

Transitional Kindergarten

SRVCA's Transitional Kindergarten is dedicated to seeing every child succeed and grow as they learn more through our intentional and engaging program. We seek to provide an environment where children can physically and emotionally develop, form lasting friendships, and excel as the unique people they were created to be. Students will have many opportunities to learn in both small group and whole group settings. Play-based and academic curriculum are features of our program to help our students prepare for kindergarten. Activities are carefully planned that are developmentally appropriate and encourage exploration, fine-motor improvement, an interest in science, mathematics, and early literacy.

There is so much to discover and learn in TK! Establishing routines is an important element and these practices provide a rhythm of safety and security that allow children the opportunity to develop self-regulation. Our TK program is offered from 8:30 – 1:40pm, Monday through Friday with a lead teacher and aide teaching a maximum class size of 20 students. From 1:40-3:00 pm we offer an optional, but included, enrichment program designed around play.

Curriculum Outlines

Bible - TK students walk through the Bible in a way that helps them learn about God's creativity, power, and great plans for us. Kids learn more about the character of God as they interact with dynamic Bible stories in ways that are age appropriate and fun. Most importantly, children are assured of God's infinite love for all of us.

Reading/Phonics/Language Arts ([Superkids Reading](#)) ([Learning Without Tears](#)) ([Heggerty](#))

We take a phonics-based approach to reading with emphasis placed on one letter each week. Through songs, guided practice, thematic literature/poetry units, and projects, students will be able to identify, sound out, and properly form their letters. Writing activities with correct pencil grip begins a foundation of proper writing habits. By the end of the year students begin to sound out words and know a number of sight words.

Math

Transitional Kindergarten allows students the opportunity to engage in concepts such as number recognition, counting, and patterns in a hands-on manner. Activities allow for free exploration, concept mastery, and connection to use of everyday math.

Science - Inspire Science (McGraw Hill)

Students will explore and discover more about their world through indoor and outdoor activities focused on growing an inquisitive mind. Whether it's building, designing, or experimenting, your child will be left with a sense of wonder about the incredible world God designed.

Social Studies

A community focused approach allows TK students to feel a sense of belonging in school. Students will have visits from important guest speakers who help our local community. History is learned through the planning and celebration of holidays. God designed us for relationships so Social Studies lessons focus on friendship, empathy, manners, cooperative play and self-control. Students will learn many ways to connect with and serve others.
