
SchooLinks




HOW DO I FIND SCHOLARSHIPS IN SCHOOLINKS?


SchooLinks


From the SchooLinks dashboard, click the Finances icon on the left hand navigation bar and select Scholarship Matching from the side menu. Create a Scholarship Match Profile based on eligibility, interests, and colleges. Click View Matches to see the results. You can also search for specific scholarships. Note - as they become available in the next few months, our local scholarships will also be added.





Austin Assurance Scholarship



Are you interested in a \$12,000 scholarship to attend Riverland? If the answer is YES, <u>click here</u> to learn more about eligibility for the Austin Assurance Scholarship. You can stop by the Career Center any day to see Ms. Carlson or on Tuesdays or Thursdays to talk to Taylor Flugge, Austin Assurance Advisor.

Get Connected is a constant source of volunteer opportunities, and this is also where you will go to log your hours. All students have a Get Connected account. Can't remember your password? Click the "forgot password" link. All accounts are created with your school email so the hours pull for the scholarship. Pro tip: Always fill out the volunteer request completely with as much detail as possible. Failure to do so will result in delays in approval. Note: if you are volunteering at the Humane Society this year, you will need to stop in the Career Center and get a verification form.

Beginning in fall 2024, the North Star Promise (NSP) Scholarship program will make college accessible and affordable for any eligible Minnesotan who has the desire to earn a credential. The program will cover the full cost of tuition and fees for eligible Minnesotans at public institutions and tribal colleges in the state.

NSP is intended to have a positive impact on multiple fronts:

- Help stabilize enrollment at Minnesota public institutions of higher education;
- Serve as an economic driver for Minnesota by educating qualified workers who
 are much needed to fill vacancies in the state's labor force;
- Create a viable higher education path for Minnesota residents who may have previously thought education was not a possibility for them.

Eligibility and Academic Requirements

- You must be a Minnesota resident
- Have a family Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) as reported on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or Minnesota Dream Act Application below \$80,000.
- Not be in default on a state or federal student loan.
- Be enrolled taking at least one credit
- Meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) standards
- Have not already earned a baccalaureate degree
- Be enrolled in a program or course of study that applies to a degree, diploma, or certificate

What's Covered?

NSP will cover the full remaining cost of college tuition and fees, after other scholarships, grants, and tuition waivers have been applied.

Eligible Institutions

- All Minnesota State colleges and universities
- All University of Minnesota system campuses
- All tribal colleges

North Star Impact

An estimated 15,000 students will benefit from NSP in the first academic year of implementation.

Maximum Award Amounts

There is no maximum length of time that students can receive the NSP, but there are credit limits.

For students earning a:

2-year Associate Degree: Receive NSP up to 60 credits

4-year Bachelor's Degree:

Receive NSP up to 120 credits

Last-Dollar Scholarship

NSP is a "last-dollar" program, which considers any other sources of gift aid funding that students receive, before the award is applied.

The goal of this strategy is to utilize all available federal, state, private and institutional gift aid to provide as many eligible students as possible with a tuition and fee-free pathway to a college education.

How do I apply?

Students apply by completing the:

- Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.studentaid.gov or
- Minnesota Dream Act application at www.ohe.state.mn.us/MNDreamAct

What happens next?

The college or university you are attending will assess your eligibility on a term-by-term basis and award North Star Promise Scholarships to all eligible students.

Your award amount will be calculated by your college or university. They will determine your tuition and required fee charges, subtract all other sources of gift aid (scholarships, grants, waivers and stipends) and award the remaining amount in a North Star Promise Scholarship. Students will be notified through the college or university's standard awarding process.

How much money can I receive?


There is not a limit on the maximum term, yearly, or lifetime dollar amount of an award you can receive. The amount you receive is based on the "last-dollar" calculation of your eligibility on a term-by-term basis. You can receive up to 100% of the amount charged in tuition and required fees per term, minus all other sources of gift aid you receive. You must continue to meet the Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) standards at your school.

If funds are available, the highest need students may also receive North Star Promise Plus funds. Note: The details on the North Star Promise Plus provision of the program are still being determined.

About The Gates Scholarship The Gates Scholarship (TGS) is a highly selective, last-dollar scholarship for outstanding, minority, high school seniors from low-income households. Each year, the scholarship is awarded to exceptional student leaders, with the intent of helping them realize their maximum potential.

