are in place and enforced
- d. Secondary schools have School Safety Tip hotlines
- e. Student use of cell phones is restricted on each campus
- Every school has fair but strict student discipline policies that reduces bullying, conflicts, harassment, and other negative peer interactions
- 18. All schools have safety committees or leadership teams that regularly meet to discuss any issues, trends, etc. that could be a potential safety concern.
- There is an immediate and comprehensive investigation of any threat to the school or individual involving both internal systems and outside agencies
- PUSD has a long-time lead role in county-wide "Milestones" program to identify and prevent potential acts of student violence
 - Milestones Committee includes Sheriff, Police Chiefs, county Supt of Schools, county Juvenile Justice system director, Mental Health leaders, 2 School Principals (includes PUSD)
 - b. Committee meets immediately when a potential threat is reported
 - c. Interventions are enacted right away if a threat is confirmed
