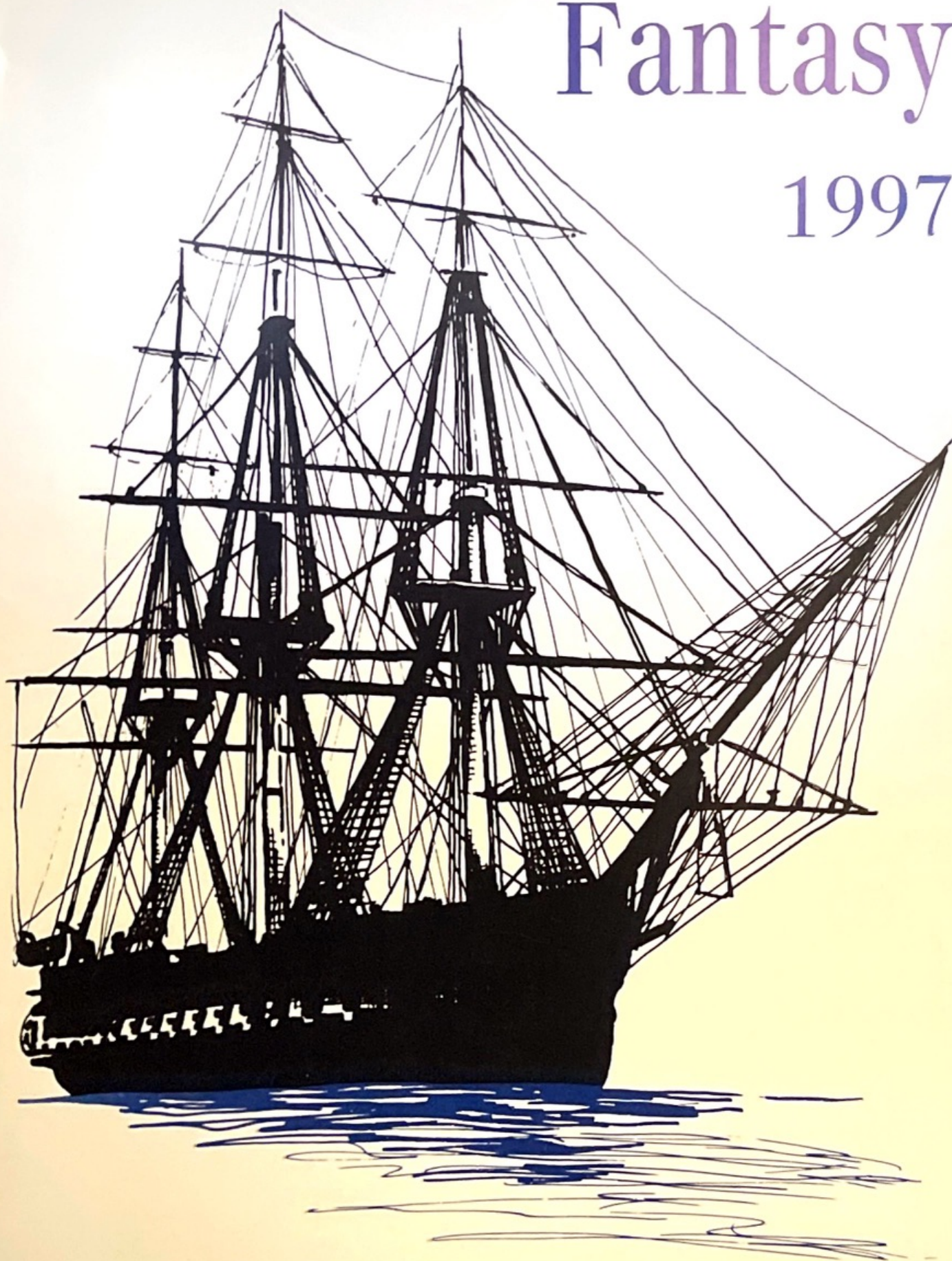

ABOUT THE BAND

The West York Area High School Band begins each year with two weeks of intensive music and marching rehearsals. The first week for new members is "Rookie week," followed by "Band Camp," which was held this year at Camp Ramblewood, Darlington, Maryland. During the fall, the band performs at home and away football games and for numerous school and civic occasions. Often featured are the Majorettes, coached by Mrs. Wanda Reider, and the all-male "Bulldog" Color Guard - a consistent winner in competition - coordinated by Mr. Robert Runk and Mr. Jim Wherley.

