The board will be offering additional opportunities for the community to engage in early budget development. Please look forward to upcoming dates.



Testing and Accountability

On Oct. 1 students in grades 8 and 9 took the College Board PSAT 8/9. On Oct. 2 students in grades 10 and 11 took PSAT/NMSQT. The purpose of the PSAT is to measure each student's college and career readiness and determine which knowledge areas and skills need more work. The College Board does not send PSAT scores to colleges. These scores are not intended to be part of college admission decisions. The PSAT/NMSQT is the qualifying test for the National Merit Scholarship Program, an academic competition for recognition and scholarships.

Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills (DIBELS) fall testing window closed on Oct. 8. Over 3000 students in grades K-3 participated. The purpose of DIBELS is to help teachers and schools assess reading skills and identify students who may need additional support. Across grades the percent student meeting the fall benchmark is showing an upward trend: fall 2022- 50%, fall 2023-53% and fall 2024- 55%.

School Quality Review (SQR)


There will be 13 schools receiving a School Quality Review for 2024-25. The schools have all attended training. This week is the first School Quality Review at West Rocks Middle School on Wednesday-Thursday, Oct. 16-17, 2024. This is their second SQR and their first was in 2022-23.

Research and Analytics

Data dashboards have incorporated beginning of year NWEA, DIBELS, and DESSA data into one place, formatted based on Principal's requests. Work continues refining discipline data dashboards to support the operations department in reducing behavioral incidents and increasing equity.

The team has begun a new practice this year of sending schools emails containing newly available data sets for their review. Rather than only communicating that data is available, which was the practice in prior years, school-specific emails are now being sent. So far two data sets have been sent. One focused on an update to a visualization that allows schools to see how student performance on NWEA changed from the end of the 2023-24 school year to the beginning of the 2024-25 school year. The other focused on student performance, by standard, from the first ELA checkpoint of the year.

Student Information System



Middle School Lottery has been opened to families. The application will be open until December 6, 2024. The lottery drawing is anticipated to run on Dec. 16, 2024 and results will go out to families within a week of the lottery drawing.

CURRICULUM, INSTRUCTION & SPECIALIZED LEARNING

Humanities

The past two weeks have been a flurry of support for schools. In conjunction with the Multilingual Learning Department, we are working with Silvermine on alignment of Spanish Language Arts and English Language Arts units of study. In addition, social studies support in middle schools has begun as students are approaching the new inquiry part of the unit. The team supported District Walkthroughs at 7 schools collecting data on planning and instruction. Finally, Oct. 15 was a day of learning for teachers. We provided professional learning in the areas of discourse, social studies planning and resources, Heggerty, the new revised music and art curricula, and world language.



Math/Stem

Last week, the department supported CGS and the leadership development team as they implemented a new system for benchmark assessments. The STEM department supported with analyzing test questions, norming on grading, and reflections for further work.

The STEM department offered multiple professional learning sessions on Oct. 15, with support from professional learning partners and additional stakeholders in the district and community. Elementary sessions included marine science with the Maritime and the Marine Science Coordinator, Science 4 Us and Gizmos from Explore Learning, Inner Orbit, Physical Education PD, Building Thinking Classrooms for Mathematics, and optional secondary sessions including Physical Education, Physics and Open Sci Ed, IXL, and Gizmos.



Next week, professional learning will continue for science for grades 6, 7, and 8 teachers who are implementing their first year of Open Sci Ed. This is a second training session, with the first being delivered last June. The STEM department has also been supporting coaches with 1:1 meetings focused around building their practices and embedded coaching and support with an observation of practice.

Multilingual Learners

On Thursday, Oct. 10, Dr. Estrella, Ralph Valensizi, and Frances Saez had the opportunity to present at the Connecticut Performance Matters Conference in Hartford, CT. Ms. Saez presented information on the Multilingual Learner Accelerated Summer program as an innovative program to support our students in attaining credits needed for graduation.

