Outside of school Beth is a member of the York Symphony and was a member of the Pennsylvania Ambassadors of Music for a European tour.

Upon graduation, Beth plans to attend Elizabethtown College where she will pursue dual certification in music education and music therapy.



ABOUT THE BAND

The West York Area High School Band begins each year with two weeks of intensive music and marching rehearsals. The first week for new members is "Rookie week", followed by "Band Camp", which was held this year at Camp Ramblewood, Darlington, Md. During the fall, the band performs at home and away football games and for numerous school and civic occasions. Often featured are the Majorettes, coached by Mrs. Wanda Reider, and the all-male "Bulldog" Color Guard - a consistent winner in competition - coordinated by Mr. Rick Worley.

The Symphonic Band is offered as an elective curricular subject, meeting five periods per week for full credit. Of these periods, several are used for sectional rehearsal with student leaders in charge. In addition, many students participate in solo work and small ensembles, meeting after school and evenings. A series of student recitals is held to give these students an opportunity to perform and listen to each other.

In addition to concerts presented in the York area, the band also travels frequently and has performed throughout Pennsylvania and many other states and Canada. Ensembles have performed at clinics and/or concerts at many Pennsylvania colleges, the PMEA State Convention, on television, the State Capitol in Harrisburg, and for numerous civic and church organizations in the area. Highlighting the band's past activities are performances in Mexico City (1972), Disneyworld (1974 & 1979), Nashville, Tennessee (1983), Toronto, Canada (1981 & 1990), Boston, Massachusetts (1984 & 1988) and Bermuda (1992). The band has also performed at the Mid-East Band Clinic in Pittsburgh, the Eastern Band Conductors Conference and has twice been selected to perform for the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association State Conference (1982 & 1989). This year the band will travel to Toronto, Canada to participate in the "Festival of Music".

OUR DIRECTOR

Thomas Eyster, Director of Instrumental Music at West York Area High School, is a graduate of West York Area High School. After graduation from high school, he attended Susquehanna University, where he received his B.M. degree in Music Education. In college he toured with both the University Symphonic Band and the Jazz and Brass Ensembles in Europe and Mexico. He has done graduate study at Peabody Conservatory of Music, Duquesne University and Loyola College of Maryland. He taught in the Upper Darby School District, Delaware County (Pa.) before coming "home" to West York in 1977.

In addition to his duties at West York, Mr. Eyster has also served as an adjudicator and clinician in Pennsylvania and Maryland. In 1989, he was awarded a "Citation of Excellence" by the National Band Association for outstanding contributions to concert bands and band music.

Mr. Eyster is a member of the P.S.E.A. and N.E.A., the National Band Association, Pennsylvania Music Educators Association, the Music Educators National Conference, and the National School Orchestra Association.

Other societies to his credit include life memberships to Phi Mu Alpha, professional music fraternity Phi Sigma Kappa, national social fraternity, and Phi Beta Mu, a national bandmaster fraternity.

During the summers of 1985 and 1992, Mr. Eyster was a staff member of the Pennsylvania Ambassadors of Music for a European concert tour.

TRI-M MUSIC HONOR SOCIETY

Chapter 821 of the Modern Music Masters, a national music honor society, was formed at West York during the fall of 1965. Modern Music Masters does for music what the National Honor Society does for Scholarship. With the current emphasis that is given to science, mathematics, and foreign language, Modern Music Masters helps to keep a proper balance between the academic and cultural subjects.

Chief aims of the society are to foster greater interest in band, choral and orchestral performance, and to provide wider opportunities for personal musical expression. Students are selected for "Tri-M" membership on the basis of musicianship, scholarship, character, cooperation, leadership, and service to the school, church, and community. Prospective candidates must also perform a solo in concert or recital.

Although primarily an honor society, the West York Chapter has sponsored a series of student recitals and several field trips to hear concerts.

This years performance included treats such as the ever popular "Carnival Del Soul," vocalist Mickey Altland, and the dancing trumpets. It was an evening of great music, good food, awesome drum solos, and fun for all.

In March, many of our band members were also involved in the all school musical. After the success of Lil' Abner, the directors chose the music, acting, and dancing of

OKLAHOMA! to captivate our imaginations. Through participation in either the cast, dancers, stage crew, or pit many were involved. Again, the musical was a great success and everyone had a blast preparing and performing it.

