





ABOUT THE BAND

The West You Area High School Band begins each year with two weeks of intensive music and marching reheaded. The first week of new members is "Rookie Week," followed by "Band Camp," which was held the least at Camp Ramblewood, Darlington, Maryland. The Symptonic Band is offered as an elective curricular subject, meeting five periods per week for full credit. Of these periods, several are used for sectional rehearsal with student leaders in charge. In addition, many students participate in solo work and small ensembles, meeting after school and evenings. A series if student recitals is held to give these students as opportunity to perform and listen to each other.

In addition to concerts presented in the York area, the band also travels frequently and has performed throughout Pennsylvania and many other states and Canada. Ensembles have performed at clinics and/or concerts at many Pennsylvania colleges, the PMEA State Convention, on television, the State Capitol in Harrisburg, and for numerous civic and church organizations in the area. Highlighting the band's past activities are performances in Mexico City (1972), Disneyworld (1974 & 1979), Nashville Tennessee (1983), Toronto, Canada (1982, 1990 & 1996), Boston, Massachussetts (1984 & 1988) and Bermuda (1992). The band has also performed at the Mid-East Band Clinic in Pittsburgh, the Eastern Band Conductors Conference and has twice been selected to perform for the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association State Conference (1982 & 1989). In 1998 the band traveled to Toronto, Canada and participated in the Toronto "Festivals of Music" where they were awarded the "William D. Revelli Outstanding Concert Band" award for the most outstanding band in the festival.

OUR DIRECTOR


Thomas Eyster, Director of Instrumental Music at West York Area High School, is a graduate of West York Area High School. After graduation from high school, he attended Susquehanna University, where he received his B.M. degree in Music Education. In college he toured with both the University Symphonic Band and the Jazz and Brass Ensembles in Europe and Mexico. He has done graduate study at Peabody Conservatory of Music, Duquesne University and Loyola College of Maryland. He taught in the Upper Darby School District, Delaware County (PA) before coming "home" to West York in 1977.

In addition to his duties at West York, Mr. Eyster has also served as an adjudicator and clinician in Pennsylvania and Maryland. In 1989, he was awarded a "Citation of Excellence" by the National Band Association for outstanding contributions to concert bands and band music

Mr. Eyster is a member of the P.S.E.A. and N.E.A., the National Band Association, Pennsylvania Music Educators Association, and the Music Educators National Conference

Other societies to his credit include life memberships to Phi Mu Alpha, professional music fraternity Phi Sigma Kappa, national social fraternity, and Phi Beta Mu, a national bandmaster fraternity.

During the summers of 1985, 1992 and 1997, Mr. Eyster was a staff member of the Pennsylvania Ambassadors of Music for a European concert tour.






ALBERT KELLY MEMORIAL SUMMER CAMP SCHOLARSHIP


