
ABOUT THE BAND

The West York Area High School Band begins each year with a week of intensive music and marching rehearsals during their annual "Band Camp" which was held this August at Camp Ramblewood in Darlington, Maryland.

During the fall, the band performs at home and away football games and for numerous school and civic occasions. Often featured is the band front coached by Mrs. Gwen Shaffer and Ms. Katie Sweeney.

The Symphonic Band is offered as an elective curricular subject meeting three periods per week for full academic credit, and performs 3 major concerts each year. In addition, many students participate in solo work and small ensembles meeting after school and evenings. The most active and popular ensemble is the Jazz Ensemble which performs approximately 10 times throughout the school year.

In addition to concerts presented in the York area, the band also travels occasionally and has performed throughout Pennsylvania and many other states and Canada. Ensembles have performed at clinics and/or concerts at many Pennsylvania colleges, the PMEA State Convention, on television, the State Capitol in Harrisburg, and for numerous civic and church organizations in the area. Highlighting the band's past activities are performances in Mexico City (1972), Disney World (1974 & 1979), Nashville, Tennessee (1983), Toronto, Canada (1982, 1990 & 1996), Boston, Massachusetts (1984 & 1988), and Bermuda (1992). The band has also performed at the Mid-East Band Clinic in Pittsburgh, the Eastern Band Conductors Conference and has twice been selected to perform for the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association State Conference (1982 & 1989). In 1998, the band traveled to Toronto, Canada and participated in the Toronto "Festivals of Music" where they were awarded the "William D. Revelli Outstanding Concert Band" award for the most outstanding band in the festival. In 2000, the band traveled to the Cedar Point Music Festival in Ohio where they earned a superior rating. In 2003, the band toured Orlando, Sarasota, Naples, and Miami, Florida. The band took a concert tour to Virginia Beach in the spring of 2007.

Rod Meckley is in his third year as director of instrumental music at West York Area High School. He is in his 23rd year as a music educator, having spent 20 years in the York City School District. Mr. Meckley has many years of experience in directing marching band, symphonic band, jazz band, and orchestra. He is a member of the adjunct faculty of York College where he teaches applied percussion. Mr. Meckley has also taught private percussion lessons.



Born and raised in York County, Mr. Meckley is a graduate of William Penn Senior High School. He received his Bachelor of Science Degree in Music Education from West Chester University, and his Masters of Science Degree in Music Education from Towson University.

Mr. Meckley has been a guest speaker on urban music education at Millersville University. He has a long history with the Drum and Bugle Corps activity. Mr. Meckley marched for four years with the award winning Garfield Cadets Drum and Bugle Corps. Following his participation as a member, he then went on to become a percussion instructor for Dutch Boy Drum and Bugle Corps in Kitchener Ontario, and has served as a percussion judge for Drum Corps International competitions.

Mr. Meckley is a member of the Pennsylvania Music Educator's Association, the National Association For Music Education and the Jazz Education Network. He enjoys sharing his knowledge and his love of music with all of his students, and is still active in performing as a percussionist and trombonist.


















ALBERT KELLY MEMORIAL SUMMER CAMP SCHOLARSHIP
