

FLUTE SOLOIST

In the eight years he has been studying flute, Tim Day has compiled an impressive record of accomplishments. In addition to having held first chair in all of his high school music organizations, Tim has been a key participant in the York Symphony, the Young Persons Chamber Orchestra of York, and in numerous small ensembles. He is also a member of Modern Music Masters, a national honorary music society.

In competition, Tim has earned "top chairs" (1st chair for the past three years) in seven P.M.E.A. district festivals and three P.M.E.A. regional festivals. This past February, he was selected to perform with an All-Eastern Band composed of students representing twelve states in a festival held in Wash-

ington, D.C.

Although only a junior, Tim has decided to continue his music after graduation by following a career in professional performance and teaching. He is currently studying flute at Peabody Conservatory of Music in Baltimore.





STEPHEN SIPE BARITONE SOLOIST

Steve Sipe, Baritone soloist, began his musical training through the West York Area School System at the age of ten. Since then he has taken a dedicated interest in all musical activities of the school.

In addition to his high school marching and concert bands, Steve has

actively participated in all choral organizations. Last year he sang a key role in the school's production of "My Fair Lady". He has also held the baritone position in the brass sextet for the past three years. This winter he was selected for membership in Modern Music Masters, a national music honorary music society.

In competition, Steve has represented West York in two P.M.E.A. district band festivals and this past March in the regional band festival held

in Hershey.

Like Tim, Steve plans a career in music upon graduation in 1970.

ALAN WYAND BAND DIRECTOR

Our dedicated and enthusiastic band director was born in State College, Pennsylvania, and received both his Baccalaureate and Masters Degrees in Music Education from the Pennsylvania State University.

In addition to other collegiate activities, Mr. Wyand was a member and officer of the Penn State Band, organized and led a dance orchestra, and toured nine European countries with the University Chapel Choir.

Last year, Mr. Wyand was selected as one of ten high school band directors from the United States to be honored by the SCHOOL MUSICIAN Magazine for his outstanding work in the field of instrumental music education. A picture and article appeared in a Spring issue. He was further honored by induction into the American School Band Directors' Association, a select group of band directors from throughout the United States. Just recently, he was presented honorary membership in "The Order of the Silver Horn" awarded to "those whose accomplishments in the field of school music are of the highest national standards."

Mr. Wyand is a life member of the P.S.E.A. and N.E.A., charter member of the National Band Association, a member of the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association, the Pennsylvania Bandmasters Association, the Music Educators National Conference, and the Percussive Arts Society.



Honorary societies to his credit include Phi Beta Mu, National Bandmasters Fraternity (past president of Pennsylvania Chapter); Phi Delta Kappa, Honorary Education and Phi Mu Alpha, Honorary Music Fraternity.

In addition, Mr. Wyand is a member of the National Board of Representatives for the School Band of America, a European touring band associated with the People-to-People Program. He was recently appointed National Editor for Phi Bera Mu and has news articles appearing monthly in a professional journal.

Mr. Wyand has gained national recognition through the publication of his manual, "Band Training Camps". He has attracted state and national attention to the activities of the West York music program through the appearances of quest artists and the tours of our various musical groups.

Mr. Wyand has appeared as clinician and adjudicator in Maryland, Virginia, and throughout Pennsylvania.

THE INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC BOOSTER CLUB

The Instrumental Music Booster Club was organized in July of 1956. Its purpose is "to arouse and maintain an enthusiastic interest in the various phases of instrumental music in the West York Area Schools". Membership is open to anyone interested in the progress and development of instrumental music in the West York Area Schools.

The officers and members of the club wish to thank the residents of the community for their continued support of the group's activities. Past projects have included the purchase of new uniforms, new instruments and miscellaneous band equipment; sponsorship of the John Philip Sousa Band Award; a \$200.00 music camp scholarship; partial payment of a summer band training encampment; preparation and serving of the annual band banquet; and help in transporting and chaperoning numerous band trips and social functions. Funds for current year's projects have been raised through magazine sales, refreshment stand at Halloween parade, submarine sandwich sale, and the annual Spring Concert souvenir program.

The main projects for the present year are to raise funds to complete payment of the new uniforms, for the Albert Kelly Memorial Summer Camp Scholarship, and for the tenth annual band training encampment planned for late August, 1969. A three-day concert tour is also planned for April 24, 25, and 26 to Cedar Grove, New Jersey.

