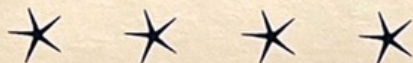

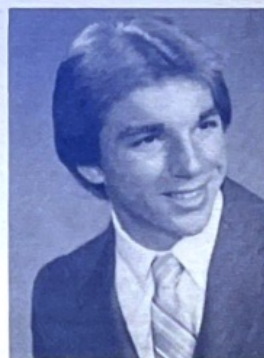

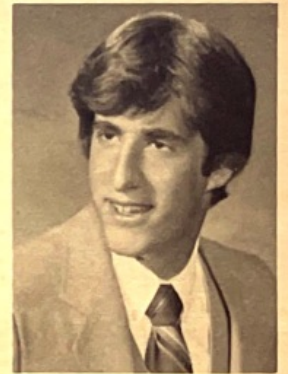

Chapter 821 of the Modern Music Masters, a national music honor society, was formed at West York during the fall of 1965.

Modern Music Masters does for music what the National Honor Society does for Scholarship. With the current emphasis that is given to science, mathematics, and foreign language, Modern Music Masters helps to keep a proper balance between the academic and cultural subjects.

Chief aims of the society are to foster greater interest in band, choral, and orchestral performance, and to provide wider opportunities for personal musical expression. Students are selected for "Tri-M" membership on the basis of musicianship, scholarship, character, cooperation, leadership, and service to the school, church, and community. Prospective candidates must also perform a solo in concert or recital.

Although primarily an honor society, the West York Chapter has sponsored a series of student recitals and several field trips to hear concerts.

Marching drills, mastery of the music, and memorization of the halftime show took the greatest chunk of the week. We salvaged our fun and games from remaining hours, few as they were. Monday



night featured "The Sentinel", a film that went beyond horror. Special thanks are in order for Matt Fuhrman, since he showed truly sick taste by choosing the flick, which was an undisputed success! Tuesday brought a hypnotist to camp, and the evening Mr. Bowers provided revealed strange and unseen sides of those brave enough to "go under". Rooks found Wednesday to be the "happiest day of their lives" and won't soon forget the night that followed! Everyone's favorite sax symbol, Buddy Haynes, was crowned Miss Nawakwa by reigning queen Greg

Friday saw an unprecedented upset with the "Men of Jello" beating the bandsmen in a highly unusual tug-of-war. To the staff's surprise, the men of Cabin 2 walloped them in the annual volleyball olympiad. And to top it all off, seniors pitched in to throw the staff into the spring-water-fed pool. We later tossed each other in as well, and the bus ride back was soggy indeed!

We had little time to recuperate from the rigors of Band Camp, as we had the opportunity to play on the Grandstand at the Fairgrounds the day after our return. It was in



honor of the "World's Largest Bingo Game" and the large crowd was very receptive to our repertoire of marching-band goodies we played. The day was a prelude to the rest of our highly successful marching band season.

Anxious to start the season, band members knew that band camp was over soon, but not soon enough. The first show at the Dover football game on Sept. 3rd came off without a hitch, and the always amazing sights and sound of the West York Band, Colorguard and Majorettes continued to WOW audiences throughout the winning season. Our hours upon hours of grueling practice paid off, as seen in our performances of "Eye of The Tiger", and the Guard's showstopper, a patriotic feature including "Gallant Men", "West Point March" and "This is My Country". For a little variety in the show, we added a piece that featured a Dixie-



land combo out in front, called "Waiting for the Robert E. Lee". Crowds delighted in the flashy and fancy footwork of bandfront members and in the screaming trumpets of "Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy". The show closed on a soft note with the theme from the movie "Ice Castles".

One event that will make this season stand out above others was our chance to appear on PM Magazine. On near-alarmingly short notice, we were commissioned to come up with a new formation and play for the fiftieth birthday of Mickey Mouse to be shown on the popular TV



program several weeks later on November 18th. It was a chance for us to become acquainted with the filming of a television show and be lucky enough to be part of it.

All the fine performances of the '83 football season wouldn't have been possible without adult and student leadership. In addition to the incredible energy devoted by the staff, Drum Major Craig Jacoby, Head Majorette Tammy Crone, and Color Sergeant Craig Forrester contributed immeasurably to the good of the organization.

Our appearance in the Manchester and York Halloween parades, and the Potluck supper signaled the end of our 83-84 marching band season. Band members kept busy with the smorgasbord of home cooked dishes and with Frisbee and basketball in the gym afterwards.

The Bulldog Guard and P.A.D. were again active in parade competitions this year, one of the most prestigious



being their ninth consecutive first place in the Hagerstown parade. Also added to the Guard and P.A.D. schedule was their appearance in the St. Patrick's Day parade in New York City in March. We all felt extremely proud of the band

"family" for their outstanding performances. We'd like to again thank Mr. Eyster, Mr. Donnelly, and Mrs. Reider and the countless others, especially the parents, who made the pieces of this terrific season fall together. The key was always PRIDE.

We played our first performance of the symphonic season on November 20th, 1983. The Pops concert was a light and enjoyable way to pass an afternoon, and included a variety of musical literature. The concert also gave the Jazz Band and the Orchestra a chance to display their music abilities.

The annual Christmas concert on December 18th was another success and featured an especially ambitious and quite beautiful piece entitled "A Christmas Intrada", a richly woven tapestry of Old-World carols. No one went home without the Christmas spirit.

