Red Ribbon Week

Red Ribbon week began in 1985 by students at Calexico High School in California to honor one of its former graduates who later became a law enforcement office. Enrique Camarena, or "Kiki" as he was called by his friends and family, was killed by drug dealers while working as an undercover drug enforcement agent. To honor him and all the law enforcement officers who work to keep drugs out of our country, students at his former high school wore red ribbons. They pledged to keep themselves drug free, to become educated on the dangers of drugs and encourage others to stay drug free.

As educational partners with parents and guardians, we want to update you about classroom strategies. You may have heard about Visible Learning at Salina Public Schools – and if so, you're probably curious what this means. Through Visible Learning:

- Students see themselves as more than just pupils. They see themselves as active learners who are eager to explore and grow.
- Each of our schools have chosen learning dispositions that support development of critical thinking, communication and social-emotional skills.

These learning dispositions are attitudes or habits that help students become better learners. Examples in action could include:

- · Self-motivation: taking charge of your own learning by setting goals
- Curiosity: asking lots of questions
- Resilience: keep trying even when something is hard

Your child's school will be sharing the learning dispositions with you. When you read or hear about them, they're a great way to connect and reinforce the critical, lifelong skills your child is learning. We encourage you to use them as a conversation point with your child. These discussions will strengthen your bond with your child and support them on their educational journey.

Special Best-Selling Author Talk