The Symphonic Band is offered as an elective curricular subject, meeting five periods per week for full credit. Of these periods, several are used for sectional rehearsal with student leaders in charge. In addition, many students participate in solo work and small ensembles, meeting after school and evenings. A series of student recitals is held to give these students an opportunity to perform and listen to each other.

In addition to concerts presented in the York area, the band also travels frequently and has performed throughout Pennsylvania and many other states and Canada. Ensembles have performed at clinics and/or concerts at many Pennsylvania colleges, the PMEA State Convention, on television, the State Capitol in Harrisburg, and for numerous civic and church organizations in the area. Highlighting the band's past activities are performances in Mexico City (1972), Disneyworld (1974 & 1979), Nashville, Tennessee (1983), Toronto, Canada (1981, 1990 & 1996), Boston, Massachusetts (1984 & 1988) and Bermuda (1992). The band has also performed at the Mid-East Band Clinic in Pittsburgh, the Eastern Band Conductors Conference and has twice been selected to perform for the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association State Conference (1982 & 1989). Last year the band traveled to Toronto, Canada and participated in the Toronto "Festivals of Music" where they were awarded the "William D. Revelli Outstanding Concert Band" award for the most outstanding band at the festival.

OUR DIRECTOR

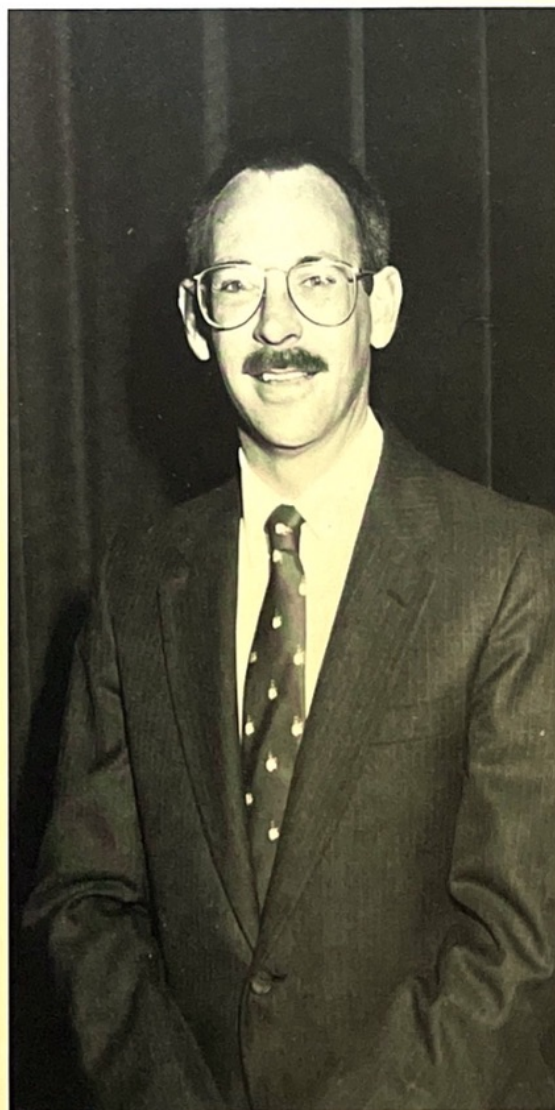
Thomas Eyster, Director of Instrumental Music at West York Area High School, is a graduate of West York Area High School. After graduation from high school, he attended Susquehanna University, where he received his B.M. degree in Music Education. In college he toured with both the University Symphonic Band and the Jazz and Brass Ensembles in Europe and Mexico. He has done graduate study at Peabody Conservatory of Music, Duquesne University and Loyola College of Maryland. He taught in the Upper Darby School District, Delaware County (PA) before coming "home" to West York in 1977.

