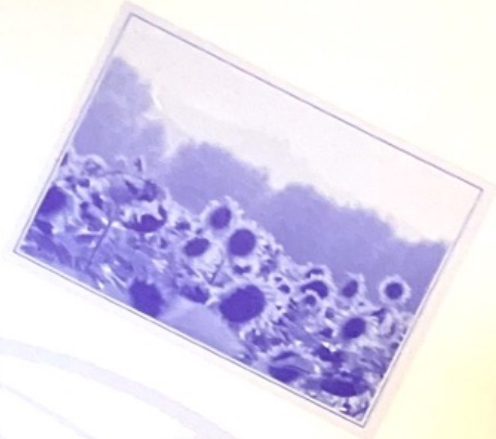

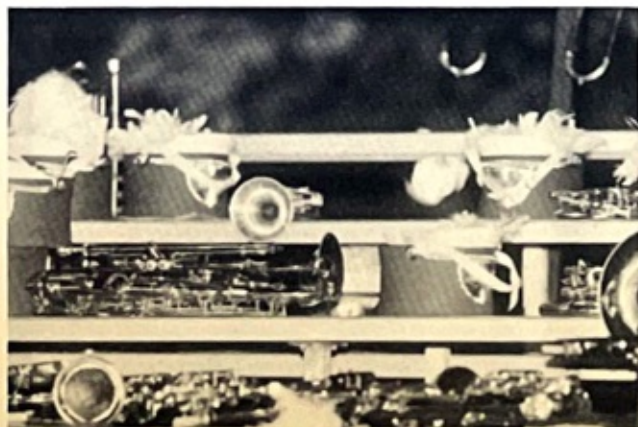

ABOUT THE BAND

The West York Area High School Band begins each year with two weeks of intensive music and marching rehearsals. The first week of new members is "Rookie Week," followed by "Band Camp," which was held last year at Camp Ramblewood, Darlington, Maryland. During the fall, the band performs at home and away football games and for numerous school and civic occasions. Often featured are the Majorettes, directed by Wanda Reider, and the all-male "Bulldog" Color Guard - a consistent winner in competition, coordinated by Mr. Robert Runk and Mr. Jim Wherley.

The Symphonic Band is offered as an elective curricular subject, meeting five periods per week for full credit. Of these periods, several are used for sectional rehearsal with student leaders in charge. In addition, many students participate in solo work and small ensembles, meeting after school and evenings. A series of student recitals is held to give these students an opportunity to perform and listen to each other.

In addition to concerts presented in the York area, the band also travels frequently and has performed throughout Pennsylvania and many other states and Canada. Ensembles have performed at clinics and/or concerts at many Pennsylvania colleges, the PMEA State Convention, on television, the State Capitol in Harrisburg, and for numerous civic and church organizations in the area. Highlighting the band's past activities are performances in Mexico City (1972), Disneyworld (1974 & 1979), Nashville Tennessee (1983), Toronto, Canada (1982, 1990 & 1996), Boston, Massachusetts (1984 & 1988) and Bermuda (1992). The band has also performed at the Mid-East Band Clinic in Pittsburgh, the Eastern Band Conductors Conference and has twice been selected to perform for the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association State Conference (1982 & 1989). In 1998 the band traveled to Toronto, Canada and participated in the Toronto "Festivals of Music" where they were awarded the "William D. Revelli Outstanding Concert Band" award for the most outstanding band in the festival.

