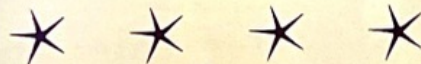

## OUR FEATURED SOLOISTS

### HEATHER CHRONISTER

Oboe Soloist

Heather Chronister, oboe soloist for tonight's concert, has been active in the West York Area School District music program since the fifth grade. In addition to holding "first chair" position in the Symphonic Band since ninth grade, Heather has been an active member of the Woodwind Quintet, Jazz Ensemble, Marching Band and Pit Orchestra. She has also served the band as section leader, secretary/treasurer, class representative, librarian, quarter-master, and historian. During her Junior year Heather was honored with membership in the Modern Music Masters, a National Music Honor Society. Outside school, Heather has been active in the York Youth Symphony, her church bell choir and performing for numerous area churches.

In competition, Heather has won positions in five PMEA District Band and Orchestra Festivals. Most recently she represented West York in the District Seven Band held at Manheim Township High School.

This past summer Heather attended the Pennsylvania Governor's School for the Arts on a full scholarship awarded by the state.

Upon graduation this June, Heather plans to pursue a career in musical instrument repair.



### DANIEL SOWERS

Tuba Soloist

Daniel Sowers, tonight's tuba soloist, has been an active member of the band program since beginning his instrumental training in the West York Area School District music program. In addition to holding the "1st Chair" position in the Symphonic Band, Dan is also tuba section leader, Senior Class Representative, and a member of the German Band, Brass and Jazz ensembles. This year he also served as Drum Major for the Marching Band and was honored with membership in the Modern Music Masters, a National Music Honor Society. Other musical activities Dan participates in include his church orchestra and choir.

In competition, Dan has won positions in four PMEA District Festivals. Most recently he represented West York in the District Seven Band held at Manheim Township High School.

During this past summer Dan attended the Susquehanna University Brass Ensemble Workshop. He attended the camp as a recipient of the camp scholarship sponsored by the Instrumental Music Booster Club.

## ABOUT THE BAND

The West York Area High School Band begins each year with two weeks of intensive music and marching rehearsals. The first week for new members is "Rookie Week", followed by "Band Camp", which was held this year at Camp Nawakwa, Arendtsville, Pa. During the fall, the band performs at home and away football games and for numerous school and civic occasions. Often featured are the Majorettes, coached by Mrs. Wanda Reider, and the all-Male "Bulldog" Color Guard — a consistent winner in Competition — coached by Mr. Michael Donnelly.

The Symphonic Band is offered as an elective curricular subject meeting five periods per week for full credit. Of these periods, three are used for sectional rehearsal with student leaders in charge. In addition, many students participate in solo work and small ensembles, meeting after school and evenings. A series of student recitals is held to give these students an opportunity to perform and listen to each other. A professional recording is made by the Symphonic Band annually of their Spring Concert.

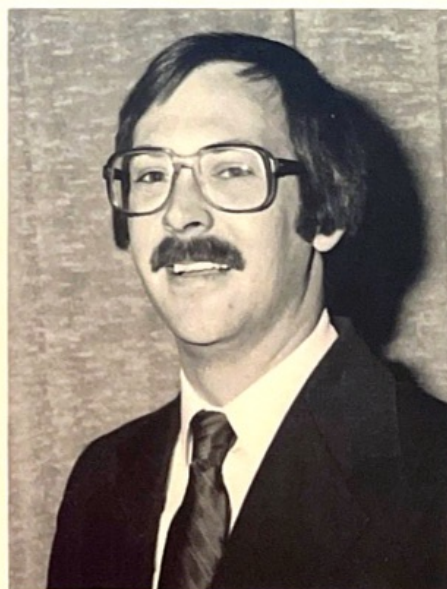
In addition to concerts presented in the York area, the band also makes an annual Spring Tour and has performed throughout Pennsylvania and many other states. Ensembles have performed at clinics and/or concerts at many Pennsylvania Colleges, at two PMEA state conventions, with an All State Band, on Television and for numerous civic and church organizations in the area. Highlighting the band's past activities are performances at Florida's Disneyworld (1974 and 1979), the President's Park at the "Ellipse" in Washington, D.C. (1976) and "Kings Dominion", Virginia (1980), Toronto, Canada (1981). Last year the band was selected to perform for the PMEA State Convention held in Philadelphia and were also the first high school band to present a concert in the Strand-Capital Theater for the Performing Arts. This year the band will travel to Nashville, Tennessee to participate in the "Sounds of America" Music Festival.

