JAMES L. MOORE

James L. Moore, instructor of percussion instruments at the famed Navy School of Music in Washington, D. C., grew up in Jackson, Michigan where he attended the public schools until 1952. Later, he received both his Bachelor and Master of Music degrees, with a major in percussion, at the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor.

Although still a young man, he has had a total of 17 years of experience on all phases of percussion performance with private study from some of the leading percussionists in the East. During this time, he has played with the Washington, D.C. Civic Symphony, the U.S. Department of Agriculture Symphony, the faculty band of the U.S. Navy School of Music, the University of Michigan Symphonic and Marching Bands, the University of Michigan Symphony Orchestra, the Toledo, Ohio Symphony Orchestra, and numerous dance engagements in both Michigan and the District of Columbia.

Besides these, Mr. Moore has organized and rehearsed numerous percussion ensembles which have played demonstrations and clinics in the Washington area. For these clinics, he has composed and specially arranged many selections. An original concert march and an Alma Mater are also to his credit.


In addition to his performance experience, Mr. Moore has had an article published in a national instrumental magazine and was co-author of a percussion manual distributed at the All Eastern Instrumental Music Clinic held in Washington in February 1959.

Mr. Moore is a member of Kappa Kappa Psi, national band honorary society; and the NACWPI, National Association of College Wind and Percussion Instructors.

West York Percussion Ensemble

A new and rather unique music ensemble, the West York Percussion Ensemble, was organized in February 1960. In an effort to show what can be done with the often-neglected percussion section in the high school band, the West York group traces percussion literature from early revolutionary and civil war military music to present-day ensembles. Assisted by two trumpets and a piccolo, their varied repertoire includes ancient rudimental drumming, military music, novelty quartets, and contemporary ensembles.

Already this new organization has played demonstrations for the Instrumental Parent's Club and a local service club. In May, they will travel to the Pennsylvania State University to play clinics and demonstrations for the music education majors and in the area public schools.
