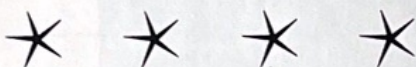

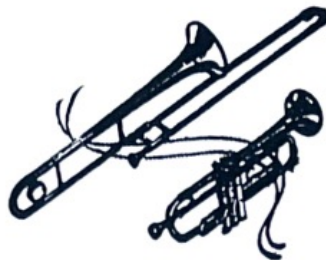

THE INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC BOOSTER CLUB

The Instrumental Music Booster Club was organized in July of 1956. Its purpose is "to arouse and maintain an enthusiastic interest in the various phases of instrumental music in the West York Area Schools." Membership is open to anyone interested in the progress and development of instrumental music in the West York Area Schools.

The officers and members of the club wish to thank the residents of the community for their continued support of the group's activities. Past projects have included the purchase of new uniforms, new instruments and miscellaneous band equipment; sponsorship of the John Philip Sousa Band Award; a \$200.00 music camp scholarship; partial payment of a summer band training encampment; preparation and serving of the annual band banquet; and help in transporting and chaperoning numerous band trips and social functions. Funds for current year's projects have been raised through submarine sandwich sales, refreshment stand at Halloween parade, Y.L.T. theater party, and the annual Spring Concert souvenir program.

The main projects for the current year are to raise funds for the band's appearance at the Mid-East Band Clinic in Pittsburgh, for the Albert Kelly Memorial Summer Camp Scholarships, and for the eleventh annual band training encampment planned for late August, 1970.

ALAN WYAND
Band Director

Alan Wyand, Director of Bands at West York Area High School, was born in State College, Pa. and received his B.S. and M.Ed. degrees in music education from Penn State University.

Since moving to York in 1959, Wyand has attracted state and national attention to the activities of the West York music program through appearances of the band and numerous ensembles. He has appeared as clinician and adjudicator in Maryland, Virginia, and throughout Pennsylvania.

In 1967, Wyand was selected as one of ten high school band directors from the United States to be honored by the SCHOOL MUSICIAN Magazine in its column "They Are Making America Musical." He was further honored by membership in "The Order of the Silver Horn" awarded to "those whose accomplishments in the field of school music are of the highest national standards."

Wyand is a life member of PSEA and NEA, a charter member of NBA, a member of ASBDA, PBA, PMEA, MENC, and the Percussive Arts Society. Honorary societies to his credit include Phi Beta Mu (past president of Nu Chapter), Phi Delta Kappa, and Phi Mu Alpha.

In addition, Wyand is National Editor for Phi Beta Mu and has news articles appearing monthly on a professional journal. He is also a national representative for the School Band of America.

Wyand was a pioneer in the band training camp movement and has a manual published on the justification and organization of such camps.

The 1969-70 West York band season was inaugurated with the important week prior to band camp. This helpful (?) crew of upperclassmen also gave the rookies a taste of "8-to-5" and other basics of marching for a head start at camp.



Band camp proved to be successful as always—both for the marching routines and music, and as a morale booster. Mr. Wyand and his faithful staff kept the rookies and "out of shape" upperclassmen busy for ten hours a day in rehearsals, but we managed to find plenty of time for fun! "Uncle Bud" Schlosser stirred up the poltergeist again this year but we didn't lose a single rookie at the Feast of the Bulldog on the "happiest day of their lives." This year's senior boys from the "Kumquat" cabin dominated activities but unfortunately (for them) lost to the freshmen in

the volleyball competition. They also took second place to cabin 3 when it came to interior decorating. Of course the mighty band all pulled together and soundly defeated the guard in the traditional tug-of-war and in a softball game. (Bud's girls will have to work a little harder next year.) At the end of the week the band could boast of its title of "sharpest band within 100 miles of either bank of the mighty Codorus Creek."

The arrival of football season saw the West York Band active at football games, pep rallies and parades, and of course participating in the numerous Homecoming activities. Who could forget the rumba in our "Bulldog Show" for alumni weekend? Or our "Moon Show"—even if we couldn't have a live parachuter? The combined show with Red Lion was rained out this year but the two bands still assembled for a morning of rehearsals and fellowship. 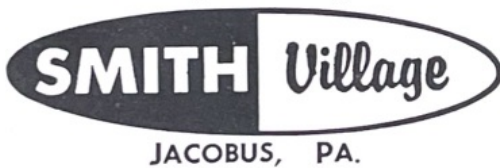

During September the Bulldog Band was in for a number of surprises. Unfortunately for us we lost two of our most outstanding senior musicians. Tim Day, flute, and Jeff Stewart, viola, both received large scholarships to attend Interlochen Arts Academy for the 1969-70 term, and both have won first chair in their respective sections. Over their Christmas vacation, Tim and Jeff performed an excellent recital, and Tim also played a "farewell" recital before he left in September. West York Band extends its best wishes to these two talented musicians in whatever lies ahead for them.