Tonight we bring you our Springtime Celebration. After a long winter, we all look forward to the spring which is new and beautiful. May you find our selections as enjoyable to listen to as they were for us to prepare.

At the conclusion of the evenings concert, this music will neither be forgotten or stored away. From May 9-13 our band will be enjoying trip to Toronto, Canada. There we will be playing for adjudications, at a Children's Hospital, and the jazz band will be performing. Activities also in-

clude seeing Phantom of the Opera, going to an amusement park, touring the Skydome, and more. We all anticipate and expect a fantastic trip.

BAND STUDENT GOVERNMENT

ENSEMBLES

During their after-school and evening rehearsals, stress is placed on balance, intonation, ensemble timbre, and sight-reading of literature from the various musical eras. Student leaders often conduct rehearsals themselves, thus gaining experience in rehearsal technique.

In addition to appearances within the school, the ensembles have performed concert/clinics for colleges, in solo/ensemble adjudication contests, on Cable 4 TV, at banquets, and for numerous church and service organizations throughout the York area. They have also appeared in a series of student recitals sponsored by the West York Chapter of Modern Music Masters, a national music honor society.

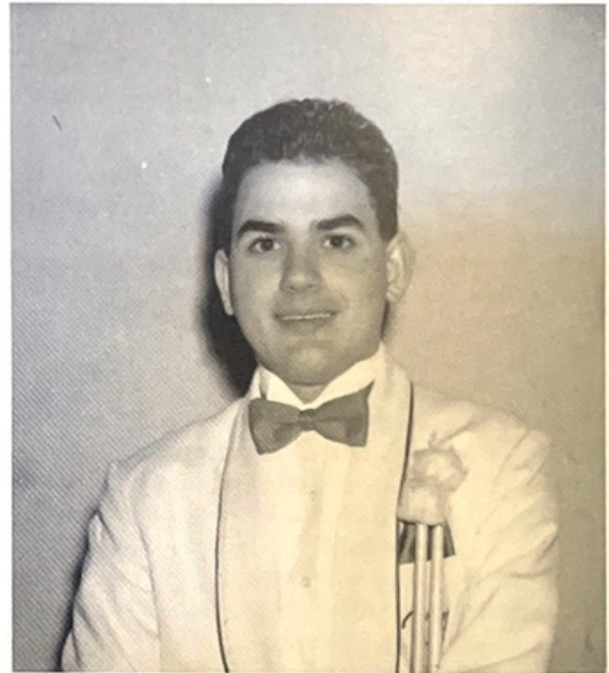

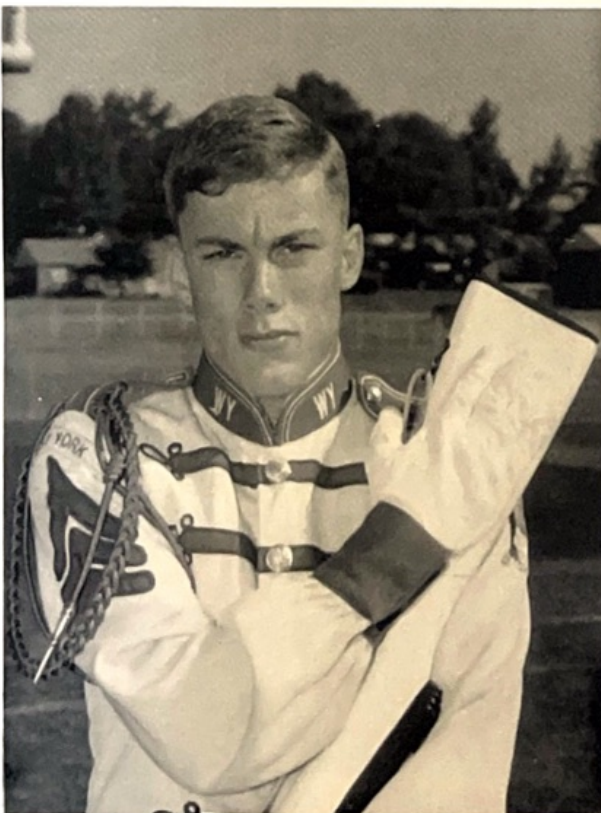

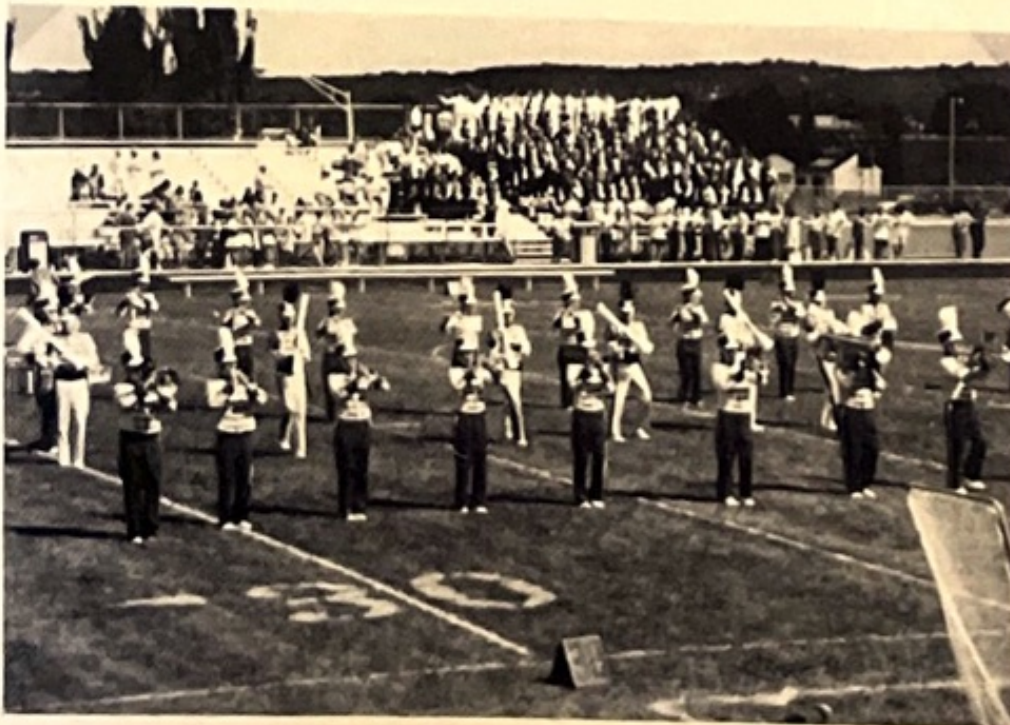
ALBERT KELLY MEMORIAL SUMMER CAMP SCHOLARSHIP

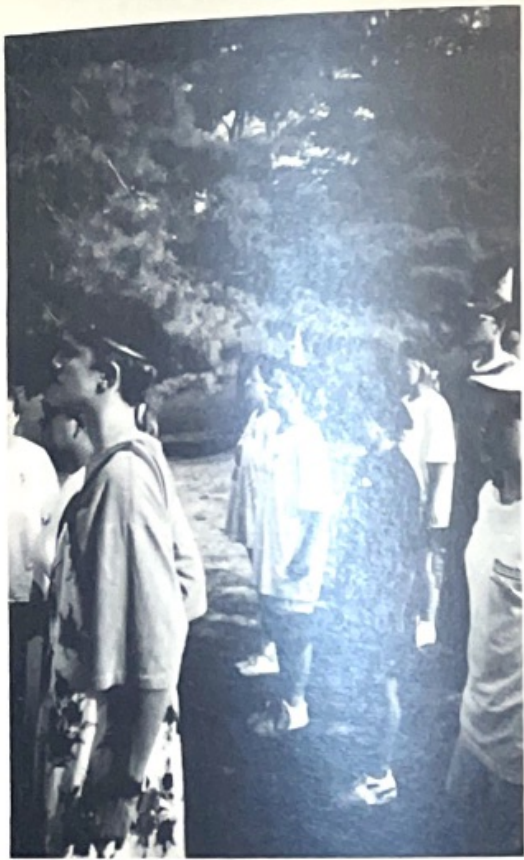