OUR DIRECTOR

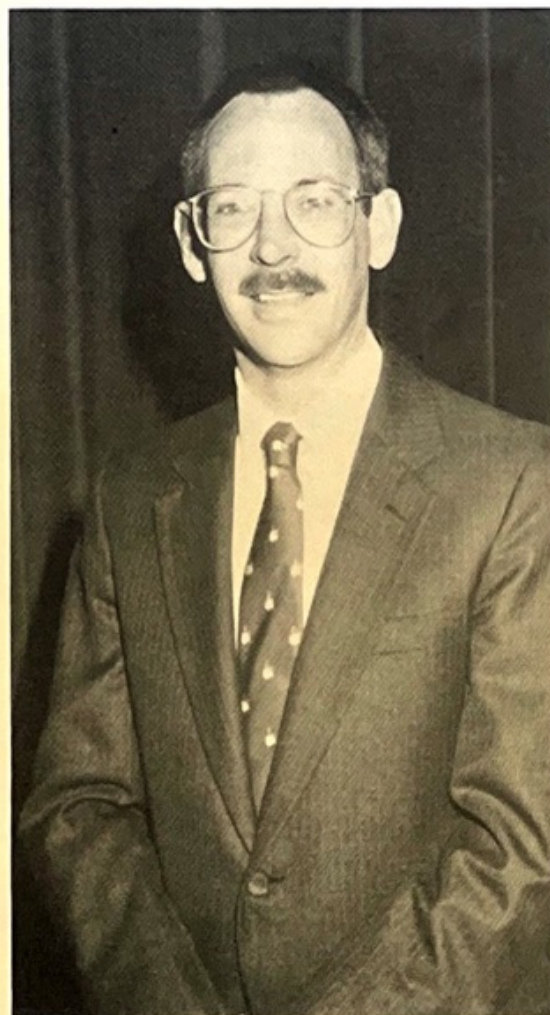
Thomas Eyster, Director of Instrumental Music at West York Area High School, is a graduate of West York Area High School. After graduation from high school, he attended Susquehanna University, where he received his B.M. degree in Music Education. In college he toured with both the University Symphonic Band and the Jazz and Brass Ensembles in Europe and Mexico. He has done graduate study at Peabody Conservatory of Music, Duquesne University and Loyola College of Maryland. He taught in the Upper Darby School District, Delaware County (PA) before coming "home" to West York in 1977.

In addition to his duties at West York, Mr. Eyster has also served as an adjudicator and clinician in Pennsylvania and Maryland. In 1989, he was awarded a "Citation of Excellence" by the National Band Association for outstanding contributions to concert bands and band music.

Mr. Eyster is a member of the P.S.E.A. and N.E.A., the National Band Association, Pennsylvania Music Educators Association, and the Music Educators National Conference.

Other societies to his credit include life memberships to Phi Mu Alpha, professional music fraternity Phi Sigma Kappa, national social fraternity, and Phi Beta Mu, a national bandmaster fraternity.

During the summers of 1985, 1992 and 1997, Mr. Eyster was a staff member of the Pennsylvania Ambassadors of Music for a European concert tour.

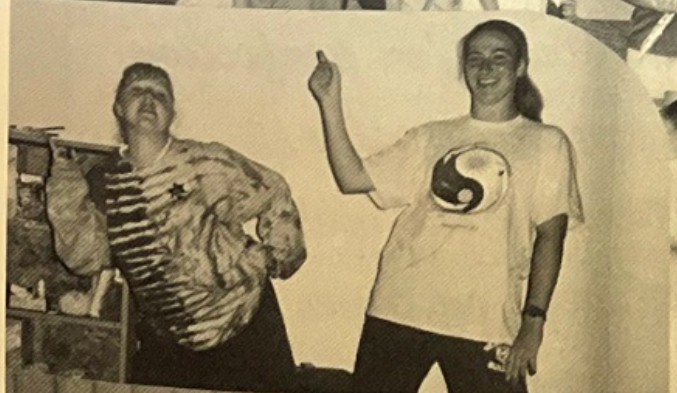

“Our Year in Review”

The afternoon sun beat down harshly on the backs of men loading footlockers on buses and children bidding farewell to their parents. This Sunday, August 17, 1997, established a landmark beginning for some, and the beginning of the end for others.

The beginning of band camp at Darlington, Maryland came with mixed feelings for nearly every member of the band. For some it was joy and excitement; for others it was fear and anxiety. The week consisted of plenty of on-field rehearsal times and afternoon sectionals, followed by evening entertainment of various sorts, including a movie night and show stopping Harmony Hall. By the time Friday had arrived, we fully understood the meaning of phrases such as, “You should be there by now!!!” and “Not again but better!!!” After these six days of intense rehearsals and activities it was impossible for the band not to bond together as a unit.

The opening game of the season was at home against Dover, a change from previous years of being away. West York’s rival was definitely in for a shock - the band stepped out on the field with a fire in their hearts and a sparkle in their eyes. Led under the supervision of drum majors Christina Lehr and Jennifer Brown, the music of Blood, Sweat and Tears filled the air with songs of, “Spinning Wheel”, “Go Down Gamblin”, “And When I Die”, and “You’ve Made Me So Very Happy.” The football team had a very successful season, thanks to the band, the color guard, under the scrutiny of color sergeant Aaron Pendergast, and the majorettes, led by head majorette Yvette Stambaugh.

