equestrian, and PHS Seventh Grader, Chase.



In preparation for their Outdoor Education trip where they will be studying celestial bodies, the Fifth Graders in Mrs. Kozik's lab science **class** explored the phases of the moon and the location of the stars and constellations throughout the year.

Building a constellation box enabled them to view which stellar configurations were available for viewing in North America during which seasons of the year. Students learned that these changes in the night sky were due to the orbiting of the Earth around the Sun and the different view of the sky available for observation!



Our Kindergarten and First Graders recently journeyed to **Tanaka Farms** in Irvine, where they walked through the fields of growing vegetables and picked a few of their own. After their science lab study of the different parts of plants, it was exciting to be at Tanaka Farms and experience field after field of food growing in the soil.
