ABOUT THE BAND

The West York Area High School Band begins each year with two weeks of intensive music and marching rehearsals. The first week for new members is "Rookie week", followed by "Band Camp", which was held this year at Camp Ramblewood, Darlington, Md. During the fall, the band performs at home and away football games and for numerous school and civic occasions. Often featured are the Majorettes, casched by Mrs. Wanda Reider, and the all-male "Bulldog" Color Guard - a consistent winner in competition occasions.

The Symphonic Band is offered as an elective curricular subject, meeting five periods per week for full credit. Of these periods, several are used for sectional rehearsal with student leaders in charge. In addition, many students participate in solo work and small ensembles, meeting after school and evenings. A series of student recitals is held to give these students an opportunity to perform and listen to each other.

In addition to concerts presented in the York area, the band also travels frequently and has performed throughout Pennsylvania and many other states and Canada. Ensembles have performed at clinics and/or concerts at many Pennsylvania colleges, the PMEA State Convention, on television, the State Capitol in Harrisburg, and for numerous civic and church organizations in the area. Highlighting the band's past activities are performances in Mexico City (1972), Disneyworld (1974 & 1979), Nashville, Tennessee (1983), Toronto, Canada (1981 & 1990), Boston, Massachussetts (1984 & 1988). The band has also performed at the Mid-East Band Clinic in Pittsburgh, the Eastern Band Conductors Conference and has twice been selected to perform for the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association State Conference (1982 & 1989). This spring the band will travel to Bermuda to participate in the International Music Festival "Bermuda Music Festival".

OUR DIRECTOR


Thomas Eyster, Director of Instrumental Music at West York Area High School and Music Department Chairman for the West York Area School District, is a graduate of West York Area High School. After graduation from high school, he attended Susquehanna University, where he received his B.M. degree in Music Education. In college he toured with both the University Symphonic Band and the Jazz and Brass Ensembles in Europe and Mexico. He has done graduate study at Peabody Conservatory of Music and Loyola College of Maryland. He taught in the Upper Darby School District, Delaware County (Pa.) before coming "home" to West York in 1977.

In addition to his duties at West York, Mr. Eyster has also served as an adjudicator and clinician in Pennsylvania and Maryland. In 1989, he was awarded a "Citation of Excellence" by the National Band Association for outstanding contributions to concert bands and band music.

Mr. Eyster is a member of the P.S.E.A. and N.E.A., the National Band Association, Pennsylvania Music Educators Association, the Music Educators National Conference, and the National School Orchestra Association.

Other societies to his credit include life memberships to Phi Mu Alpha, professional music fraternity and Phi Sigma Kappa, national social fraternity.

During the summer of 1985, Mr. Eyster was a staff member of the Pennsylvania Ambassadors of Music for a European concert tour. Mr. Eyster is looking forward to being a staff member again this coming summer.



TRI-M MUSIC HONOR SOCIETY

Chapter 821 of the Modern Music Masters, a national music honor society, was formed at West York during the fall of 1965.

Modern Music Masters does for music what the National Honor Society does for Scholarship. With the current emphasis that is given to science, mathematics, and foreign language, Modern Music Masters helps to keep a proper balance between the academic and cultural subjects.

Chief aims of the society are to foster greater interest in band, choral and orchestral performance, and to provide wider opportunities for personal musical expression. Students are selected for "Tri-M" membership on the basis of musicianship, scholarship, character, cooperation, leadership, and service to the school, church, and community. Prospective candidates must also perform a solo in concert or recital.

Although primarily an honor society, the West York Chapter has sponsored a series of student recitals and several field trips to hear concerts.

"Congratulations" to everyone who worked hard on the district concert on February 6, 7, and 8. Of those eight, Jason Slobozien and Rebecca Trimmer went on to the Regional Band.

December brought many different things to the West York Band. The brass ensemble journeyed to locations all over York County to spread Christmas cheer through their assortment of Christmas carols. The West York Christmas Concert was held on December 15. The band added to the Christmas fever that was already starting to build throughout the community with "The Christmas Song" and the ever-popular "Sleigh Ride".

Our second "Pops" Concert was held on February 9 this year. At this concert the elementary school band and the junior high band performed with the senior high concert band and the Jazz Ensemble. We saluted the 1992 Olympics with "Bugler's Dream" and "Olympic Fanfare and Theme". We played several other songs which included a toe-tapping medley of 50's hits called "Classic Rock and Roll".

The words "fundraiser" and "Bermuda" were commonly heard throughout the band hall. The quota system of selling was installed this year in hopes of improving our chances at attaining our monetary goal. In order to bask in the sun in April when everyone else is studying, we all had to ask our family, friends, neighbors, and even a few strangers to buy our sandwiches, pies, candy, and fruit.

at 9:00 a.m. Two days later on the 27 of May, the entire band and band front will be recognized at the annual Band Banquet.

On June 5 the seniors are again exused from performance as the concert band performs for its last time until next fall. The band will be heard playing, among other songs, "Pomp and Circumstance" at the 1992 graduation scheduled to be held on the football field.

As this is my last year, I would like to send out a big heart felt "Thank You" to all the bandstaff and band parents who have volunteered the past four years to make my senior high band career a joy!













BAND STUDENT GOVERNMENT


