College Application Process

- 1. What is your post grad plan? Research your career interests to determine what the best education path is for you. Do you need a Certificate, Associates Degree, Bachelor's degree, or higher? Use the Occupational Outlook Handbook and My Colorado Journey to learn more. Schedule a Senior Planning Meeting with your counselor to talk about where you're at in the process. We can answer questions and help you out along the way!
- 2. **Research schools you're interested in.** Pay attention to each schools individual admissions requirements. Some things to consider: *Are there certain course requirements?* (For example Foreign Language or Visual Arts) What GPA is needed? Are standardized test scores required?
- 3. **Think about your budget!** Are you wanting to go out of state? Are the schools you're interested in part of the <u>Western Undergraduate Exchange Program</u>? Prepare your <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid</u>. Sign up for the <u>College Opportunity Fund</u>.
- 4. **Make a list of schools you'd like to apply to.** Be sure to include schools you are confident you can get into along with your dream or reach schools. Make sure to include some in state schools as well.
- 5. **Organize!** Make a list of application deadlines and requirements. Are you able to use the Common App for all of your applications? Will you need to submit an application directly to the institution?
- 6. **Learn to navigate Naviance.** Check your Senior Seminar classroom resources for detailed instructions.
- 7. Add colleges you're applying to onto your Naviance account. Make sure you match your Common App account.
- 8. **Do you need recommendation letters?** If you do, talk to your teachers in person and then request the letters in Naviance once they agree. Teachers may request you complete a Student Personal Profile. You can find this in your Senior Seminar Google Classroom as well.
- 9. **Finalize your application essays.** Talk to your teachers, families and counselor for support and revisions.
- 10. Prepare and submit your application, application fees and any other requirements on or before the due date. Late submissions will not be accepted. Don't forget to request your transcript through Naviance.
- 11. **Research Scholarships!** Use tools such as Naviance and <u>College Board</u> to see what scholarships are a good match. There are additional resources available on the <u>Columbine Counseling</u> Website.

Special considerations:

- Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Opens 10/1. Fill this out with a parent or guardian as soon as you can.
- <u>Colorado Free Application Days</u> allow you to submit your Colorado State School applications for free with a special waiver code. Free Application Days are October 17th through 19th, 2023
