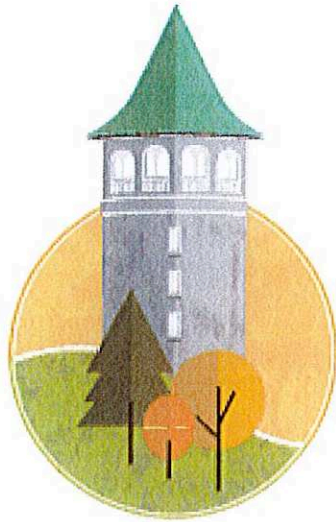

Pratt's Vision

Pratt's Mission

The Pratt community will foster inquiry, curiosity, and high expectations so that every student can become their best selves in our rapidly changing world.

Purpose:

The purpose of the Pratt School-wide Engagement Team is to promote a respectful, safe, and united environment; reinforced through clear and consistent expectations. This will foster a positive community where all members believe in themselves and others, thereby increasing academic engagement, achievement, and social-emotional growth.

Our Commitment:

This plan emphasizes keeping students engaged in the classroom environment, establishing high expectations for all students, and building relationships between the students, the staff, and families. MPS data shows that academic achievement is greatly impacted by how much time students spend in the classroom. Increasing the amount of time students spend actively engaged in learning and decreasing the amount of time students spend out of the classroom due to engagement will positively impact our student's academic success.

Our guiding principles of this plan are:

1. Establish regular, predictable, positive learning and teaching environments.
2. Teach and model behavior expectations.
3. The social-emotional curriculum is as important as the academic curriculum.
4. How children learn is as important as what they learn. Process and content go together.
5. Children need to build relationships and learn and practice specific social skills in order to be successful academically and socially.
6. Knowing our children individually, culturally, and developmentally is as important as knowing the content we teach.
7. How we, the adults, work together is as important as our individual competence: Lasting change begins with the adult community.

School-wide Attention Signal: Silent, raised open hand = Body still, hands free, mouth quiet, ears listening, eyes watching.

School-wide Non-verbal greeting/support or encouragement: students come up with.
Building Communication: poster creation, publication of plan in family handbook, newsletters, website.

Classroom Management Plans: all classrooms will complete classroom management plans that provide specific information about each classroom's plan for teaching expectations and dealing with student behaviors.

Engagement Team: team members will use behavior referral data to discuss appropriate interventions and supports for students. Student Success Team consists of Principal, Behavior Resource Teacher, SSW, Counselor, Academic Specialist, Students Support Specialists (AE's), Psychologist.

Positive Home Communication: telephone calls, emails, and/or home visits to all families for positive and information gathering contact.