In addition to his duties at West York, Mr. Eyster has also served as an adjudicator and clinician in Pennsylvania and Maryland. In 1989, he was awarded a "Citation of Excellence" by the National Band Association for outstanding contributions to concert bands and band music.

Mr. Eyster is a member of the P.S.E.A. and N.E.A., the National Band Association, Pennsylvania Music Educators Association, and the Music Educators National Conference.

Other societies to his credit include life memberships to Phi Mu Alpha, professional music fraternity Phi Sigma Kappa, national social fraternity, and Phi Beta Mu, a national bandmaster fraternity.

During the summers of 1985, 1992 and 1997, Mr. Eyster was a staff member of the Pennsylvania Ambassadors of Music for a European concert tour.

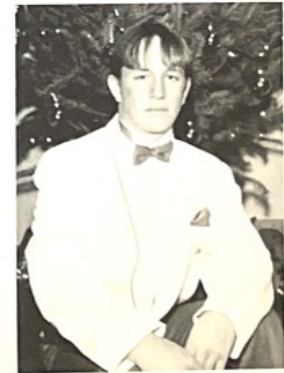

TRI-M MUSIC HONOR SOCIETY

Chapter 821 of the Modern Music Masters, a national music honor society, was formed at West York during the fall of 1965.

Modern Music Masters does for music what the National Honor Society does for Scholarship. With the current emphasis that is placed on science, mathematics, and foreign language, Modern Music Masters helps to keep a proper balance between the academic and cultural subjects.

Chief aims of the society are to foster greater interest in band, choral and orchestral performance, and to provide wider opportunities for personal musical expression. Students are selected for "Tri-M" membership on the basis of musicianship, scholarship, character, cooperation, leadership, and service to the school, church, and community. Prospective candidates must also perform a solo in concert or recital.

Although primarily an honor society, the West York Chapter sponsors a series of student recitals each year.

"OUR YEAR IN REVIEW"

It was a very special experience when we departed West York for band camp at luxurious Camp Ramblewood in Darlington, Maryland. There was the anticipation of another great show for all of the initiated members, and an overwhelming feeling of doom for those rookies who had heard the horror stories of upperclassmen.

As the week progressed, there were a few concepts that we all grew to accept. First of all, as we would be practicing our drill work (marching) and Mr. Eyster would say, "Just one last time", it was common knowledge that we'd be practicing that certain move another seven or eight times easily. Until band camp, one never knows how many "last times" there really are. Another concept that we grew to accept was the fact that by Thursday evening, we all knew that our field show was finally taking shape. We knew that we were functioning as a team. After all of the hard work and energy put into the practices, we were given a night to replenish our spirits with a night of unending humor: Harmony Hall. This year, an astonishingly humorous yet unique comedic talent won the coveted first place award: the "Camp Ramblewood Modeling Extravaganza".

With the unusually early start of our school year this year we were given the chance to prove ourselves to our arch-rival high school, Dover, on August 31. As we assembled and marched our way onto the field, we astonished and perhaps slightly disenchanted the crowd with our lack of uniforms. Their initial reactions were put to rest when the shrill shriek of the whistle pierced through the stadium and the marching unit uniformly snapped to attention. We dazzled the crowd with our music and the talent of our colorguard. Our repertoire, inspired by one of the most recognizable heroes of all time, featured a James Bond theme, including songs such as "James Bond Opener", "Theme from Shaft", "Secret Agent Man", "Mission: Impossible", and ending with "James Bond Closer: For Your Eyes Only". Midway through the season we were ecstatic with the distribution of the new uniforms.

Finally, after four years' service with the marching band, the Seniors received their due acknowledgments on Parent's Day, Saturday, October 26. After the marching band marched off the field, the seniors remained alone on the field and gave a farewell salute to not just the fans, but to a large part of their lives: the West York Area Sr. High School Mighty Bulldog Marching Band.

Of course, our participation was not restricted solely to football games; our unit marched in the York Halloween Parade, and the guard and P.A.D. marched in such events as the Hanover Halloween Parade, and the annual Alsatia Parade in Hagerstown, Maryland.