Other honors also came to the band during the fall season. We were selected to appear in the "Who's Who in the Music Field" edition of the national "First Chair of America" yearbook. This yearbook, published every ten years, will appear next fall. The band was also surprised to find itself pictured as "Band of the Month" in the "School Musician" magazine. We were chosen to appear in the March issue of this professional music journal by the American School Band Director's Association.

The band's own newspaper, the SNOOP was again published this year under editors Sipe and Williammee and with assistance from countless others. This weekly paper of gossip and nonsense remained a must to be read in Friday classes. You'd be surprised to see how many teachers look forward to reading the SNOOP too!

Along with all the other fall activities, the band also travelled to Penn State University to participate in the colorful Band Day along with 60 other bands from throughout Pennsylvania. We again marched in the York Halloween parade and afterwards were entertained with fun, food and fellowship at St. James Lutheran Church. At the close of the football season we held our traditional Potluck supper and fun night. In the annual volleyball competition, the guard revenged their losses at band camp by defeating the band and, after a quick chase through the school, the mighty bandmen easily did their 50 push-ups under the watchful eye of Mr. Toggas. Just one more word on that subject—watch out for next year guard!

With the arrival of winter, the band split into two organizations allowing every instrumental musician at West York to participate. The Symphonic Band, which you will hear tonight, is generally composed of the more experienced students. About twenty-five of the younger members comprise the Concert Band which rehearses twice a week under Miss Carolyn Tritt.

In December came the annual Christmas Concert featuring band, strings, and the choruses in an afternoon of music for the holiday season. Also about this time, district band tryouts were upon us and West York Band members travelled to Palmyra for auditions. We did it again—we topped our own record of 31 by having 35 musicians winning chairs and comprising almost 1/5 of the Festival Band. In February these people went to Hempfield High School for three days of hard work under the batons of Mr. Henry Fox, the host, and Mr. Paul Fisher, Director of Bands at Millersville State College. The festival was musically rewarding to all who participated. Another West York Band Record was set by twelve musicians who were selected for Regional Band. They include Mary Stitt, Jan Wecker, Mike Knight, Darby Williammee, Ron Caldwell, Charlie Stambaugh, Gary Albright, Keith Crone, Steve Nace, Steve Sipe, Dave Neiser, and Dave Hershey. This festival was held last week at Pottstown High School and the guest conductor was Mr. Willard Musser of Pottsdam (N.Y.) State University. Sandy Crowl, Mike Knight, Charlie Stambaugh, Steve Nace, and Dave Hershey represented the band at the District Orchestra Festival at Littlestown, and Mike Knight and Dave Hershey will go on to the Regional Orchestra Festival. Our congratulations to each of the talented musicians who represents us.



This year our ensemble program at West York is unusually intense and active. A number of new ensembles have been organized to provide every student who desires it an opportunity to perform with a smaller group. The incentive of being a soloist encourages more students to extend their musical exposure. Our brass Sextet has performed a number of engagements for banquets, churches, and civic organizations, and even had their television debut last month. Mr. Wyand, Mike Knight, and the Sextet were featured on Lou Doolittle's Breakfast Show on WSBA-TV. Their talents were so well received that the woodwind quintet will perform a similar show on April 15. Other active ensembles include a Second Brass Sextet, two flute quartets, and a clarinet choir. dedication. The choir, brass group and organ played an excellent selection of songs ranging from classical to contemporary.

In addition to all the other extra-curricular activities, most of our ensembles have played one or more times in various student recitals. This series of sixteen recitals is held after school and Sunday evenings, and provides an opportunity for band members and non-members alike to perform and listen to solo and ensemble literature. The ensemble series is sponsored by West York's chapter of Tri-M.

An important activity of the season was the induction of new members into the Modern Music Masters, a national musical honor society. The purpose of Tri-M is to honor the outstanding musicians of the school who have proven themselves worthy of membership on the basis of scholarship, character, cooperation, leadership, and service. The following apprentices were received as members during an impressive candlelight initiation ceremony conducted during a Booster Club meeting: Lonnie Campbell, Sue Crowl, Joyce Elsesser, Becky Lieb, Dave Neiser, Mary Stitt, Jan Wecker, and Darby Williammee. Besides sponsoring the student recital Series, this group is tentatively planning a trip to Philadelphia for a concert by the Philadelphia Orchestra.

