ABOUT THE BAND

The West York Area High School Band begins each year with two weeks of intensive music and marching rehearsals. The first week for new members is "Rookie week", followed by "Band Camp", which was held this year at Camp Ramblewood, Darlington, Md. During the fall, the band performs at home and away football games and for numerous school and civic occasions. Often featured are the Majorettes, coached by Mrs. Wanda Reider, and the all-male "Bulldog" Color Guard - a consistent winner in competition - coordinated by Mr. Rick Worley.

The Symphonic Band is offered as an elective curricular subject, meeting five periods per week for full credit. Of these periods, several are used for sectional rehearsal with student leaders in charge. In addition, many students participate in solo work and small ensembles, meeting after school and evenings. A series of student recitals is held to give these students an opportunity to perform and listen to each other.

In addition to concerts presented in the York area, the band also travels frequently and has performed throughout Pennsylvania and many other states and Canada. Ensembles have performed at clinics and/or concerts at many Pennsylvania colleges, the PMEA State Convention, on television, the State Capitol in Harrisburg, and for numerous civic and church organizations in the area. Highlighting the band's past activities are performances in Mexico City (1972), Disneyworld (1974 & 1979), Nashville, Tennessee (1983), Toronto, Canada (1981 & 1990), Boston, Massachusetts (1984 & 1988) and Bermuda (1992). The band has also performed at the Mid-East Band Clinic in Pittsburgh, the Eastern Band Conductors Conference and has twice been selected to perform for the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association State Conference (1982 & 1989).

OUR DIRECTOR

Thomas Eyster, Director of Instrumental Music at West York Area High School, is a graduate of West York Area High School. After graduation from high school, he attended Susquehanna University, where he received his B.M. degree in Music Education. In college he toured with both the University Symphonic Band and the Jazz and Brass Ensembles in Europe and Mexico. He has done graduate study at Peabody Conservatory of Music, Duquesne University and Loyola College of Maryland. He taught in the Upper Darby School District, Delaware County (Pa.) before coming "home" to West York in 1977.

In addition to his duties at West York, Mr. Eyster has also served as an adjudicator and clinician in Pennsylvania and Maryland. In 1989, he was awarded a "Citation of Excellence" by the National Band Association for outstanding contributions to concert bands and band music.

Mr. Eyster is a member of the P.S.E.A. and N.E.A., the National Band Association, Pennsylvania Music Educators Association, the Music Educators National Conference, and the National School Orchestra Association.

Other societies to his credit include life memberships to Phi Mu Alpha, professional music fraternity Phi Sigma Kappa, national social fraternity, and Phi Beta Mu, a national bandmaster fraternity.

During the summers of 1985 and 1992, Mr. Eyster was a staff member of the Pennsylvania Ambassadors of Music for a European concert tour.

Chapter 821 of the Modern Music Masters, a national music honor society, was formed at West York during the fall of 1965. Modern Music Masters does for music what the National Honor Society does for Scholarship. With the current emphasis that is given to science, mathematics, and foreign language, Modern Music Masters helps to keep a proper balance between the academic and cultural subjects.

Chief aims of the society are to foster greater interest in band, choral and orchestral performance, and to provide wider opportunities for personal musical expression. Students are selected for "Tri-M" membership on the basis of musicianship, scholarship, character, cooperation, leadership, and service to the school, church, and community. Prospective candidates must also perform a solo in concert or recital.

Although primarily an honor society, the West York Chapter has sponsored a series of student recitals and several field trips to hear concerts.

"OUR YEAR IN REVIEW"

The Mighty Bulldog Band kicked off the 1994-1995 season the week of August 8 - 12 in the traditional fashion with band staff members involved in the distribution of uniforms and music, and finalizing plans for our annual band camp. Next we held "Rookie Orientation", where all of our newest members were instructed in the basics of marching.

Seasoned upperclassmen and rookies alike eagerly boarded buses on Sunday, August 21 and bid good-bye to Mom and Dad till Friday, August 26 as we set out for our beloved Camp Ramblewood in Darlington, Maryland. Marching drills, mastery of music and memorization of the half-time show took up the majority of our time but we did manage to salvage our fun and games from the remaining hours, few as they were.