The Multilingual Learner department held a professional learning opportunity at the Family Center for elementary MLL teachers on Tuesday, October 15th. Our elementary MLL teachers engaged in professional development with HD Word, a resource to support students with reading skills and development. A guest teacher joined us from Fox Run elementary school to model different lessons and resources. Additionally, we continued professional learning on how to utilize LAS Links data to inform instructional practices that support Multilingual Learners in the classroom.

Counseling/Workforce Development

Norwalk Public Schools had the privilege of presenting at the CT Performance Matters Conference in Hartford on the Behavior Health Grant and the SHAPE Assessment. Carol Wiltshire-Toth was able to attend the CT State Tuesday Talks Zoom meeting all about statewide attendance and the NACEP Early College Summit in which they explored dual enrollment in Higher Education. The team met with the high schools for the RISE Post Secondary Collaborative. The NPS Risk Assessment and Intervention Guide has been revised and finalized and will be released for use shortly (see picture below). The work continues on the Scholar Meeting Tracker, in which we are able to use data outcomes to provide more support to scholars and faculty/staff as we refine the information based on School Counselor feedback for Grades 8 to 12.



Workforce Development attended the Chamber of Commerce relative to expanding internship opportunities for our NPS Scholars. The CT State Norwalk partnership met to review potential courses for next year and possible funding. I met with Eversource to discuss the high school field trip to their campus for high school scholars who are 16+. I had the privilege to present at the CT performance Matters Conference in Hartford on Workforce Development and Career Readiness. The work continues on the NPS Internship Program, and the Fall application should be ready to share with our scholars sometime in October. Specialized Learning

Education Administrators, Deirdre McKinnon and Veronica Lenzen, participated in the Board Workshop on Oct. 8, and presented important information regarding data and trends in the department.

Special Education Administrators, Jamie Granite and Rachel Davis, joined Deirdre McKinnon and Veronica Lenzen at the Middle School Choice Fair, held on Oct. 9. The Middle School Choice Fair was a great opportunity to share with families how special education and related services carry over to the middle school level, and we were able to share some fun swag - fidgets and squeeze toys.

Also on Oct. 9, Norwalk hosted a Transition Fair, which was organized by Transition Coordinator, Jessica Ireland, and was a partnership among Wilton, Westport, Stamford, and Norwalk. The 4 Districts were thrilled to welcome Ability Beyond, STAR, DDS, BRS, Kennedy Collective, Project Search, College Steps, Abilis, BESB, Marrakesh, Financial Advisors, CT State Continuing Education, Norwalk Transit, and several other programs and agencies!



Teachers supported professional development on Oct. 15 by providing sessions on phonics and phonemic awareness. This training will help staff understand and implement curriculum for struggling readers.

Facilities

Roton Middle School Lockers - Pricing was received for Roton Middle School locker replacement and steps are in place to award this project for the summer of 2025. Pricing was lower than expected and planning is in place to include another middle school next summer.

Tracey and Brookside Fuel Tank Replacement - A pre-construction review is in progress with the Dept. of Administrative Services to place these projects out to bid for a summer 2025 completion. Fox Run Abatement - Ongoing discussions are taking place with the Dept. of Administrative Services to accept this project and allow NPS to bid for a summer 2025 completion.

School Safety

The School Safety Team continues to work with the NPS Data Analysis Team to further expand and calibrate our incident and disciplinary tracking systems. The data collected helps the district and schools analyze incidents from an overview and granularly, which guide policies, procedures and programs aimed at student support and behavior modification.

Transportation

NPS will celebrate National Bus Safety Week of Oct. 21 with several district-wide events. Monday/Tuesday we will partner with NPD for Operation Safe Stop, they will provide patrol services at heavily trafficked bus stops in areas of Route 7, Route 1 and West Avenue. On Oct. 23, Durham will celebrate our drivers with lunch and safety awards.



