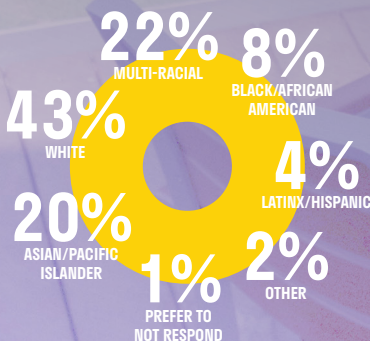

Founded in 1889, Marlborough School is an independent school for girls located in the heart of Los Angeles. We envision a future where equity leads education not just for our students, but for all students. Every day we get closer to our vision by creating the conditions in which learning sparks purpose. Marlborough is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges and the California Association of Independent Schools.

MARLBOROUGH'S SIGNATURE PROGRAMS

HONORS RESEARCH PROGRAM (HUMANITIES, SCIENCE, SOCIAL JUSTICE)

Students pursue independent research in collaboration with a professional in the greater Los Angeles area. Students engage in cutting-edge research while designing and implementing an original research project that culminates with a research paper and campus-wide presentation.

GLOBAL FUTURES INSTITUTE DIPLOMA PROGRAM

This three-year diploma program hones the knowledge, skills, and experience necessary to successfully and confidently engage with the global world of the 21st century. Students who are invited to become GFI Scholars are deeply drawn to the Humanities and Social Sciences and focus their coursework on three key themes: Global Identities, The Future of Democracy, and Environmental Futures.

CAPSTONE PROGRAM (ARTS, SOCIAL JUSTICE, ENTREPRENEURSHIP)

Taken in lieu of a fifth academic course, students choose a field of interest, where they deepen their knowledge of that area through research and hands-on experience. Students identify a specific problem or question within the field, propose a solution, and attempt to implement their solution in the form of a project or practicum.

DEBATE

By learning the art of academic debate, Marlborough's nationally-renowned Debate Team cultivates students' abilities to think critically, argue rigorously, research thoroughly, and communicate clearly and persuasively. In 2022-2023, the Debate Team set all-time records in virtually every statistical category, earning 17 bids to the Tournament of Champions, with our very own Debate Program Head recognized as the National Debate Coaches Association Educator of the Year.

ROBOTICS

The Marlborough Robotics Program empowers students to pursue careers in STEM by engaging them in the FIRST Tech Challenge, where they collaboratively design, fabricate, and program a robot to compete with other teams around the world. Marlborough teams have won numerous awards at the Regional and World Championship levels for their engineering, robot performance, extensive student-led outreach, and collaboration with the local engineering community.