We had very little time to recuperate from the rigors of band camp, as school began the following week and so did our fall marching season with our first field show at the Dover football game on September 3rd. This performance set the tone for the rest of the season as the amazing sights and sounds of the "Bulldog" Band, Colorguard, and Majorettes continued to wow audiences throughout the season with our "Gospel" show. Our hours upon hours of grueling practice paid off, as seen in our performances of "Shine Down", the Majorette feature in "Swingin' Chariots" and our patriotic finale "God of Our Fathers" featuring the precision of the Colorguard. Other highlights of the season included the Red Lion Sound Spectacular, the Manchester parade and the York Halloween parade followed by a "ghoulish" party presented by the Band Booster Club.

The marching season went on for the Guard and P.A.D. who participated in the legendary Hagerstown parade, where they placed first (of course!). They also made appearances throughout the year in Dillsburg, Harrisburg, and twice in Baltimore. This year the Guard also made a guest appearance at the Miss York County Pageant and presented an indoor exhibition at Red Land High School and the junior high school.

All the fine performances of the 1994-1995 marching season would not have been possible without adult and student leadership. Drum Major Yanna Kouvatsos, Head Majorette Angie Worley, and Color Sergeant Tony Capertino contributed to our excellence as did our adult staff, Mrs. Reider, Mr. Worley, Derek Warnke, Dustin Sechrist, and Mark Trostle. We would also like to thank our student teacher from Penn State, Mr. Hoffman for his contributions during the fall. Finally, a thank you to parents Don Weaver and Rob Runk for towing our brand new 26 foot trailer purchased by the school board to transport our

We quickly jumped into our concert season with our first "pops" concert on November 13. This year a new approach was taken with this concert as the band presented a program of Italian music and a spaghetti dinner was served following the performance.

December was a busy month for the band. We held our annual citrus fruit sale, which was once again a success. The Brass Ensemble was busy spreading pre-Christmas cheer at numerous events in the community. December also brought District Band tryouts and once again a healthy contingent of West York band members tried out. Congratulations to all who gave their best shot at tryouts and extra congratulations to senior Noelle Van Laeys who represented us at the District Band Festival held at Central York High School under the direction of Dr. Pat Rooney from James Madison University in February.

The band, along with the choir, got everyone into the holiday spirit with our annual holiday concert on December 18. With such songs as "Greensleeves" and "The Most Wonderful Time of The Year", who could help but catch the spirit of the season.

Before we knew it our second "pops" concert popped up on February 12. The concert also featured the elementary and junior high school bands and was well received.

January and February have been normally "quiet" months for the band members but this year our music wing was buzzing with activity during this time as we prepared to present the musical L'il Abner, the school's first in eleven years. Many of the band members were actively involved in this production as cast members, "pit" members, or stage crew. Their hard work paid off with excellent performances on March 3 and 4. Plans are already underway for next year's production.

March 10 brought us our second annual "Night With The West York Jazz Ensemble" concert. This event is proving to be very popular as once again the program was performed to a full house in our cafeteria which was transformed into a "night club" setting through the efforts of the jazz ensemble parents. The audience was not only treated to an evening of good music but also to some wonderful "goodies" which were prepared by the parents. The jazz ensemble wrapped up the month of March by earning a superior rating at the Susquehannock High School Jazz Festival on March 31.

Our fund raising was again spearheaded by the Instrumental Music Booster Club. In addition to our traditional citrus fruit sale, other projects included sandwich sales,

cheesecake sale, the refreshment stand at home football games, and a "Bulldog" carpet raffle. Monies earned from these sales support a variety of band social activities, awards, scholarships, equipment and trips.

Throughout all our other activities, the band has been busy preparing tonight's program - "Uncommon Valor" - a program of traditional and very contemporary musical selections commemorating the end of WWII and paying tribute to the men and women who have served in our Armed Forces. Thanks to the Booster Club, the band will conclude its evening with a post concert party at the Lincolnway Bowling Alley where we will enjoy an evening of bowling and ice cream.

Our year is far from over after this evening's concert. We have a trip to look forward to, ensembles will be performing at the annual Arts Festival on May 19th and the Jazz Ensemble will present a concert at Sunset Lane Park

May 21 as well as performing for the Box Lunch Revue in downtown York. On May 24th our annual band banquet, where we honor our graduating seniors and present awards will be held at Wisehaven Hall. And one more time we will don our marching uniforms for the traditional West York Memorial Day Parade. The final performance for the band will be June 8 at commencement exercises where we will bid adieu to our senior members.