We must mention the new addition to our band office museum—our mascot guinea pig, Igor. (After the death of our two hamsters, we wanted to get Mr. Wyand a mascot that would last five or six years!). Due to the efforts of this year's crew of "notorious bandsmen," our band office is fully equipped with an easy chair, a radio, and various other items meant to make life easier for Mr. Wyand—and for the rest of us.

Our second annual "Pops" concert was scheduled for February. It was an informal affair held in the cafeteria, and its purpose was two-fold: first, to allow the band to play more in public, and secondly, to play some lighter, more popular music. The "Pops" concert was again a big success and there are more being planned for the future.

The band was fortunate this year in having Dr. James W. Dunlop, director of the Penn State University Blue Band, conduct our band for a rehearsal in February. This opportunity, which few high schools receive, not only provides us with the chance to see a university band director in action, but also to hear his comments of our band and to perform under a different director.

In lieu of exchanging with another high school band this Spring, West York was honored to host the Iowa State University Symphonic Band on an overnight stop of their

extensive Spring tour. Under the direction of Acton Ostling, Jr., this fine university band played a difficult concert of contemporary works written especially for the symphonic band. a.m. of "easy on the onions" and "more salami."?

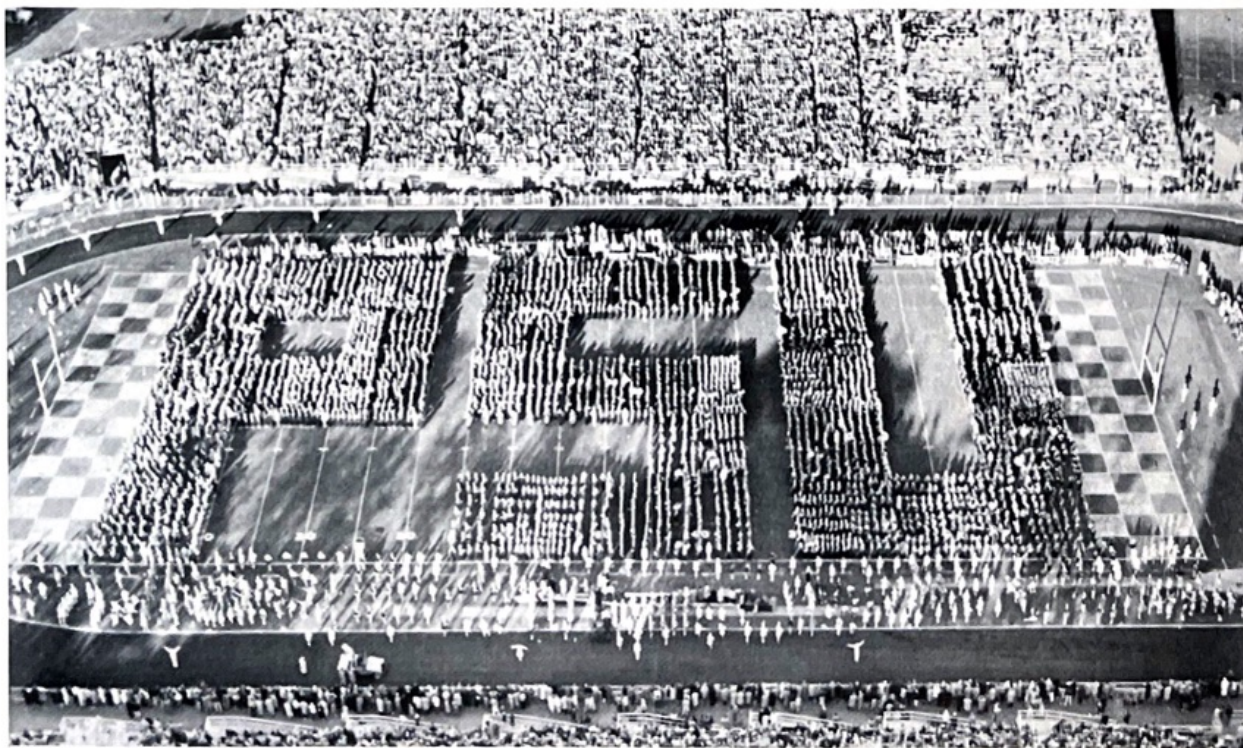

Chapter 821 of the Modern Music Masters, a national music honor society, was formed at West York during the Fall of 1965.

Modern Music Masters does for music what the National Honor Society does for scholarship. With the current emphasis that is given to science, mathematics, and foreign language, Modern Music Masters helps to keep a proper balance between the academic and cultural subjects.

Chief aims of the society are to foster greater interest in band, orchestral, and choral performance, and to provide wider opportunities for personal musical expression. Students are selected for "Tri-M" membership on the basis of musicianship, scholarship, character, cooperation, leadership, and service to the school, church, and community. Prospective candidates must also perform a solo in concert or recital.

