OUR FEATURED SOLOISTS



PAMELA DONLEY Tympani Soloist

Pamela Donley, percussion soloist, began her musical training in the fifth grade. Since then she has studied all phases of percussion including concert and rudimental snare drum, keyboard instruments, and tympani, the instrument on which she is featured tonight. Formally, she studied this instrument with local percussionist Gene Budesheim.

In addition to serving as section leader for the high school marching and symphonic bands, Pam has also been active in several percussion ensembles, "Snoop" staff, and Modern Music Masters, a national music honor society. Outside school, Pam has been a key member of the Young Person's Chamber Orchestra of York and York Youth Symphony.

In competition, Pam has participated in District Band, Regional Band, District Orchestra, and Regional Orchestra. Last month she was selected to play the tympani for the Regional Chorus.

Upon graduation this June, Pam plans to enter Lock Haven State College with a major in physical education.

MARK TREXLER, MARK LENTZ, STEVEN DART Trombone Trio

Organized primarily for tonight's performance, the Trombone Trio will present a rather unusual selection combining the musical elements of jazz, blues, and a march.

In addition to the high school symphonic and marching bands, all three boys have been active participants in the jazz ensemble and brass ensembles. The boys are also active on the band staff. Steve is currently serving as section leader and is a member of the "Snoop" staff and Mark Lentz is junior class representative.



ABOUT THE BAND

The West York Area High School Band begins each year in mid-August with two weeks of intensive music and marching rehearsals. The first is "Rookie Week", which is used as a crash course in marching technique for new members. "Band Camp" - held this year at Camp Brisson in North East, Maryland - is next, and is important in that all members are orientated and prepared for the fall season. During the fall, the band performs at all home and away football games. Often featured are the Majorettes - under the direction of Mrs. Sandy McNelis - and the all-male "Bulldog" color guard - a consistent winner in parade competition - instructed by Mr. Michael Donnelly. Aside from school functions, the band participates in numerous local parades and occasionally travels outside York to participate in parades.

The Symphonic Band is offered as an elective curricular subject meeting five periods per week for full credit. Of these periods, three are used for sectional rehearsal with student leaders in charge. In addition, many students participate in solo work and small ensembles meeting after school and evenings. A series of student recitals is held to give these students an opportunity to perform and listen to each other.

In addition to concerts presented in the York area, the band also makes an annual Spring Tour and has performed in Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, New York, New Jersey, Ohio, Ontario, Canada and throughout Pennsylvania. On two occasions, they were a feature band at the Mid-East National Band Clinic in Pittsburgh, and in 1973, at the 1st Annual Eastern Band Conductors Conference sponsored by the University of Maryland. Ensembles have performed at clinics and/or concerts at many Pennsylvania colleges, at two PMEA state conventions, with an All State Band, on WGAL and WSBA Television, and for numerous civic and church organizations in the area. Highlighting the band's past activities are a goodwill tour to Mexico City in 1972, and performances at Florida's Disneyworld (1974) and the President's Park at the "Ellipse" in Washington, D. C. (1976). This year the band will participate in a Spring Exchange with Sayville High School, Long Island, New York, April 21-23.


The band has twice been honored by the "First Chair of America" Yearbook - a national non-profit book featuring selected bands from throughout the United States. They have also been featured as "Band of the Month" by both the American School Band Directors Association and Phi Beta Mu National Bandmasters Fraternity in the School Musician Magazine. In 1971, they were selected as one of six high school bands to appear on a nationally-distributed educational recording. In 1970, they were presented a citation from the National Federation of Music Clubs for their premier performance of Vaclav Nelhybel's "Sine Nomine". Most recently the band was seen on the cover of THE SCHOOL MUSICIAN for its participation in various adjudication festivals.

OUR DIRECTOR

Thomas Eyster, director of instrumental music at West York Area High School, is a graduate of West York Area High School. After graduation from high school he attended Susquehanna University, where he received his B. M. degree in Music Education. At college he toured with both the University Symphonic Band and the Jazz Ensemble in Europe and Mexico. He taught in the Upper Darby School District, Delaware County (Pa.) before coming "home" to West York this year.

Mr. Eyster is a member of the P. S. E. A. and N. E. A., National Band Association, the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association, and the Music Educators National Conference.

Other societies to his credit include life memberships to Phi Mu Alpha, professional music fraternity; and Phi Sigma Kappa, national social fraternity.

coming also marked the first band alumni reunion. Approximately fifty alumni attended the game, as guest of the band; a reception, and a dinner party held later that same evening.

Contrary to popular belief a band cannot be successful without proper guidance and supervision. We would like to express our thanks to Drum Major, Pat Brown, Head Majorette, Vicki Frey, and Color Sergeant, Brett Spangler for doing an excellent job.