## OUR DIRECTOR

Thomas Eyster, Director of instrumental music at West York Area High School, is a graduate of West York Area High School. After graduation from high school he attended Susquehanna University, where he received his B. M. degree in Music Education. At college he toured with both the University Symphonic Band and the Jazz Ensemble in Europe and Mexico. He taught in the Upper Darby School District, Delaware County (Pa.) before coming "home" to West York.

Mr. Eyster is a member of the P. S. E. A. and N. E. A., National Band Association, the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association, the Music Educators National Conference, and the Percussive Arts Society.

Other societies to his credit include life memberships to Phi Mu Alpha, professional music fraternity; and Phi Sigma Kappa, national social fraternity.

Chapter 821 of the Modern Music Masters, a national music honor society, was formed at West York during the fall of 1965.

Modern Music Masters does for music what the National Honor Society does for Scholarship. With the current emphasis that is given to science, mathematics, and foreign language, Modern Music Masters helps to keep a proper balance between the academic and cultural subjects.

Chief aims of the society are to foster greater interest in band, choral, and orchestral performance, and to provide wider opportunities for personal musical expression. Students are selected for "Tri-M" membership on the basis of musicianship, scholarship, character, cooperation, leadership, and service to the school, church, and community. Prospective candidates must also perform a solo in concert or recital.

Although primarily an honor society, the West York Chapter has sponsored a series of student recitals and several field trips to hear concerts.



# "OUR YEAR IN REVIEW"

The Mighty Bulldog Band's 1982-83 season got underway with a week of pre-camp preparation for the "rooks" to learn the rudiments of our marching style, and the paramount importance of such words as "ten-hut", "mark time, mark", and "to the rear, march!" Meanwhile back in the



bandroom, the staff and band officers were busily issuing uniforms and finalizing plans for our annual sojourn to the lush green fields of Camp Nawakwa, located in Arendtsville, Pa.

Wednesday was unquestionably the high point of the week and the "happiest day" of our young rookies' lives as they were affectionately initiated. Thursday evening's festivities were dominated by the traditional "Harmony Hall" competition where cabins vie for assorted

prizes. The title of "winner" was awarded to the incomparable Cabin 7 for its show-stopping rendition of "Nag", jokingly aimed at Mr. E. Friday wrapped up the week with the tug-of-war battle won effortlessly by the mighty bandsmen and bandswomen over the "Men of Jello" and the Majorettes, who fell to the crushing agony of defeat. The stay at Band Camp brought with it a deep feeling of camaraderie which was to be to all bandsmen.



All that work, and after school practices at the rate of two per week paid off as the band sailed through football season. The feeling of "esprit de corps" put that extra sparkle in our show. The crowd raved over our many fine performances, always executed with precision and finesse. Audiences everywhere were left dazzled by the eye-catching opening number, the circus song "Thunder and Blazes". Other favorites included the swanty "Georgia On My Mind" where bandfront members danced their way into the fans' hearts, the expected excellence of the Color Guard featured a patriotic medley; the Majorettes featured "I've Got The Music In Me", and the spectacular, bouyantly colored finale, "Over The Rainbow".



In addition to our pre-game and half-time entertainments, the band also performed in a Pep parade and bonfire at Homecoming, bringing spirit to Bulldog fans. The band also marched in the Halloween Parade on October 31st and the Manchester parade on the 17th of October. Our final show of the marching band season was the November 6th Vo-Tech game, when the band performed a special show created for the combined Junior and Senior High bands. This was also Parents Day when the parents of our seniors escorted their sons and daughters out onto the field.



None of this fantastic season would have been possible if not for the tremendously talented student leaders, Drum Major Dan Sowers, Color Sergeant Craig Forrester, Head Majorette Angie Enterline, and the many dedicated band staff members. Our special "Thanks" to all those who helped everything fall into place in the 1982 Marching Band Season.