The Christmas concert wasn't the only thing that occupied band members in December. The day had come for District Band tryouts on the 11th. Though musicians had



the solo for months in advance, practice grew fervent in the weeks just prior to the tryout date. Jennifer Curtis, Melinda Hamm, Becky Sowers and Corey Youst were selected, and they certainly deserved it! Extra congratulations go out to Melinda, who was also selected to Regional Band this year. The District Festival was held at the Strand Capitol this year as opposed to a high school, which is usually the case. The performances reflected true dedication and a commitment to musicianship.

Every member of the West York Band got to play on the Strand's stage on February 12th, for our second Pops concert of the year. And again, the concert was a smash hit in addition to being a thrill for us band members. We'd like to thank Ellen Harbold for acting as narrator for the concert (with the help of our favorite technician Dino!)





In addition to Symphonic Band, many of our band members join an ensemble. The brass ensemble, jazz band, flute ensemble, clarinet choir and percussion ensemble are examples of such ensembles. The groups meet either after school or in evening hours. Many of our ensembles have performed in student recitals sponsored by the West York chapter or Modern Music Masters, better known as Tri-M, a National Music Honor Society. Many of the ensembles have played at different spots around the community, such as the German Band who played at the West Manchester Mall, and the Jazz Band which has a tradition of playing at the Box Lunch Revue, an annual spring event held at Cherry Lane in downtown York.



Tonight's concert, appropriately entitled, "Extravaganza Internationale", will unfurl for you a spectacular selection of international musical literature and will move and affect you as it has done for its performers. garb and participate in the Memorial Day parade. The annual band banquet where we honor the extravagant, unique, accomplished, immensely talented and humble seniors will tie up the year on May 30th. The band, minus seniors of course, will also play in the commencement ceremonies.

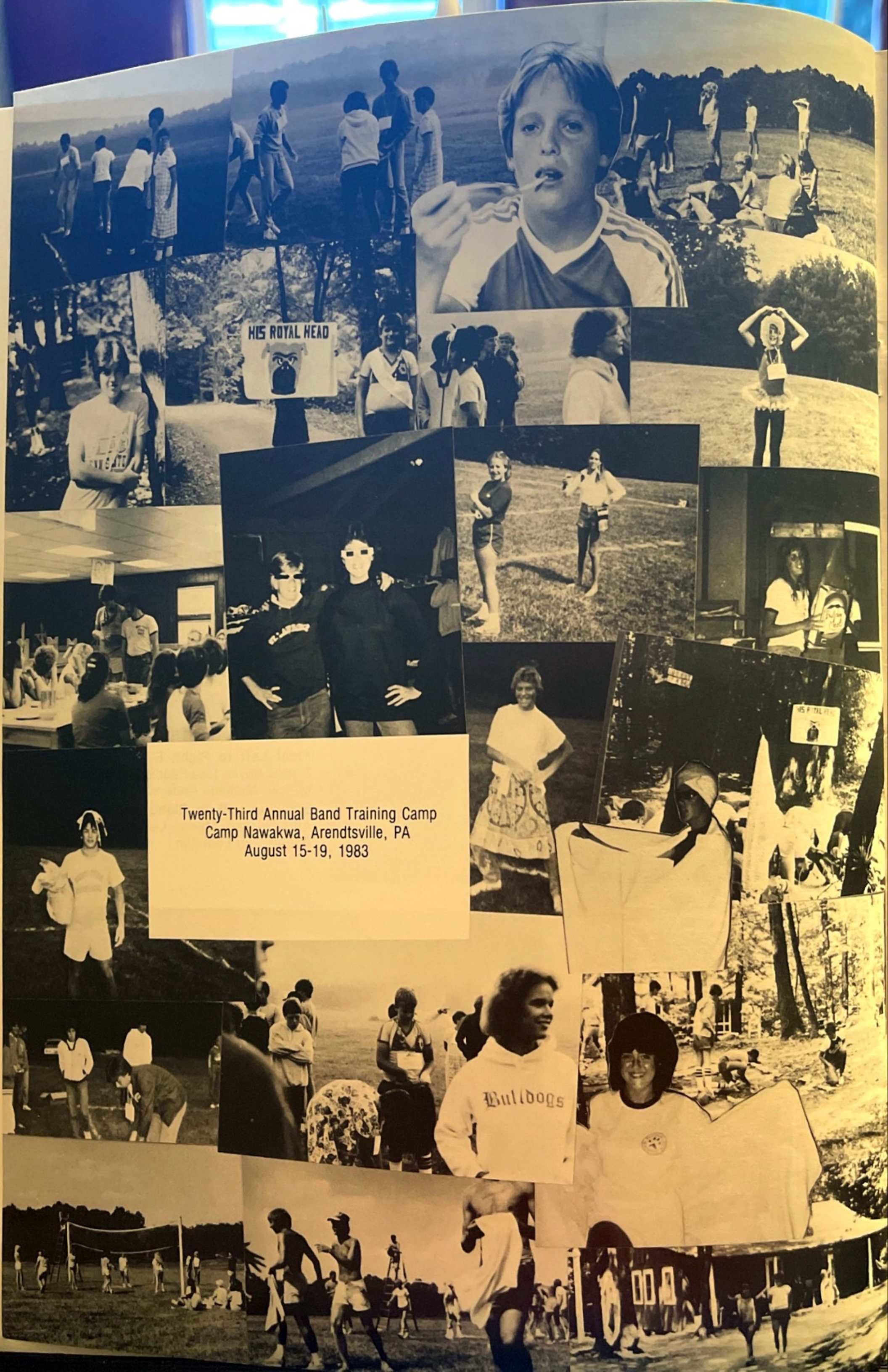