On Oct. 24 and 25, schools will conduct Bus Evacuation Drills in the morning on arrival. Students will exit from the back of the bus through the emergency door, school staff will be on site to assist. During this week Fox Run, Kendall and Wolfpit will celebrate National Bike, Walk and Stroll to school events. City of Norwalk Bike/Walk Commission, Nuvance Health and Norwalk Health Department will be on site to hand out educational resources and answer safety questions.

Health Services

A limited supply of Covid tests were received from the state and are available if needed for staff, students, and families.

School nurses attended a robust professional development day on Oct. 15 and attended presentations on bloodborne pathogens, as well as seizure care for school nurses from the Epilepsy Foundation of Connecticut.

Grants



The Grants Team is excited to share a partnership we have made between Norwalk Public Schools and the Arthur Miller Foundation (AMF). AMF works to provide equitable access to theater education in public schools and aims to increase the number of students that receive a dedicated theater education as an integral part of their academic curriculum. AMF recently held their first Professional Development workshop with eight theatre/dance teachers in Norwalk. Throughout the course of the workshop, AMF provided staff with resources such as theatre tickets for their classes to attend live performances, classroom materials, and collectively they worked towards identifying how theatre education fits within our Portrait of a Graduate. We are very excited to have AMF as a partner here in Norwalk!

DIGITAL LEARNING & TECHNOLOGY

Enterprise Software/Data

NWEA RIT Math scores have been successfully imported into the IXL platform. IXL's personalized MAP study plans now guide students toward the exact skills they need to develop, based on their RIT scores.

All building leaders and central office department heads now have access to ClassLink Analytics on their dashboards. These analytics provide a custom dashboard for every educational app and tool available on their LaunchPad. Engagement summaries for each app, across any time period, can be broken down by grade level, classroom, or individual students, offering deeper insights. We continue to provide daily support to all end-user issues.

Infrastructure/Operations

The team successfully assisted with multiple setups across the District for the Oct. 15, professional development sessions. We are nearing the finalization of security training videos for staff, which we plan to launch on Nov. 5. Additionally, new access points were deployed at Marvin and Brookside.

Digital Learning

Last week, our Elementary Digital Learning Coaches, along with our administration for Library Media Services and Digital Promise, attended the Fall AI in Education Conference hosted by EdAdvance in Litchfield, CT. We explored new tools available for educators and discussed strategies for implementing these resources within our district.

Library Media

Our Library Media Specialists will attend the CASL Library Conference on Oct. 21. The theme of the conference is Together We Connect-icut, featuring renowned teacher-librarian and technology innovator Shannon Miller, alongside author Mike Curato. Teacher librarians Jodi Flom Nathanson from Fox Run School, Beverly Boyd from Brien McMahon, and Lynn Payton-Roby, our Coordinator, recently attended the Reimagining the Library Learning Commons in the Age of Al workshop series. They delved into the history of AI, examined trends and challenges, and explored a range of AI tools.

FINANCE

The Grants team completed a comprehensive review of the current grants schedule to ensure ongoing alignment with our financial goals and compliance.

Budget request forms for Central Office performance reviews were distributed to various departments, allowing them to submit their financial needs and priorities for the upcoming fiscal year. Additionally, the department successfully convened a community budget town hall, providing an opportunity for stakeholders to offer input and ask questions about the budget process. To further enhance public engagement and accessibility, we are planning a virtual community town hall to ensure broader participation in the budget planning process. We continue to collaborate closely with auditors on the citywide independent audit, maintaining transparency and accountability in our financial practices. Furthermore, the department received state grants specifically designated to offset employee medical expenses for paraeducators, helping to reduce the overall cost burden on the district.

Lastly, a preliminary meeting was held with the superintendent to begin setting budget priorities for Fiscal Year 2026, focusing on long-term financial planning and resource allocation. These efforts reflect our ongoing commitment to fiscal responsibility, community engagement, and strategic planning to support our educational mission.