Any band is only as strong as those who support it and give their time and effort toward its success. There are many people who deserve a "thank you" for helping create, organize and carry out all of our experiences in a year. Without the help and support of the Board of Education, administration, the Instrumental Music Booster Club, parents, friends, alumni and the community, we would not have the opportunity to make and inspire "West York Pride". Thanks to all, for your support in helping to make us the "Mighty" band that we are.

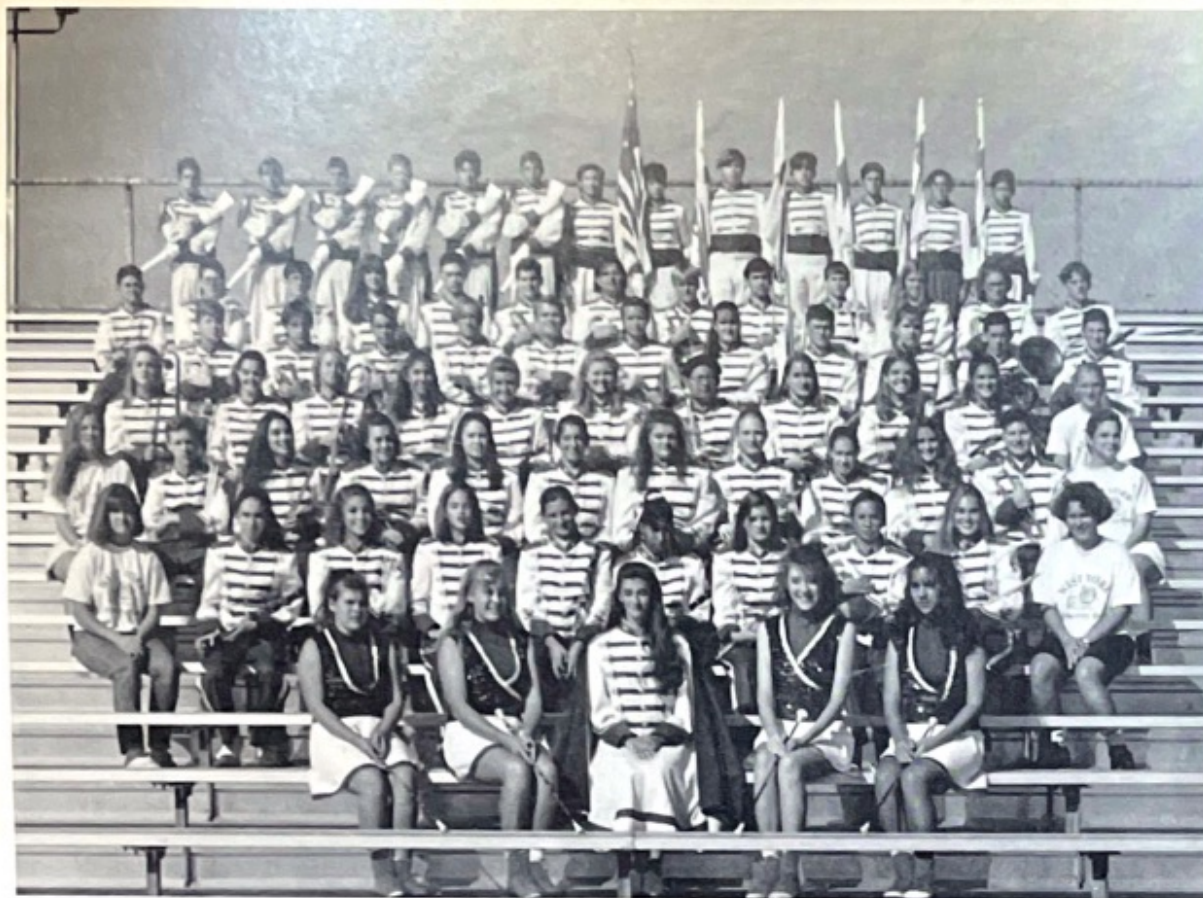