Selected Scholars will receive funding for the full cost of attendance to earn a bachelor's degree, that is not already covered by other financial aid and the Student Aid Index, as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), or the methodology used by a Scholar's college or university. Costs covered include tuition, fees, books, housing and food, and may include additional personal costs.

TGS also provides Scholars with various online support services designed to help them excel in their degree programs, graduate, and make a successful transition to their chosen careers. These include career services, mentoring, leadership development, wellness, and knowledge building.

The ideal candidate will have an outstanding academic record in high school (top 10% of class), charticipation in community exceptional personal success skills perseverance)

To apply, a student must be:

- A high school senior
- From at least one of the following ethnicities: African American, American Indian/Alaska
- Native*, Asian/Pacific Islander American, and/or Hispanic American
- Pell-eligible
- A US citizen, national, or permanent resident
- In good academic standing with a minimum cumulative weighted GPA of 3.3 on a 4.0
- scale (or equivalent)

Additionally, a student must plan to enroll full-time, in a four-year degree program, at a US accredited, not-for-profit, private or public college or university.

*For American Indian/Alaska Native, proof of tribal enrollment will be required.

TESTING INFORMATION



PSAI Testing When: October 9, 2024 (registration forms due Sept 26)

Who: Optional test for 10th and 11th graders

Where: Locations will be posted on the Career Center door

*Registration forms available in the Career Center and Cashier's Office

Wednesday, October 9 the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) will be administered to interested sophomores and juniors. The PSAT/NMQST is a standardized test serving as a practice version of the SAT exam. It includes modules for reading, writing, and math. The PSAT also prepares students for college readiness and is the qualifying exam for the National Merit Scholarship. It is the only test that the Hormel Foods Corporation will accept for their special scholarship program. These special scholarships are available to the children of current, retired, or deceased employees of Hormel and its subsidiaries. In no instance will any officer or employee of the Hormel Company play a part in the selection of scholarship winners or monies to be awarded. The NMSQT Corporation handles the entire award process. This test is NOT required for the Austin Assurance Scholarship.

Sign up will take place starting September 4th; forms are available in the Career Center and Cashier's Office. Parents/guardians will need to complete the registration form and submit to the cashier by September 26 at 3:30 PM. This test is optional, you do not have to take it.

To Prepare: <u>Click here</u> to learn more about the Digital PSAT/NMSQT. Full length adaptive digital practice is available on the Bluebook app. Additional resources are available on Khan Academy. **There will be a mandatory PSAT Prep and Device Check session for students on Tuesday 10/1 at 7:45 AM and again at 3:30 PM in the Career Center. It will take about 15 minutes. This step is critical so we ensure the correct version of Bluebook is on their device.**

Testing Day: On 10/9/24 the test will start promptly at 8:30 AM. Students can check the window outside the Career Center to see their room assignments the week of the test. The test will take approximately 2.5 hours.

WHAT IS THE ACCUPLACER?



The Accuplacer is a standardized reading and math placement exam to help colleges assess student readiness for introductory credit bearing courses and make reliable placement decisions. This may be required to enroll in our PSEO courses as well as when you enroll in college. Accuplacer makes it easier for you to plan a successful path toward a college degree. Talk to your counselor or Ms. Carlson if you are interested in learning more about the Accuplacer. You must pre-register using the link below two weeks in advance of the test.

WHAT IS THE ASVAB?



The ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) is a standardized test that measures a person's aptitude and helps predict their future academic and career success. The ASVAB is used for a variety of purposes, including military entrance eligibility and career guidance for both military and civilian jobs. The test includes topics such as arithmetic reasoning, comprehension, electronics, automotive and mechanical comprehension, assembling objects, and verbal expression. It was originally designed as a military test in 1968, but is now used for much more. The **ASVAB Career Exploration Program** is an online tool students can utilize in conjunction with their score to explore and plan for a career in civilian or military worlds of work. In addition, the ASVAB test is one way to earn academic eligibility for the Austin Assurance Scholarship if you don't need the GPA threshhold. Any junior or senior can take the **ASVAB** at AHS. Testing dates are 10/29, 12/10, 1/28, 2/11, 4/1, 5/20. Sign up with the QR Code below.
