The second day started with a stop at Arlington National Cemetery, where they watched the Changing of the Guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, toured the U.S. Capitol Building and the Library of Congress, and walked along the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall and the Lincoln Memorial. They only caught a glimpse of The White House

as the area was under renovation, but they did get to see the new World War I Memorial and watch the playing of taps by a bugler dressed in a WWI uniform. The students were also able to view some of the memorials after dark, like the World War II and Martin Luther King Memorials. The next day, they traveled to Philadelphia, where they ate at the Reading Terminal Market (think cheesesteaks and pretzels). They were able to stand close to the Liberty Bell and tour Independence Hall. A visit to Carpenters Hall, Christ









Church, Ben Franklin's grave, and The First Post Office rounded out the visit to old Philly. We then wound down the trip with a visit to The Franklin Institute Science Museum and a "Rocky" run on the steps of The Philadelphia Museum of Art before they departed for Byron.

# **NURSES NOTES**

The nurse's office at the elementary school is quite often a busy place. As I write this, I've got one kiddo with an emesis basin (aka a plastic bucket lined with a Walmart bag) in front of her "just in case," one kiddo waiting for his parents to come pick him (and his achy ear) up, and another with ice on a swollen bug bite. In between sick visits, though,

I have time to work on issues that impact our students and staff at the elementary, middle, and high schools.

One of the topics I'm focused on is improving the long-term health of our students, including their dental health. In September, we were able to host the Great Lakes Bay Health Center mobile dental bus for our first-ever visit. Last spring, we sent out permission forms to all of our elementary school students and made the forms available to the older students in their middle and

high school offices. In early September, the bus parked at the elementary school for two days while students who had parent-signed permission slips were seen by the dentist and hygienist for an exam, cleaning, fluoride treatment, and any needed sealants. The service

works with most, if not all, insurance plans. Families without dental insurance can easily apply for a sliding scale rate, which is never more than \$40.

We had about a dozen kiddos who were able to use this convenient, child-friendly service. It received rave reviews from all of the patients, and I am happy to say we have scheduled a return visit for early March 2025. Falling just over six months from the fall appointment, the March schedule will give interested students the chance to have twice-yearly dental visits. Hopefully, we will see the number of students taking part in the



visits increase as the word gets out to more and more families. Keep us in mind if your students could benefit from better dental health!

Another opportunity I'd like to be sure our Byron families know about is the chance all of our students have to take an American

Heart Association CPR and First Aid course free of charge here at our schools. The classes are offered as students express an interest, last about three hours, and provide stress-free, hands-on training. If your teen would like to learn more, have them ask their school secretary for more information.

I'm always on the lookout for ways to improve the day-to-day health of our students. If you know of a need or see a gap in the way we care for the health of our students, feel free to give me a call. And as always,


