Chapter 821 of the Modern Music Masters, a national music honor society, was formed at West York during the fall of 1965.

Modern Music Masters does for music what the National Honor Society does for Scholarship. With the current emphasis that is given to science, mathematics, and foreign language, Modern Music Masters helps to keep a proper balance between the academic and cultural subjects.

Chief aims of the society are to foster greater interest in band, choral, and orchestral performance, and to provide wider opportunities for personal musical expression. Students are selected for "Tri-M" membership on the basis of musicianship, scholarship, character, cooperation, leadership, and service to the school, church, and community. Prospective candidates must also perform a solo in concert or recital.

Although primarily an honor society, the West York Chapter has sponsored a series of student recitals and several field trips to hear concerts.

"OUR YEAR IN REVIEW"

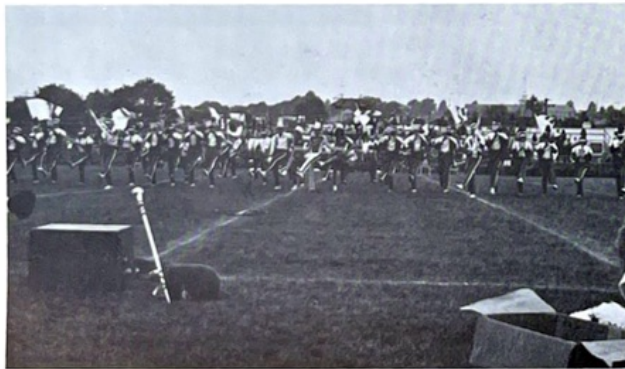

Our 1981-82 band season began with a week of pre-camp preparation where our rookies became familiar with the fundamentals of marching. On the bright clear morning of August 17th, the band members, majorettes and guard joyously loaded the buses in preparation for our excursion to Camp Nawakwa in Arendtsville, Pennsylvania. Much was accomplished during the grueling week of hard work.



We paused from our tedious schedule only for a few moments of fun. Some highlights: a movie entitled "The Night of the Living Dead" in which marauding ghouls paraded through graveyards; and a square dance that everyone dressed up for and danced to the hand-clapping, foot-stomping music. The volleyball and tug-of-war competition sufficiently ended our illustrious stay at Camp Nawakwa. The men-of-jello once again fell to defeat as the bandsmen out-powered them. The majorettes shocked the band females with their strength as they managed to win their battle.

The first football game, on September 5th, occurred one week before the opening of school and was held at Central. The band stunned many crowds with the flute and majorette feature of "Sweet Georgia Brown", the guard feature of "The Battle Hymn of the Republic", the kicking sensation of "New York, New York", and the colorful hit of



"Somewhere Over the Rainbow". These fine performances earned many standing ovations. The band wouldn't have been such a success without the leadership of the adults and students. Drum Major, Chuck Diehl, Head Majorettes, Kim Baker and Lori Herman, and Color Sergeant, Doug Rudisill contributed much to the success of the organization.



The marching band, guard and majorettes were requested to be present for the ribbon cutting ceremonies of Hess's Department Store, in the new West Manchester Mall. On the opening date of October 1st, the band performed in the new Mall and then proceeded to march through the aisles of the store to celebrate its opening.



On October 6th, the opening day for the Bon-Ton, the German Band exhibited its talents to the customers of the newly opened store. Much to the dismay of the store, most customers diligently listened to the oom-pah music of the German Band instead of buying merchandise.

Homecoming, held on October 24th, was a joyous occasion for everyone, especially for Mrs. Jo Myers. The band changed its usual homecoming parade route to perform many uplifting songs in front of the Myers home. Joining



the parade was a first for the Junior High marching band, under the direction of Mr. Dave Winter.



The Halloween parade was a wet event. The band marched the three and a half mile parade in a drizzle of rain.



A smorgasborg of home cooked dishes was available at the Pot Luck Supper which marked the end of the marching band season. The bandsmen and bandswomen were kept busy with volleyball, basketball and knee football.

On November 14th, 1981, the marching band played for a totally different affair — a wedding! Earlier in the year we were asked to play at the wedding of Prince Charles and Lady Diana but we had to settle for the marriage of Mr. Eyster and Miss Orndoff. The band played in the parking lot of San Carlos as the wedding party arrived. The band then presented a punch bowl as a wedding gift to the happy couple.