"OUR YEAR IN REVIEW"

The 1968-69 band season began with the important week prior to our annual band camp. The band office hummed with activity as librarians, managers, secretaries, quartermasters, and a host of helpful (?) assistants planned this year's trek to the "funny farm", Camp Jolly Acres, in Maryland. This year's "rookies" were also given a taste of the marching season during the week prior to camp as Mr. Wyand and a crew of hard-working seniors including Ann Sipling, Dave Winter, Rick Strausbaugh, Doug Geiselman, Don Emig, and Tom Zemaitis taught them the basics of marching.

Band camp again proved to be a great success as music and routines were drilled into both new rookies and "out of shape" upperclassmen by Mr. Wyand and his capable henchmen. Even though we worked ten hours per day, there was still plenty of time for fun. "Uncle Bud" Schlosser and his poltergeist out did themselves as the "rooks" endured their day of initiation, "the happiest day of their lives!" This year's activities were dominated by the seniors from the BIG RED I who ruled the roost in volleyball competition. It also seemed that Mr. Wyand was forced to find a bed other than his own to sleep in most of the week. The mighty, mighty band proved their physical prowess as they soundly defeated the guard in the traditional tug-of-war. The guard did prove, however, that they could play softball (enough said!). The band emerged from camp worthy of its title "the sharpest band within 100 miles of either bank of the mighty Codorus Creek."



With the arrival of football season, West York fans again saw a tremendous football team coached by Mr. Heckard and his staff. School spirit, which the band did a large part in arousing, rose to fever pitch with each successive victory. The band was extremely proud of one of its members, Dave Landis, who was selected to the all-county team as a member of West York's undefeated squad. This year the band was led on the field by drum major Randy Runk. Randy, instructed by Chip Willis of Penn State Blue Band, did an extremely fine job. Our majorettes, led by Christine Senft, also had a successful season, adding beauty to (and providing incentive for) the band. This year the band presented some very effective and well received shows. Who could forget the

chorus line of our "Salute to the Play Boy Club"? We also contributed to the pageantry of homecoming weekend by marching in the pep parade, playing at the bonfire, leading the formal parade, and performing at the game. Some of the band members did double duty by getting up at 5:00 A. M. on that Saturday to help the Band Booster Club make subs for their extremely successful sale which netted \$900.00 for our new uniforms.

These new uniforms were first displayed by the band at the Southwestern game in November where that stunning (?) model Greg Smith demonstrated the versatility to the audience. The band and Mr. Wyand would like to take this opportunity to thank the school board and the Band Booster Club for providing these new uniforms. The quartermasters, Pam Balthaser and Doug Geiselman, also deserve a round of thanks for the many hours they put in organizing and distributing the uniforms.

Once again the band performed the combined show with the Red Lion Band; our band playing host this year At half-time, seniors of the band were honored. Special congratulations are in order for the drum section who, under the leadership of Dave Winter, became one of the sharpest units yet. Thanks also to Rick Strausbaugh who stepped in at the last moment to become bass drummer.

Under color sergeant Dave Kopp and coach "Bud" Schlosser, the color guard captured first place in competition at Frederick, Maryland, Spring Grove, and Goldsboro. And of course they also managed to appear with the band at each football game. Hats off to the guard for remaining "number one".

The biweekly band newspaper, the SNOOP, was was again published this year. Under editors Sipe and Emig, with assistance from countless others, the paper remained a great courier of cheer and joy as well as pertinent information for all; a must for Friday afternoon study halls (or classes, if necessary!).

West York's band was honored by being selected to appear in the national yearbook "First Chair of America" which honors outstanding bands and their first chair players. The book was published this fall.

In addition to all this fall activity, the band played at pep rallies and was honored this year by leading the York Halloween parade. After the parade, band members were treated to cider and bar-b-ques by Mr. and Mrs. Donald Fahs. At the close of the season the band once again held a "pot-luck" supper. At the traditional volleyball game, the band was amazingly defeated by the guard. The members of the losing team did their 50 pushups under the close scrutiny of Mr. Toggas, but rumor has it next year's band squad is already hard at work training for the 1969 contest. Look out guard!

With December came the concert season and the annual Christmas Concert featuring both the band and choruses in an afternoon of music for the holiday season. The brass ensemble spent a busy month playing carols for St. Matthew's and St. Paul's churches, the Shiloh Lions Club, the Optimists and a number of other organizations. They also spent a night caroling throughout the community and at several convalescent homes.