As the beginning of school signifies the beginning of the football season, it also begins our concert band season. We started early preparing for our multiple concerts throughout the year.

Sunday, December 22, our Christmas concert, was our first chance to play for the public, along with our school's choir. A large number of musicians in our band were involved with the choir program, attending band three days during their school week and attending choir for the other two days.

There is no rest for a concert band, for the next school day we began rehearsing for our next concert, the Pops Concert. This was one of the favorite concerts because it featured performances by not only our band, but as well our Jr. High band and our elementary band. There's a feeling of nostalgia involved when we remember our elementary band years, and compare ourselves to the people we were just a few years ago.

During the winter season, one band member earned the opportunity to perform in district band. Dan Brenner, the battery percussion section leader, was selected from a number of talented competitors. This is one of the highest honors placed on high school musicians.

To fill up what remaining time we had, many members of the band were involved in some way with the musical. This year, after months of rehearsing lines and music, our school successfully produced "Guys and Dolls" much to the enjoyment of all, especially to the cast and pit orchestra.

In its fourth consecutive year, the West York Jazz Ensemble packed the cafeteria in its "Evening With the West York Jazz Ensemble" concert. Here, with much help from parents and students, our Jazz Ensemble took the drab high school cafeteria and transformed it into the dark candlelit nightclub atmosphere for which we are becoming semi-famous.

There were many other small ensembles, such as the German band, which performed at after-school performances which allowed anyone the opportunity to hear students in a recital format. This was a very good way to allow musicians to perform in front of their peers.

This evening we present to you a symbol of much practice; this is the result of mistakes, trials, and errors. We present to you our Spring concert. This is our "Nautical Fantasy".

If you wish to hear more of our groups, our Jazz Ensemble will be performing at the Spring Grove Jazz festival, and will be performing for the Junior Miss Pageant. Our Marching Band can be found next, marching in the Pennsylvania State Lion's Club Convention Parade on May 10, and can as well be seen marching through West York at the Memorial Day Parade. Our Concert band will have its last performance of the year during the Commencement ceremony at West York on June.

There are a few people who deserve recognition for what they have done for our band. Mr. Eyster for leadership, the Instrumental Booster Club for helping us fund whatever we had needed funded whenever we had need of such funds, and our parents for spending countless dollars on instruments and lessons, and for spending countless hours listening to our practicing and always having a good comment to say regardless. It is special people like yourselves that keep these programs running. Thank you.

ENSEMBLES

Ensembles, an important part of the instrumental music program at West York, acquaint some of the more advanced band students to the techniques and literature of small-group performance. During their after-school and evening rehearsals, stress is placed on balance, intonation, ensemble timbre, and sight-reading of literature from the various musical eras. Student leaders often conduct rehearsals themselves, thus gaining experience in rehearsal technique.

In addition to appearances within the school, the ensembles have performed concert/clinics for colleges, in solo/ensemble adjudication contests, on Cable 4 TV, at banquets, and for numerous church and service organizations throughout the York area. They have also appeared in a series of student recitals sponsored by the West York Chapter of Modern Music Masters, a national music honor society.

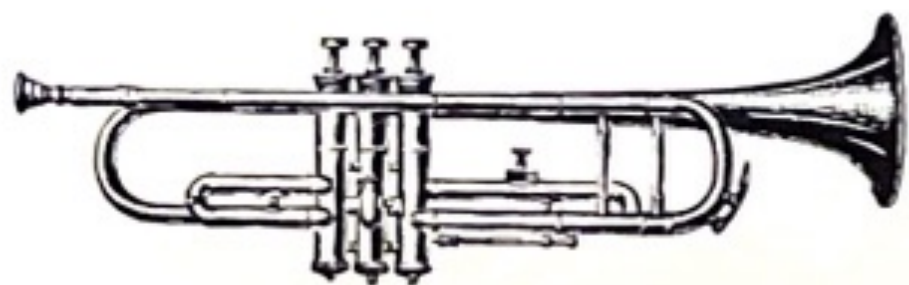
