ROUND 1 - WORKSHOP OFFERINGS

Into The Wild:

Novel study and analysis on Into the Wild by Jon Krakauer. You will engage in reading, writing, analysis, a Socratic seminar, and a written product.

Sherlock Holmes, Deductive reasoning, and the Beginning of Forensics Science:

In the famous style of detective Sherlock Holmes, we will be exploring the use of deductive reasoning and the scientific method as detectives. You will analyze crime scenes and solve the classic whodunit mysteries.

Political Violence in America:

Over the summer, Americans were shocked and horrified to see an assassination attempt on the presidential nominee of a major political party. Many political pundits claim that political violence has not been an issue in the United States, but is that really true? We want to look back in our history and study whether this summer's event was an isolated event or a part of a larger pattern. We will be looking at previous assassination attempts, political strife, and the discourse around these events in the media.

Senior Workshop:

All things senior. Applications, essays, and prep for post-high school life.

Secrets of the Dead - What can we learn from skeletons and other dead bodies?:

Oftentimes, bones are the only remains of an individual that survive the process of decay and provide information pertaining to the age, gender, ancestry, stature, and cause of death of that individual. We will examine how bone ratios/proportions, specific bone structures, and details from autopsy examinations can be used to determine the identity of different human remains.

Global Weddings:

Weddings, in some form or another, have existed for millennia, but the weddings of the past were not always like the grand, ceremonious weddings we are accustomed to today. Some wedding traditions, like the wearing of the bridal veil, have been in existence since ancient Judaic times, while other traditions, such as the lighting of the unity candle or the wearing of a white wedding gown, are fairly new. In many ways, the history and development of the American wedding from simple, homespun ceremonies to elaborate, public rituals are directly related to changes in the American mindset throughout history. We will look at virtually every part of a wedding. We will also do an in-depth study of how weddings vary greatly between cultures and religions.

Business & Life Etiquette:

In the workshop, this training helps new and emerging professionals develop their personal and professional presence to express the confidence they need for any business interaction or social setting. This program addresses communication styles, networking, dining etiquette, meeting etiquette, travel etiquette, email, business cocktail party etiquette, wardrobe etiquette, and more!

Music as a Response to Current Events:

In this workshop, we will examine one thing that almost every teenager enjoys: music! We will examine different historical events through the eyes (and ears) of the music from that period. Many of you are familiar with the protest songs of the Vietnam Era but might not know music's connection to other events. We'll look at revolutions, terrorism, and the people affected by them. You'll get a chance to connect with music that means something to you and be able to put it in a broader context!

Sustainability in Foreign Countries (Iceland and France):

In this 5-week unit, we will study Iceland and France. Why and how are they environmentally sustainable? What practices do they have in place? How are they reducing their country's carbon footprint? What can we, as Americans, do to follow their lead? As a class, we will take a deep dive into the rich culture and geography of each country, and together, learn how to be more green.
