Upon graduation this June, Ann will attend James Madison University where she will major in magazine journalism.

DONALD GERHART

Xylophone Soloist

Donald "Chip" Gerhart, tonight's xylophone soloist, has been an active member of the band program since beginning his instrumental training in the West York Area School District music program at the age of nine. In addition to being "first chair" in the Symphonic Band, Chip is also percussion section leader and an active member of the Jazz Ensemble and Marching Band. He is current-



ly Band President and has also served the band as "Snoop" editor and staff member. Last year he was a co-recipient of the "Band Personality Award." Outside of school, Chip has performed with the Harrisburg and York Symphony orchestras, York College Brass and Percussion Ensemble and for "First Night York."

Upon graduation this year, Chip plans to attend the University of Pittsburgh where he will major in pharmacy.

ABOUT THE BAND

The West York Area High School Band begins each year with two weeks of intensive music and marching rehearsals. The first week for new members is "Rookie week", followed by "Band Camp", which was held this year at Camp Ramblewood, Darlington, Md. During the fall, the band performs at home and away football games and for numerous school and civic occasions. Often featured are the Majorettes, coached by Mrs. Wanda Reider, and the all-male "Bulldog" Color Guard - a consistent winner in competition - coached by Mr. Michael Donnelly.

The Symphonic Band is offered as an elective curricular subject, meeting five periods per week for full credit. Of these periods, several are used for sectional rehearsal with student leaders in charge. In addition, many students participate in solo work and small ensembles, meeting after school and evenings. A series of student recitals is held to give these students an opportunity to perform and listen to each other.

In addition to concerts presented in the York area, the band also travels frequently and has performed throughout Pennsylvania and many other states and Canada. Ensembles have performed at clinics and/or concerts at many Pennsylvania colleges, the PMEA State Convention, on television, the State Capitol in Harrisburg, and for numerous civic and church organizations in the area. Highlighting the band's past activities are performances in Mexico City (1972), Disneyworld (1974 & 1979), Nashville, Tennessee (1983), Toronto, Canada (1981 & 1990), Boston, Massachussetts (1984 & 1988). The band has also performed at the Mid-East Band Clinic in Pittsburgh, the Eastern Band Conductors Conference and has twice been selected to perform for the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association State Conference (1982 & 1989). This spring the band will travel to Washington D.C. to participate in the National Adjudicators Invitational Band Festival.

OUR DIRECTOR


Thomas Eyster, Director of Instrumental Music at West York Area High School and Music Department Chairman for the West York Area School District, is a graduate of West York Area High School. After graduation from high school, he attended Susquehanna University, where he received his B.M. degree in Music Education. In college he toured with both the University Symphonic Band and the Jazz and Brass Ensembles in Europe and Mexico. He has done graduate study at Peabody Conservatory of Music and Loyola College of Maryland. He taught in the Upper Darby School District, Delaware County (Pa.) before coming "home" to West York in 1977.

In addition to his duties at West York, Mr. Eyster has also served as an adjudicator and clinician in Pennsylvania and Maryland. In 1989, he was awarded a "Citation of Excellence" by the National Band Association for outstanding contributions to concert bands and band music.

Mr. Eyster is a member of the P.S.E.A. and N.E.A., the National Band Association, Pennsylvania Music Educators Association, the Music Educators National Conference, and the National School Orchestra Association.

Other societies to his credit include life memberships to Phi Mu Alpha, professional music fraternity and Phi Sigma Kappa, national social fraternity.

During the summer of 1985, Mr. Eyster was a staff member of the Pennsylvania Ambassadors of Music for a European concert tour.



Chapter 821 of the Modern Music Masters, a national music honor society, was formed at West York during the fall of 1965.

Modern Music Masters does for music what the National Honor Society does for Scholarship. With the current emphasis that is given to science, mathematics, and foreign language, Modern Music Masters helps to keep a proper balance between the academic and cultural subjects.

Chief aims of the society are to foster greater interest in band, choral and orchestral performance, and to provide wider opportunities for personal musical expression. Students are selected for "Tri-M" membership on the basis of musicianship, scholarship, character, cooperation, leadership, and service to the school, church, and community. Prospective candidates must also perform a solo in concert or recital.

Although primarily an honor society, the West York Chapter has sponsored a series of student recitals and several field trips to hear concerts.

As always, the entire music department combined in a Christmas spectacular to ring in the holidays. The December 16 concert had everyone joyously humming their favorite carol as they returned home.

During the course of fall and winter, members of Tri-M organized several student recitals, which featured soloists from choir and band, as well as various ensembles. These groups, including German Band, Woodwind Quintet, Flute Ensemble, Brass Ensemble, and Jazz Band, are often student-led and perform in and outside of school. At the end of October, Jazz Band members had a special treat, as professional sax player Christopher Hollyday held a private recital and clinic to teach skills and techniques.



These recitals carried us through the winter, and brought us to our February "Pops" Concert, which this time was held in the auditorium and also featured the Elementary and Junior High Bands.

Two weeks later, on Sunday, February 24, there was an evening recital to induct the new members of Tri-M Music Honor Society. President Ann Henry and Vice President Maria Hayner provided information about the group and administered the Tri-M oath after an enjoyable concert performed by various soloists and ensembles.

Most of our hard work, however, has one main focus; our presentation this evening. We hope to paint for you an "American Portrait;" colored by medleys which represent the unchanging ideals of American culture, past, present and future.

For your entertainment tonight we have two soloists. First in the program is Ann Henry, a talented clarinetist with a long list of credits to her name. Secondly, a xylophone solo by band president, Donald "Chip" Gerhart. Both are seniors who have spent their high school careers working diligently on grades, music, leadership, extracurriculars, and a good reputations among their peers. Please, toss your cares to the wind and enjoy this evening's presentation.

After tonight's formal concert, band members will be up to their crazy antics, vying for "champion hog" at our annual banana split party and staying out 'til the wee hours of the morning bowling at Lincolnway Lanes.

After tonight, though, we will return to business as usual, preparing for our spring tour, May 3-5. This year's tour takes us to the National Adjudicators Invitational Band Festival in Washington, D.C. Only 200 bands across the United States are nominated and invited to participate in the NAI. Highlights of the tour will include adjudication of our band by a panel of nationally known music educators, a concert for a school in Baltimore County, Maryland, and sightseeing at the various monuments and museums in our nation's capital.

Along with our regular fundraisers (peanut butter cups, citrus fruit, and sandwiches) we sold York County Consumer Discount cards, and pizzas for a change of pace. None of this would be possible if not for the tireless efforts of the Instrumental Music Booster Club.













BAND STUDENT GOVERNMENT

Because of increasing size and complexity of the total band program, a need was felt for more student control and committee work. Thus, in January 1960, a system of student government was adopted.

ALBERT KELLY MEMORIAL SUMMER CAMP SCHOLARSHIP