Special thanks go out to our adult advisors: Sandy McNelis, our overwhelmingly patient Majorette instructor, and Mike Donnelly and Brett Shaffer (Mr. D and Brettski), the "Guardfathers", who once again produced a team of winners. The Color Guard's fantastic season was highlighted once more by a third consecutive victory at the Alsatia Mummers Parade in Hagerstown, Maryland.

Our marching season closed with the annual "Pot Luck Supper". At this festive celebration, one has the opportunity to sample such culinary delights as tuna salad sandwiches, beans, scalloped potatoes, beans, meat loaf, beans, Beans, and more BEANS. This year's traditional athletic competition (volleyball) between the band All-stars and the guard was won by the band when the "girls" (guard) failed to show.



Marching season then gave way to Symphonic Band. It was now time to start worrying about tone quality, intonation, phrasing, and section blend rather than leg lift and pointed toes.

Even though Symphonic band rehearses everyday from 8:00 until 9:00 a.m. (a fast waker-upper) it was difficult to find continuity in our rehearsal schedule due to the four day weeks and a large amount of snow days. But alas, the band pulled things together once again with a lot of extra effort and enthusiasm.

This year's band produced a number of outstanding musicians who were accepted to represent West York at District Band, held January 19-21 at Southwestern High School. Those selected were Pam Donley, Todd Grove, Kathy Knadig, Kathy Miller, Joel Pugh, and Dave Ramer. We were also honored to have Pam Donley chosen to participate in District Orchestra, Regional Band, and Regional Orchestra.

The '77-'78 concert season was kicked off by the annual Christmas Concert, involving the band and the chorus, featuring music for the holiday season. This was to be followed by a Pops Concert, but once again this event had to be cancelled due to the weather. With the weather finally cooperating we set our sights on the Spring Concert and annual Spring Tour.



Along with everything else in the music wing, our ensemble program is also going rather well. This program offers the student a wide variety of musical forms and styles to choose from. He might wish to join a brass choir, a woodwind quintet or a clarinet choir and perform the music of Bach, Beethoven and other great composers; or he could participate in the Jazz Ensemble and play some "heavy jams" by great jazz artists such as Count Basie and Hank Levy. These ensembles also promote an individuals solo performance. The ensembles have performed at various civic organizations, and in our own school, and can be heard at the Art's Festival on May 7th.



Our fund raising projects this year were aimed at raising the necessary \$18,000 needed to cover the purchase of new uniforms and to finance all other band activities. The fund raising was organized by the Booster Club and a student committee. Some of this year's projects included a very successful candle sale, the annual citrus fruit sale, Booster Club night at Oregon Ridge Dinner Theater, and sub sales. Representative Stanford



"Bud" Lehr has also shown his concern by spearheading a fundraising campaign of local business and industry. With his help, we have collected several thousand dollars in donations from the community. A special thanks goes out to Representative Lehr and all others involved in this effort.

Throughout all of our other activities, the band has been preparing for its Annual Spring Concert. Again this year, we are featuring some of our own members as soloists: Pam Donley on tympani and a trombone trio consisting of Steve Dart, Mark Lentz, and Mark Trexler. All of these bandpersons, along with



the rest of the band, have practiced long and hard hours to produce another quality performance. "Take Five" Frank Taylor spent several hours with the band producing a record of tonight's performance. Following the concert, the traditional "do-it-yourself" banana split party will be held at Lincolnway School. Last year the champion "hog" graduated, so we are all greatly anxious to see who will be the new recipient of this coveted title.

Of course, a band year would not be complete without a Spring Tour. This year the "Bulldog" Band travels to Sayville High School, Long Island, New York on the weekend of April 21-23. The Sayville Band will travel to West York from May 5-7. Several activities have been planned in the form of concerts, sight-seeing and recreation, and we hope you will welcome these band members into your homes.



On May 24, the Booster Club will sponsor the Annual Band Banquet held at St. Matthew Lutheran Church. Parents are invited to witness the presentation of awards, the honoring of band seniors, and "special" entertainment.

Finally to finish off another busy year, the band will make its annual appearance in the West York Memorial Day Parade and play at commencement exercises.



The band, along with Mr. Eyster, would like to express their gratitude to the Instrumental Music Booster Club, the School Board and administration and all the other individuals and organizations who supported the Mighty "Bulldog" Band this year. Our thanks for making this one of our greatest years for instrumental music at West York.

BAND STUDENT GOVERNMENT

Because of the increasing size and complexity of the total band program, a need was felt for more student control and committee work. Thus, in January 1960, a system of student government was adopted.


