
ABOUT THE BAND

The West York Area High School Band begins each year with two weeks of intensive music and marching rehearsals. The first week of new members is "Rookie Week", followed by "Band Camp" which was held this year at Camp Ramblewood in Darlington, Maryland.

During the fall, the band performs at home and away football games and for numerous school and civic occasions. Often featured are the majorettes, coached by Wanda Reider, and the all-male Bulldog Colorguard - a consistent winner in competition - coordinated by Mr. Chad Haas and the "A-Line" coached by Mrs. Gwen Shaffer.

The Symphonic Band is offered as an elective curricular subject meeting three periods per week for full credit. Of these periods, several are used for sectional rehearsal with student leaders in charge. In addition, many students participate in solo work and small ensembles meeting after school and evenings.

In addition to concerts presented in the York area, the band also travels occasionally and has performed throughout Pennsylvania and many other states and Canada. Ensembles have performed at clinics and/or concerts at many Pennsylvania colleges, the PMEA State Convention, on television, the State Capitol in Harrisburg, and for numerous civic and church organizations in the area. Highlighting the band's past activities are performances in Mexico City (1972), Disney World (1974 & 1979), Nashville, Tennessee (1983), Toronto, Canada (1982, 1990 & 1996), Boston, Massachusetts (1984 & 1988) and Bermuda (1992). The band has also performed at the Mid-East Band Clinic in Pittsburgh, the Eastern Band Conductors Conference and has twice been selected to perform for the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association State Conference (1982 & 1989). In 1998, the band traveled to Toronto, Canada and participated in the Toronto "Festivals of Music" where they were awarded the "William D. Revelli Outstanding Concert Band" award for the most outstanding band in the festival.



OUR DIRECTOR

Thomas Eyster is in his 23rd year as director of instrumental music at West York Area High School. He is also the Instructional Leader for the Music and Art Departments for in Delaware County, Pennsylvania.

A graduate of West York Area High School, Mr. received his B.M. Degree in Music Education Susquehanna University and has done additional ass. music education and conducting at Peabody Conservant Music and Duquense University and Loyola College Maryland.

In addition to his duties at West York, Mr. Eyster has served as an adjudicator, clinician, and guest conductor in Pennsylvania and Maryland. He also serves as associate music director for the Pennsylvania Ambassadors of Music concert band for their bi-annual European concert tours and was an assistant director of the York All-County Band formed for the city of York 250th anniversary. In 1989, he was awarded a "Citation of Excellence" by the National Band Association for outstanding contributions to concert bands and band music. Mr. Eyster is also listed in the 1998 edition of "Who's Who Among America's Teachers".



Pugh holds a Doctorate of Musical Arts from Michigan State University in euphonium performance, with added concentrations in trombone performance and wind conducting. Additionally, his Masters of Music in trombone performance is from Bowling Green State University; his Bachelor of Music degree is in music education from Ithaca College. 