The flute quartet and the German Band had the opportunity to play for a dedication ceremony. They played for the dedication of the Grace E. Loucks Elementary School on November 15th.

District Band tryouts were held at Cedar Crest High School on December 12th, 1981. Seven members of our band were selected: Heather Chronister, Melinda Hamm, Melinda Heindel, Melissa Heindel, Michelle Heindel, Jody King and Dan Sowers. The district band concerts were held on February 5th and 6th at Dallastown High School. James Steffy, director of music at Susquehanna University and a former director at West York, was the guest director. Some members of our trombone section were selected to play with the Susquehanna University Band at St. Matthew Church. These bandsmen also played under the direction of Mr. Steffy.

During the Christmas season, members of the brass section played Christmas carols at the Bon-Ton, York Mall and West Manchester Mall. The carols were enjoyed by all



of the busy shoppers who stopped to listen to the holiday sounds. The Brass Ensemble also played Christmas carols prior to the annual Christmas concert. This concert featured music of the festive season and sent everyone home with the spirit of the holiday.

West York's Chapter of Modern Music Masters sponsored many recitals this year and inducted new members. These new members are: Heather Chronister, Sue Eyster, Drew Grove, Jody King, Lynne Limbert and Craig Zearfoss. The initiates performed a recital after the candlelight ceremony.

On January 15th, 1982, after many weeks of preparation, the symphonic band traveled to Philadelphia to be the only high school band to perform for the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association (PMEA) conference. The band submitted a tape in April of 1981 and was notified of acceptance in late June of 1981. This was the highest honor ever bestowed upon our band. After our performance, we were presented a plaque for a concert which was very well performed.

After our concert in Philadelphia, the symphonic band had the honor to be the first high school band to perform at the Strand Capital Performing Arts Center. The band played marches, folk dances and Broadway tunes which were received by a standing ovation. The audience also enjoyed listening to a special presentation by the flute and jazz piano ensemble.

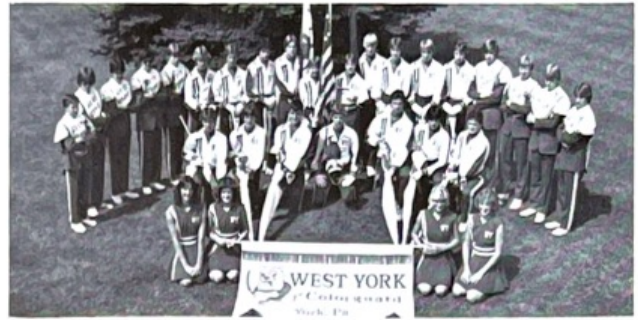
Our first pops concert was held on March 7th, featuring the Symphonic Band. Also performing at this concert were the Jazz Band and the German Band.



On March 11th, Dr. Beckie, the instructor for Woodwinds at Susquehanna University, came to West York to direct the Symphonic Band and to conduct a Woodwind clinic.

The Color Guard and Pad traveled to New York City on March 16th & 17th, to participate in the St. Patrick's Day Parade.

Selected members of the Symphonic Band participated in a pit orchestra for "Fiddler On The Roof", which was enacted by a school for the deaf. They traveled to Model Secondary School for the Deaf in Washington, D.C. on March 25th, to tape the music for the production. During their stay in Washington, they stayed in dorms at the



school. They returned on March 28th, after this educational experience of working and communicating with the deaf.

Beginning on March 3rd, another pit orchestra was organized for the all-school production, "Bye-Bye Birdie". They performed on April 2nd and 3rd, in which the entire show was a hit!

The band has worked many long hours in practicing and perfecting tonight's performance. Featured will be Michelle Heindel as clarinet soloist. After tonight's concert the traditional "do-it-yourself" banana split party will be held to see who will be crowned "Champion Hog".



Late in May, the band will march in the West York Memorial Day Parade and will end the year with a final appearance at the commencement exercises where we will say goodbye to all of our stunning, wonderful, miraculous, stupendous, talented, ever-perfected, prodigious, overwhelming, humble seniors.