The band’s community performances enthralled young and old alike. The unit marched in Manchester and York Halloween parades, while the guard and PAD participated in additional events such as the Hanover Halloween parade and its annual appearance in the Hagerstown parade. The “Mighty Bulldog Band” and guard also strutted at the Red Lion Sound Spectacular.

Feelings ran high the weekend of Homecoming when our drum major Christina Lehr was elected Homecoming Queen, evoking a sense of pride both at the bonfire and on the field. Seniors were also given their time in the spotlight as their marching season culminated with Parent’s Day, Saturday, November 1st. Although this marked an end of a marching era for seniors, the friends and memories which they gained will always remain dear to their hearts.

While marching band season came to a close, the concert band and ensemble practice were already under way. District band tryouts came in December, and after toiling for hours on music and scales, three band members were bestowed the honors to perform with the band Seniors Kimberly Geiselman and Matthew Shearer, and Junior Crystal Wolf. A congratulations is due not only for these three participants, but to the many others who auditioned.

The warmth of the season was ushered in on Sunday, December 21st, when the concert

band debuted with the Choir in the annual Christmas concert. Many of the band's members also participated in the school's choir, creating a whirlwind of costume changes and activity behind-the-scenes.

In accordance to the statement, "No rest for the weary", diligent preparations began for our Pop Concert on Sunday, February 8. As the band sat in the auditorium and listened to performances of the elementary and Junior High bands, we were forced to be reminded of what we were like so very long ago.

March began the final countdown until the fourth annual performance of the all-school musical. This year the audience would be treated with the soft Scottish ballads and rousing ensemble songs of Brigadoon. Hard work, put in by the stage crew, pit orchestra and cast all combined for the nearly sold out performances of Friday, March 20, and Saturday, March 21. A special thanks to Mrs. Fauth, Mr. Eyster, Mrs. Siple, Mrs. Barshinger and Mr. Ginder for devoting so much time and effort in making Brigadoon a big success.

Friday, April 3 brought the sounds of hot jazz into a dark night club filled with candles and people. To the uninformed individuals who attended, that really was our cafeteria! Parents spent countless hours in making the final preparations just perfect. The night proved to be huge success, with another sold-out performance.

Now we send to you our very best- "Postcards." This concert is an entourage of music form around the world, ranging from the soft lullaby in Variations on a Korean Folksong, to the toe-stomping sounds of the Dixieland Jamboree. This concert is, in the truest sense of the phrase, a labor of love for all involved.

To hear more of our groups in the near future, our Jazz Ensemble will be performing for the second consecutive year for the Junior Miss Pageant, on Saturday, May 9. Our Marching Band will soon appear in the West York Memorial Day Parade. Finally, our concert band will be having its last performance of the year during the Commencement ceremony at West York in June.

Of course as with any organization, we would not be where we are today without the help of so many people. A heartfelt "Thank-you" goes out to Mr. Eyster for his expertise and leadership, the Instrumental Booster Club for supporting the band in countless ways, and the friends and alumni in the community that show overwhelming support. Lastly, endless gratitude goes to our parents, for without your endless display of love and encouragement none of this would be possible. It is these people combined that created the firm foundation we have built upon and flourished. Thank you.

BAND STUDENT GOVERNMENT

Because of increasing size and complexity of the total band program, a need was felt for more student control and committee work. Thus, in January 1960 a system of student government was adopted.

Each officer and staff member has assigned duties and obligations which he must perform in order for the band to function smoothly. In addition, the Executive Council meets at irregular intervals to discuss band policy, plan school activities and work on student committees.

Some projects developed by the council in the past include: the promotion of band jackets and shirts, the adoption of award pins, certificates and letters and planning of certain phases of the band training camps.

ENSEMBLES

Ensembles, an important part of the instrumental music program at West York, acquaint some of the more advanced band students to the techniques and literature of small-group performance. During their after-school and evening rehearsals, stress is placed on balance, intonation, ensemble timbre and sight-reading of literature from the various musical eras. Student leaders often conduct rehearsals themselves, thus gaining enough experience in rehearsal technique.

In addition to appearances within the school, the ensembles have performed concert/clinics for colleges, in solo/ensemble competition contests, on Cable 4 TV, at banquets, and for numerous church and service organizations throughout the York area. They have also appeared in a series of student recitals sponsored by the West York Chapter of the National Music Masters, a national music honor society.
