
A Work in Progress

Book Club Discussion Questions/Topics:





- Boat Building Challenge: Participants can design and build miniature boats using various materials such as plastic bottles, cardboard, straws, and tape. The challenge could be to see whose boat can hold the most weight or float for the longest time.