The annual band banquet will be held on June 2nd to honor the gifted, brilliantly artistic seniors and to present various awards.

This year the band has been involved in a wide variety of fund raising activities, including sub sales, pizza sales, citrus sales and pie sales.

It is now time to recognize some of the people who have made this year so successful. Those who assisted were the officers, staff and most of all the Instrumental Music Booster Club which has provided enthusiastic support — financial and spiritual — for the many band activities. A special thanks to the parents, the School Board and Administration, the Band Staff, and Mr. Eyster for making this a year of accomplishments.



BAND STUDENT GOVERNMENT

Because of the increasing size and complexity of the total band program, a need was felt for more student control and committee work. Thus, in January 1960, a system of student government was adopted.

Each officer and staff member has assigned duties and obligations which he must perform in order for the band to function smoothly. In addition, the executive council meets at irregular intervals to discuss band policy, plan social activities and work on student committees.

Major projects developed by the council in the past include: the promotion of band jackets and shirts, the adoption of award pins and certificates, and the planning of cultural exchange trips and certain phases of the band training camps.

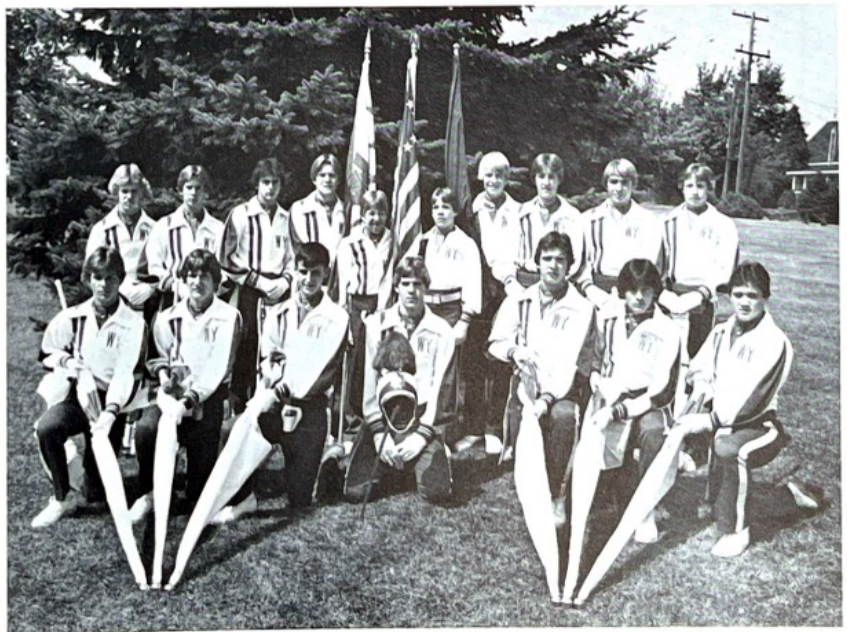

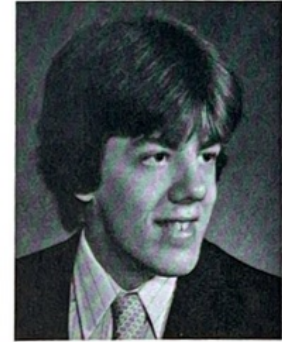




JOHN PHILIP SOUSA AWARD

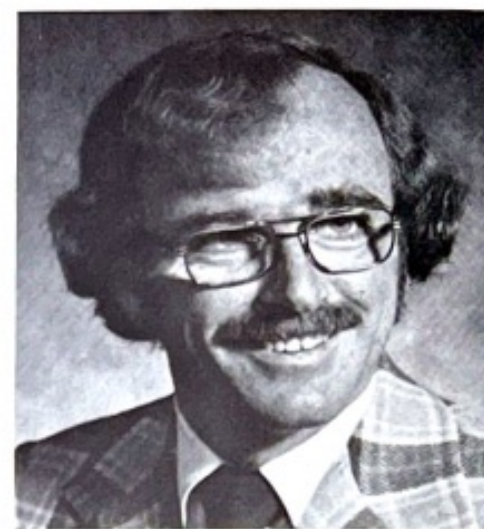