Also about this time, West York Band members travelled to Palmyra for the District Band tryouts. West York again topped its own record of 28 with an all time high of 31. In January these people travelled to Northeastern High School for three days of hard work. This year's

guest conductor was Clifton Williams, noted composer and professor of music at the University of Miami. The festival was rewarding to all who participated. Eleven of these musicians were selected for the Regional Band—another band record. They were: Jeff Bamberger, Tim Day, Keith Crone, Steve Nace, Steve Sipe, Greg Smith, Charles Stambaugh, Mary Stitt, Rick Strausbaugh, Dave Winter, and Tom Zemaitis. This festival was held at Hershey High School in March under the baton of George Cavender, Assistant Director of Bands at the University of Michigan. Tim Day, Steve Nace, Charles Stambaugh, and Tom Zemaitis represented the band at the District Orchestra festival held at Cedar Crest High School in February.

The new year also found a new addition to the band office—our pet hamster, Beethoven (incidently Beethoven is really a "she"). Thanks to the untiring efforts of a few notorious bandsmen, our office became fully equipped with almost every convenience imaginable (now, if we can only keep the water from gurgling at night and waking the hamster!) A visit to our band office museum would certainly prove interesting, to say the least.

Another important activity of the season was the induction of new members into the Modern Music Masters, a national musical honor society. The purpose of Tri-M is to foster a greater appreciation of music and to honor the outstanding musicians of the school who have proven themselves worthy of membership on the basis of scholarship, character, cooperation, leadership, and service. The following apprentices were received as members of the society during a formal ceremony conducted at a Band Booster Club meeting: Cindy Albright, Keith Crone, Mike Knight, Steve Kohr, Lois Martin, Steve Nace, Sue Neiser, Steve Sipe, Charles Stambaugh, and Brad Stewart. The group has sponsored several recitals providing an opportunity for members and non-members alike to perform and listen to solo and ensemble literature.

This year's ensemble program is very intense and active. The brass sextet has performed at Chambersburg and Penn State, as well as throughout York. An excellent woodwind quintet has been formed and for the first time in five years a percussion ensemble has made its appearance. They have performed at Spring Grove High School for the ESEA program and for several church and social organizations in the area. The wind ensemble, whose debut is tonight, was created to allow the more experienced players to expose themselves to a greater variety of literature and to read grade V and VI music.

Two band members, Tim Day and Rick Strausbaugh, were selected to participate in an all-eastern band held in conjunction with the MENC convention held in Washington, D.C. The band, conducted by Col. Arnald Gabriel, consisted of 140 students from 12 states making this a real honor for these two fine musicians.

The band was fortunate this year in having Dr. James W. Dunlop, director of the Penn State Blue Band, conduct our band for a rehearsal in February. This is an opportunity few high school bands receive. It not only provided us the chance to see a university band director in action but also to hear his comments of our band and to have the chance to perform under a different director.

The first "pops" concert presented by the band was scheduled in early March. It was an informal affair held in the cafeteria. The purpose of such a concert is to allow the band to perform more in public and also to play some lighter, more popular music. It provides an opportunity for small ensembles to play, too.

Throughout, and in addition to all the other activi-

ties, the band was preparing for its annual Spring Concert. Once again this year, the band features two of its own members as soloists. Tim Day and Steve Sipe, both juniors, have proven their ability by attaining first chair positions at district festivals and participating in a large number of other musical activities. The band has spent an evening with "take-five" Frank Taylor and recording tonight's performance, the band will hold its traditional "make-it-yourself" banana split party (we wonder who can possibly fill the shoes of Mike Ellis to become this year's champion "hog"!).



One of the hardest working groups in the band is the executive committee. They have helped in planning band camp, the pot-luck supper, the banana split party and have helped organize the exchange trip. Our President, Randy Fahs, has often gone beyond the call of duty in serving the needs of the band. In addition, Sue Neiser, the corresponding secretary, has continued the publication of the alumni newsletter, doing a fine job of keeping the "old-folks" informed of the band's activities. Many thanks to Randy, Sue and all the rest of the officers.

The band season does not end with the Spring Conceri. In April, the Penn State Blue Band, with Rick Hoover, a West York graduate, will appear at an assembly for the students of the Senior High School.

The spring tour is the highlight of the season. This year the band will travel to Cedar Grove, N. J., a suburb of New York City, for a three-day trip which will include two concerts and a visit to New York. There the band will attend the Merv Griffin Show, and also see the sights of the "big city." The following week, the Cedar Grove band will be hosted in West York, staying in the homes of band members and students.

The Band Booster Club is again sponsoring and preparing the annual Band Banquet to be held in May. All parents are invited to witness the presentation of awards and the honoring of senior band members as well as our own "special" entertainment. Finishing off this busy year will be the Memorial Day Parade and, of course, commencement.

The band and Mr. Wyand would like to take this opportunity to express their gratitude to the Band Booster Club, the school board, the administration, and all other individuals and organizations who supported the "Bulldog Band" this year. Thanks for helping to make this one of the finest years for instrumental music at West York.