Although primarily an honor society, the West York Chapter has sponsored a series of sixteen student recitals and several field trips to hear concerts.

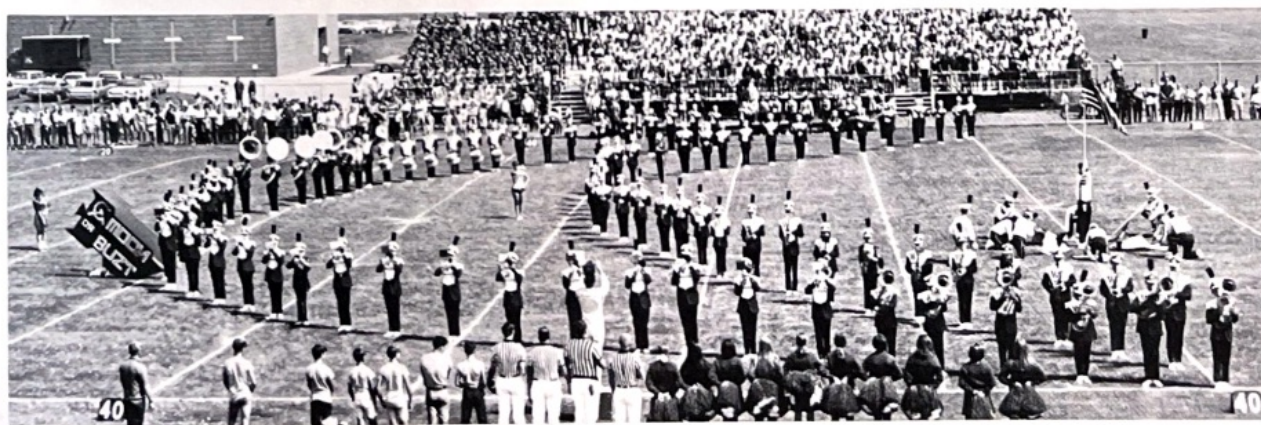

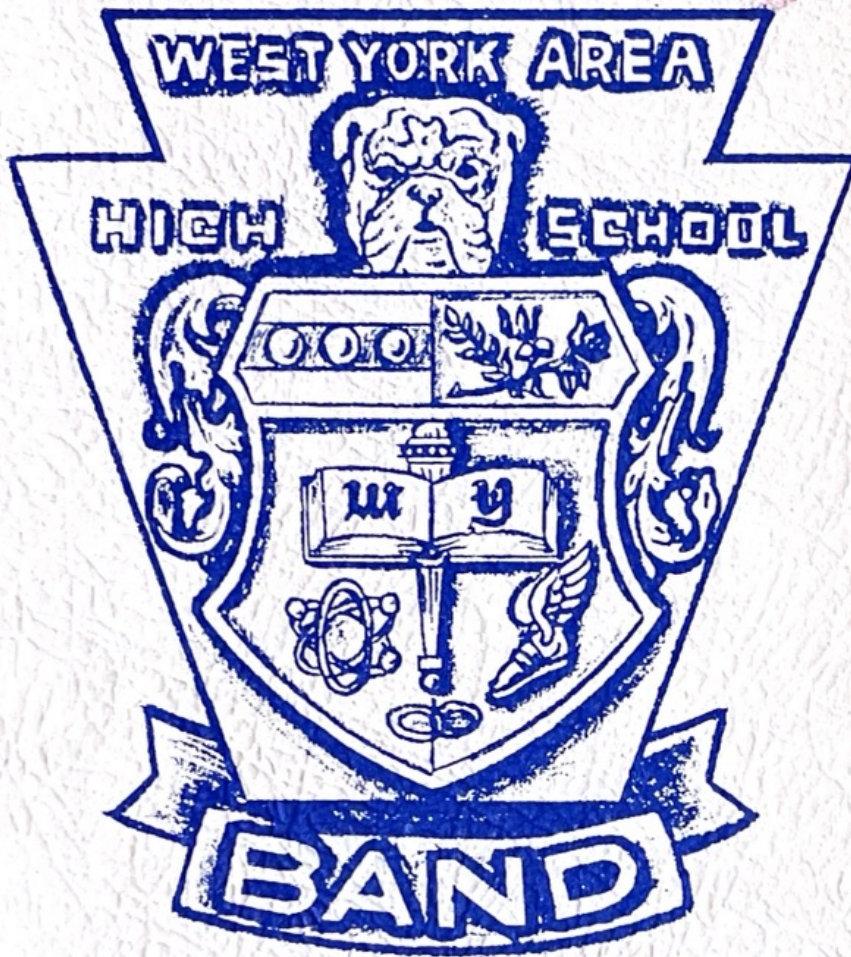