Although the Symphonic Band had been in full swing since day 1 of the school year, the band was indoors and striving to rid itself of football-field playing habits. After hard work, the band presented its first "Pops" Concert of the year on November 21st. Featured in this light concert was the Jazz Ensemble, which was a favorite. "Thanks" to the great number of people in attendance, it was a monumental success.

By this time, various band ensembles had been started and some, like the five member German Band, had been playing throughout the community. The Brass Ensemble had the unique and invigorating experience of squeezing onto a pick-up truck and riding around in the dead of the cold and rainy night playing Christmas carols to shut-ins.

Many a band member had his hands full during the month of December, as the all-important District Band tryouts were upon us. December 11th was the critical day. Six members of our band earned coveted seats in Districts, those gifted people being Heather Chronister, Lisa Gilbert, Melinda Hamm, Becky Sowers, Dan Sowers, and Corey Youst. Competition was stiff and everyone who auditioned deserves much credit for the long hours in preparation, and the willingness to undertake such a challenge. All participants showed true musicianship of the highest degree. Special "Congratulations" are in order for Melinda Hamm, who made it to Regional Band.

December also brought the 19th annual Christmas concert, held on December 19th. Christmas was upon us and the Band, Orchestra and Chorus were gearing up for the performance. The concert proved to be an entertaining event for one and all. The throngs of people all headed home with a true spirit of Christmas.

Unfortunately, our first attempt at a February "Pops" Concert was thwarted royally by the record-breaking Blizzard of '83. It was rescheduled for two weeks later and a large number of people turned out to listen and sing to a



wide variety of musical literature. Featured was the Percussion Ensemble.

Student recitals became set after school occurrences. Alumni returned and once again graced the halls of West York with their talent. Members of the band also took part in these recitals.

The District Band Festival was held at Manheim Township this year, from February 17-19th. It was an educational and worthwhile experience.

The band drew together and pitched in to raise several thousand dollars through an extensive fund-raising program. The first of which was an extensive Reeses Peanut Butter Cup sale, where we drew in an impressive amount. Others included a sale of porcelain "Critter Bells", a citrus sale, a pizza sale in February, and a sandwich sale in March. Mr. Eyster gave his little fund-raising band members extra incentive by generously offering pizza parties at Alberto's to the highest selling section. In an effort to have each student share in the responsibility, a student assessment will be another source of funds for our upcoming tour to Nashville, Tennessee this May 19-23rd. We'd like to extend a great deal of praise and gratitude to our community for standing behind us in all our endeavors. We also owe our outstanding Booster Club much commendation for their continued support.

In about a month the band will be packed and en route to Nashville. Many exciting activities have been planned along with the concerts we will be playing. A pool party, a free day in the amusement part Opryland U.S.A., a hayride and a square dance are a few of the highlights we'll be enjoying.

Throughout all its other activities, the band has been feverishly preparing for tonight, our Spring Concert. Heather Chronister, who has an impressive record of musical accomplishments over her nine years of study, will be presenting a solo of her own choosing tonight. After the concert, the band will hold its traditional do-it-yourself banana split party and see if we can crown a new "Champion Hog". The record is currently held by super-hog Greg Wagner, at 21 scoops.

Certain sections went to much trouble to make their ad in tonight's program memorable. The trumpet section, known for lunacy, this year decided to stand in, yes that's IN, the fountains at the West Manchester Mall. No other section got quite as off-the-wall this year.



The year will be drawing to a close with the Band Banquet at the Dover Fire Hall on May 25th. Seniors will be honored and presented with awards at this time.



The band will once again perform in the West York Memorial Day Parade and will finish up the year by playing at Commencement, where we will say "goodbye" to all the unique seniors.

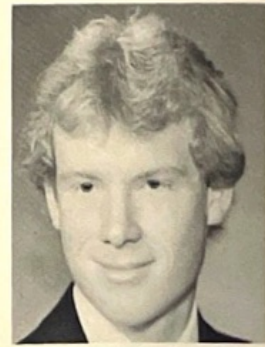
## ALBERT KELLY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP
