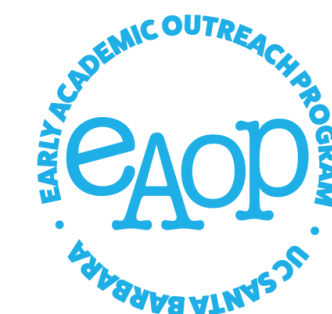




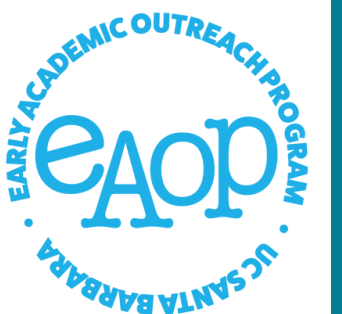

Mission

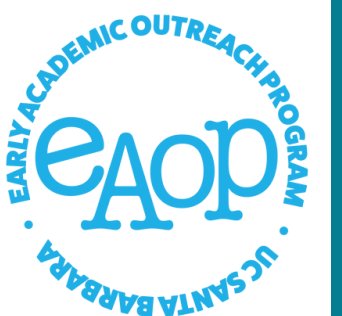

Parents Role

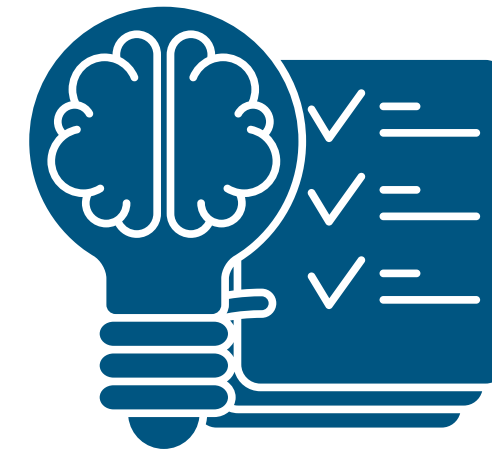
Direct:

Involves your attitude toward learning



Indirect:

Involves understanding the education system and how to navigate



Direct Role

Know your student's goals and learn how to support them.



TIME - Work with your student to fit activities and academic time into the family schedule



PLACE - Provide a study area.

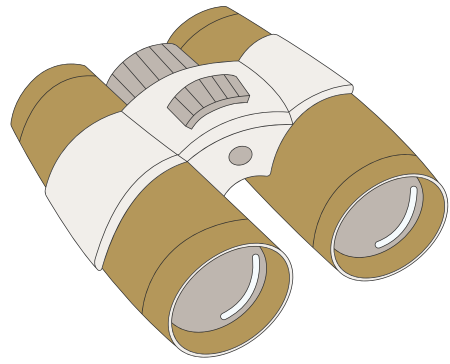

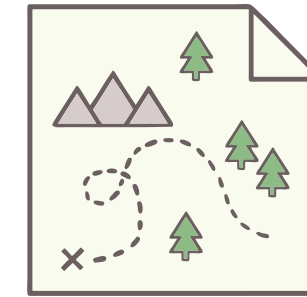
Learn with your student(s)!

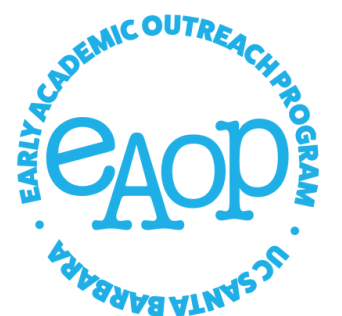

Understanding the Educational System



What are the expectations for your student?

- Stay informed about graduation requirements, college application deadlines, and available career pathways
- Collaborate with school counselors and teachers to ensure your student is on track to meet their academic goals
- Advocate for your student's learning needs, especially if they are struggling with subjects or need additional support

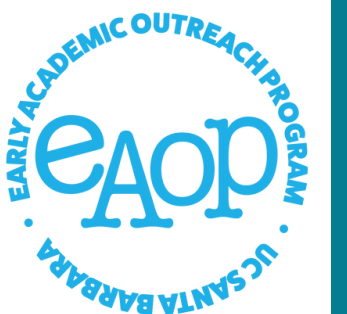

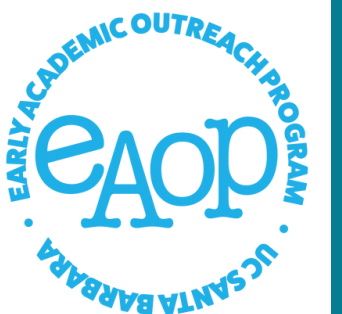
