Academic interventions are part of our integrated learning model so that minimal scaffolding from the outside is needed—no "pull outs" or "school after school." For dyslexic students, our Sterne READS intervention program integrates support within English Language Arts classes. This inclusive design provides individualized support while keeping students connected to their classmates, teachers, and grade-level curriculum. Social-Emotional Learning is a vital component to middle school, and we provide a thematic, experiential SEL framework that teaches vital skills and promotes self-awareness, further enhanced by peer mentorship programs, counselor-led groups, and community-building activities.
